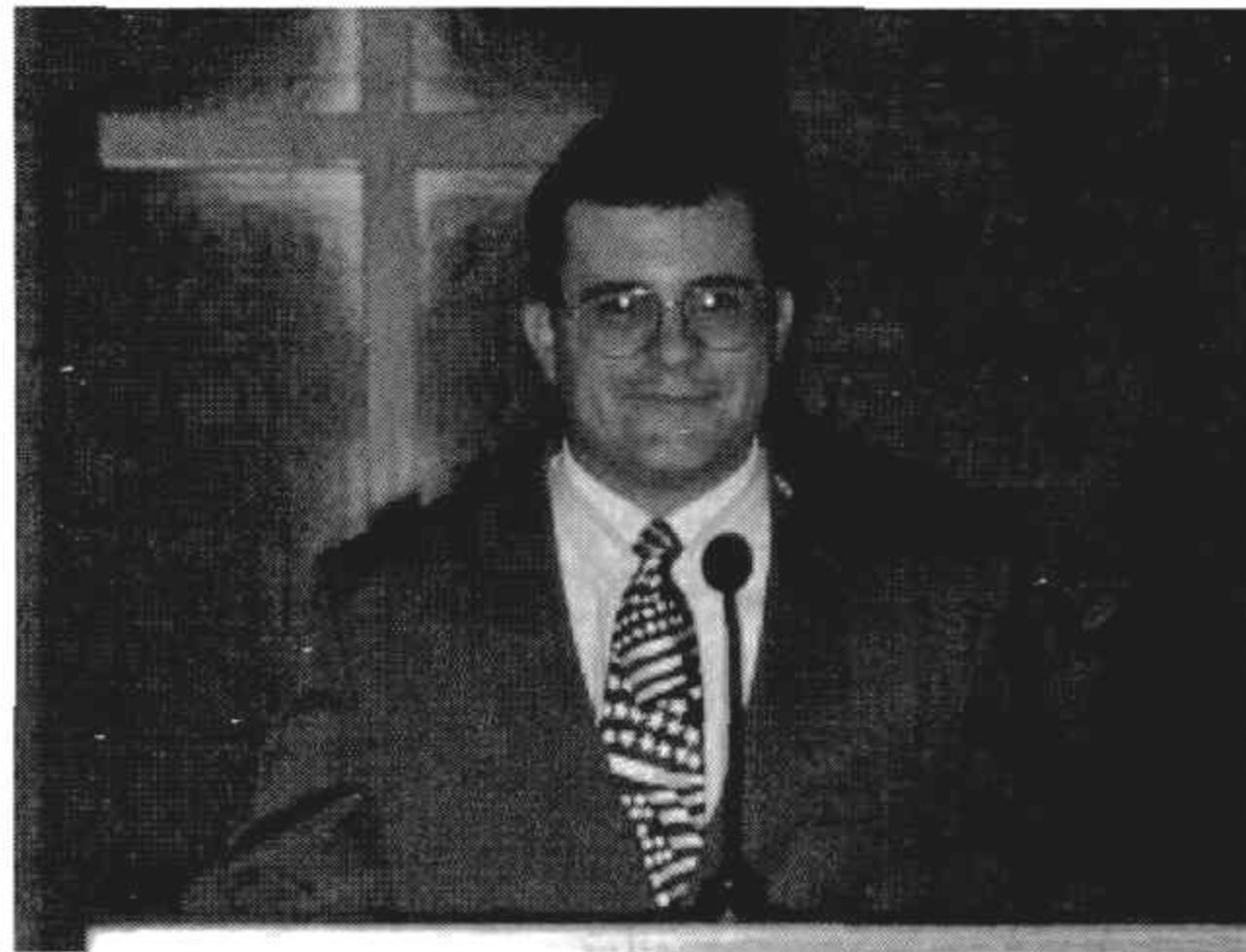

