FLORIDA BAPTIST ASSOCIATION.

FIRST DAY,

THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 29th, 1881.

The Florida Baptist Association, held its thirty-ninth annual session, with the Baptist Church of Christ, at Perry, Taylor county, Florida, commencing on Thursday before the first Lord's day in October, 1881.

By invitation the introductory sermon was preached by Elder A. M. Manning, from Hebrews, third chapter and tenth verse. After which an intermission of one hour was given.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

The Association met, and was called to order by Elder H. M. Friar, former Moderator, and Brother H. B. Gibson, acting clerk *pro tem*.

Letters from the various churches were called for, read and names of delegates enrolled.

Permanently organized by electing by acclamation Elder James H. Wentworth, Moderator, and Bro. H. B. Gibson, Clerk.

An invitation was extended to visiting brethren, but none presented themselves.

An invitation was extended to correspondents, but none presented themselves.

The following ministers and brethren volunteered as delegates to the Florida Baptist State Convention, to convene with the Baptist Church of Christ, at Ocala, Florida, commencing on Thursday before the second Lord's day in December, 1881. Elders S. S. Proctor, A. M. Manning, James H. Wentworth, Bros. Albert Reams, D. M. Walker, and Elders C. C. Green, J. C. Porter, F. M. Wells, H. M. Friar and Bro. W. W. Campbell, were appointed as delegates by the Moderator.

On motion, the delegates to the Florida Baptist State Convention were allowed to choose their alternates.

On motion, the Association adjourned until to-morrow morning 9½ A. M.

SECOND DAY—MORNING SESSION.

FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 30, 9.30 A. M.

Met pursuant to adjournment. Opened by reading the 116th Psalm by the Moderator, and prayer by Elder H. M. Friar.

The minutes of the previous day were read by the clerk and approved by the body.

On the renewal of the call, letters from the churches were read and names of delegates enrolled.

The invitation was again extended to visiting brethren.

Petitionary letters were then called for, when the following church, Bethel, presented herself by delegation and letter, and was received, the right hand of fellowship extended by the Moderator, and the names of the delegates enrolled.

On motion, Bro. D. G. Connell, of Philadelphia church, Jefferson county, Florida, was received as a delegate.

The invitation was renewed to correspondents.

On motion, the regular order of business was suspended for a few minutes.

Elders A. C. McCants, A. M. Manning and other brethren addressed the body in behalf of the State Board Mission, after which a collection was taken up which resulted as follows: \$9.25 for State Board Mission.

On resuming the regular order of business, unfinished business was called.

Call for reports of committees.

The Committee on Preaching reported Elder A. H. Barnes to preach at 11 o'clock a. m. Elder S. S. Proctor to preach at 7 o'clock p. m.

The report of Committee on Deceased Ministers and Deacons, was read and adopted.

REPORT ON DECEASED MINISTERS AND DEACONS.

Your committee would report the death of Elders H. Z. Ardis and G. W. Bostwick, both of whom were well stricken in years, well tried, useful and faithful ministers of the gospel; and we recommend as an evidence of the great love which we bear them, that a blank leaf in our minutes be inscribed to the memory of each. We also report the death of William R. Perry, deacon of Shady Grove church. He was a good man, a consistent Christian, an efficient officer, he died in the full assurance of a blissful immortality. May each of us truly say, let me die the death of the righteous, and let my last end be like his. For an apostle could say, it is better to be absent from the body that we may be present with the Lord, when in His presence is fullness of joy, at His right hand pleasures forevermore.

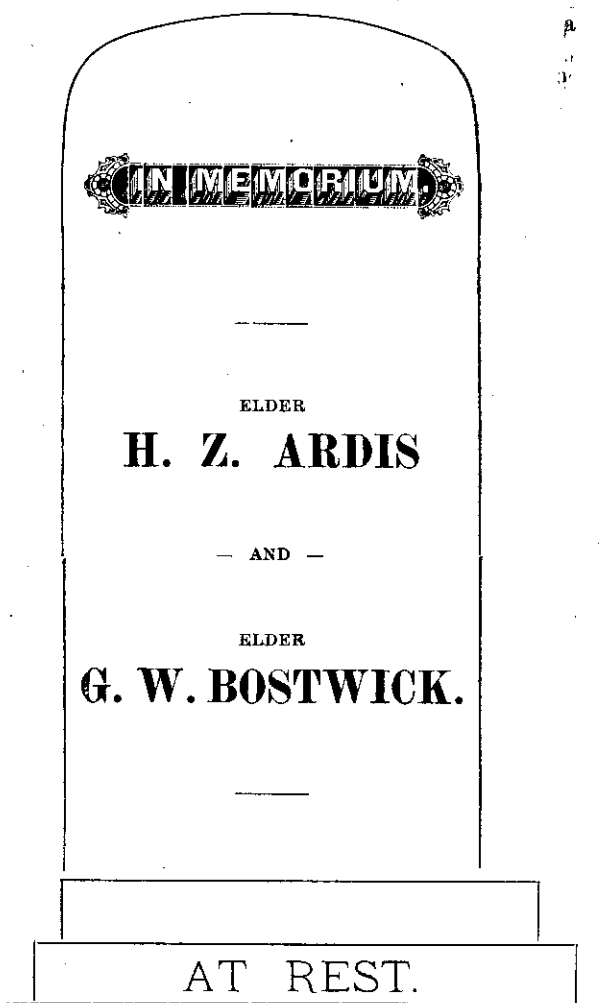

field; we would again urge upon this body the necessity for more earnest efforts in this great work.

SATURDAY, OCTOBER 1st, 9.30 A. M.

Met pursuant to adjournment. Opened by reading the 9th Psalm by the Moderator, and prayer by Elder J. W. Faulkner.

The minutes of the previous day were read by the clerk and approved by the body.

On the renewal of the call, letters from the churches were read and names of delegates enrolled.

On motion that the first half hour of the afternoon session be devoted to prayer, for the churches of this Association, which are in a languishing condition, (per request of the churches).

The report of the Committee on Constitution was read and adopted with amendments.

On motion, the amendments be adopted separately.

REPORT ON CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE 1. This Association shall be known by the name of the Florida Baptist Association. The object of this Association shall be the work of missions, colporterage, Sabbath-school enterprises, and other work that will tend to the spread of the gospel.

ART. 2 This Association shall be composed of white male members chosen by the respective churches in its union, in the proportion of two members from each church of fifty members or less, and one additional delegate for every twenty-five members over fifty.

ART. 10. Any amendment or alteration of this constitution may be made by the vote of two-thirds of the members present at any two successive regular meetings of the Association. All other matter except matters of fellowship, shall be decided by a majority of votes. In matters of fellowship the Association must be a unit.

ART. 11. Fifth clause.—To appropriate the money contributed and sent up to Association, as specified by said churches, when not specified shall be appropriated to promote the best interest of the Master's cause.

Your Committee on Sunday-Schools submit the following report: We find but little progress in Sabbath-schools the past year, there are indeed two or three schools reported in the bounds of our Association, but from the general return of our churches, they as a whole (or seem to be) inert on the great work of Sabbath-schools, and we earnestly recommend that our churches examine into the good that has been accomplished in this branch of religious instruction, and that each church in the near future have one organized within their walls, so at our next meeting together, the general report may be more encouraging, with Sabbath-schools from each church, and the churches are requested to report all Sunday-Schools to the Association.

REPORT ON PREACHING.

Elder T. P. Webb preached to an attentive congregation from 2d Corinthians, 10th chapter and 13th verse.

On motion, the clerk was allowed \$15 for his services.

Resolved, That the thanks of this body are hereby tendered to the brethren and friends of this community for their courtesy, kindness and hospitality extended to us during our session.

On motion, the church at Eanen was stricken from the list of churches of this Association.

On motion, the By-Laws, Constitution, Articles of Faith, and order of Business be printed in our next minutes.

The minutes were read and adopted.

During the singing of a hymn of praise, the parting hand was extended, and after prayer by Elder S. S. Proctor, the Association adjourned to meet with Mount Gilcead church in the southwest corner of Madison county, Florida, commencing on Thursday before the first Lord's day in October, 1882.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

Divine services at 7 o'clock p. m. by Elder James H. Wentworth, from Romans 5th chapter 1st verse, supplemented with 1st verse 8th chapter Romans.

SUNDAY SERVICES.

SUNDAY, OCTOBER 2d, 1881.

The word was preached at 11 o'clock a. m. in the church by Elder A. C. McCants, from Matthews 1st chapter and latter clause of the 23th verse, and Elder A. M. Manning in the court-house, from 1st Corinthians 9th chapter, 13th, 14th and 15th verses, to large and attentive congregations, with that zeal and earnestness which is characteristic of the speakers, and we pray that may redound to the glory of God and the advancement of the Redeemer's Kingdom in our midst. After the sermons a collection was taken up for missionary purposes amounting to ten dollars and eighty-three cents.

CONSTITUTION OF THE FLORIDA BAPTIST ASSOCIATION.

ARTICLE 1st. This Association shall be known by the name of the Florida Baptist Association. The object of this Association shall be the work of missions, colportage, Sabbath-school enterprises and other work that will tend to the spread of the Gospel.

2d. This Association shall be composed of white male members chosen by the respective churches in its union, in the proportion of two members from each church of fifty or less, and one additional delegate for every twenty-five members over fifty.

3d. In the letters sent by the churches at each session of the Association, shall be expressed their respective members in full fellowship, those baptized, received by letter, restored, dismissed, excommunicated, and since the last session.

4th. Believing it to be proper, on account of the diversity of opinion among men, as to the import of the scripture doctrine contained in the Old and New Testaments, to declare our belief and understanding thereof, we therefore append our belief in twelve articles, and present them with our minutes to the Baptist denomination.

5th. The Association when convened, shall be governed by a regular and proper decorum. A Moderator and a Clerk shall be chosen by the votes of the members present, who shall hold their offices till the next session of the body and until successors are elected. The Moderator shall preside at the meetings of the Association and the Clerk shall record the proceedings thereof and prepare them for the press.

6th. The Association thus organized shall have no power to lord it over God's heritage, nor infringe upon the internal rights of any church.

7th. Newly constituted churches may be admitted into this union upon application by letter and delegates, and if, upon examination found to be orthodox, shall be received by the Association, and the right hand of fellowship extended to the delegates by the Moderator.

8th. The Association shall furnish the churches with the minutes of their proceedings in proportion to the funds sent up for that purpose by the churches.

9th. The minutes of the Association shall be publicly and distinctly read, (and corrected if necessary), and then signed by the Moderator and Clerk before adjournment.

10th. Any amendment or alteration of this Constitution may be made by the votes of two-thirds of the members present, at any regular meeting of the Association. (Of which notice shall be given in the minutes) and the concurrence of two-thirds of the members present at the next Association, shall make the desired alteration. All other matters in this Association shall be decided by a majority of votes.

11th. The Association shall have power, first, to provide for the general union of the churches; second, to give the churches advice in matters of difficulty; third, to inquire into the cause of any church failing to be represented at the meetings of the Association; fourth, to withdraw all connection from any church or churches in this union, who shall violate the rules of this Association, or shall deviate from the orthodox principle of the revealed word of God; fifth, to appropriate the moneys contributed to the Association fund by the churches, to any purpose they may think best for the interest of the church of Christ; sixth, to adjourn to any future time and place they may deem most convenient to the churches in the union.

Assented to by the Florida Association at Ebenezer church, Jefferson county, Middle Florida, and signed by order of the same, on the 16th day of October, 1843.

ARTICLES OF FAITH OF THE FLORIDA BAPTIST ASSOCIATION.

1st. We believe in one only true and living God, and that there are three in the God-head, the Father, the Son and the Holy Ghost.

2d. We believe the scriptures of the Old and New Testament are the word of God and the only rule of faith and practice.

3d. We believe in the doctrine of particular and eternal election.

4th. We believe in the doctrine of original sin.

5th. We believe man's impotency to recover himself from the fallen state which he is by nature by his own free will and ability.

6th. We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of God only by the imputed righteousness of Christ.

7th. We believe that God's elect shall be called, regenerated and sanctified by the Holy Ghost.

8th. We believe that saints shall persevere in Grace, and never finally fall away.

9th. We believe that Baptism, and the Lord's Supper are ordinances of Jesus Christ—that nothing is Baptism, except immersion—that believers are the only subjects of this ordinance, and that none but baptized believers are entitled to partake Lord's Supper.

10th. We believe in the resurrection of the dead and a general judgement.

11th. We believe the punishment of the wicked will be everlasting, and the joys of the righteous will be eternal.

12th. We believe that no minister has a right to the administer the ordinances, only such as are regularly called, and have come under the imposition of the hands of the presbytery.

RULES OF DECORUM FOR THE FLORIDA BAPTIST ASSOCIATION.

1st. At every meeting of the Association, the Moderator shall call the members to order, and cause the Clerk to read the minutes of the preceding Association.

2d. The Moderator shall preserve order, and shall speak on points of order in preference to other members, and shall decide questions of order, subject to an appeal to the Association when requested by any two members.

3d. The Moderator shall put all questions distinctly in this form, "As many as are in favor (as the question may be) say aye," and after the affirmative voice is taken, "As many as are of a contrary opinion, say no." If doubtful which voice is in the majority, it shall be decided by rising and counting.

4th. The Moderator shall appoint committees, except in cases of appointment by ballot.

5th. In all cases of ballot, the Moderator may vote, in all other cases he shall not vote, unless the Association be equally divided, or unless his vote given to the minority, will make the division equal; in that case the question will be lost.

6th. When any member is about to speak in debate, he shall rise and address himself to the Moderator.

7th. If any member while speaking otherwise, transgress the rules of decorum, the Moderator shall or any member may call him to order.

8th. When two or more members rise at the same time, the Moderator shall determine who is first entitled to the floor.

9th. No member shall indulge in unkind remarks in debate; nor shall any member speak more than twice on the same question without leave of the Association, nor more than once, until every member choosing to speak shall have done so.

10th. While any member is addressing the Association, it shall be the duty of the Moderator to suppress all private discourse that may be entertained between the members, and to require strict attention on the part of the members.

11th. When a motion is made and seconded, it shall be stated by the Moderator before debated.

12th. Every motion shall be reduced to writing, if desired by any member of the Association.

13th. After a motion is made and seconded, it shall be deemed in possession of the Association, but may be withdrawn at any time before discussed or amended.

14th. When a question is under debate, no motion shall be entertained, unless to amend it, or to refer it to a committee, or for the previous question, or for adjournment.

15th. A motion for adjournment shall always be in order, and decided without debate.

16th. Any member may call for the division of a question, where two or more distinct propositions are set forth, and when the substance will admit of division.

17th. Motions and amendments may be referred to a committee at the pleasure of the Association.

18th. Every resolution shall receive two readings or readings in the Association, previous to its passage. The first shall be for information, and the second when the decision of the Association is to be made.

19th. These rules may be changed or amended at any regular full meeting of the Association.

20th. The Association shall be opened and closed with prayer each day, either by the Moderator or some other member.

21st. All queries shall be fairly stated, in writing and approved by two-thirds of the members present, before they shall be acted on.
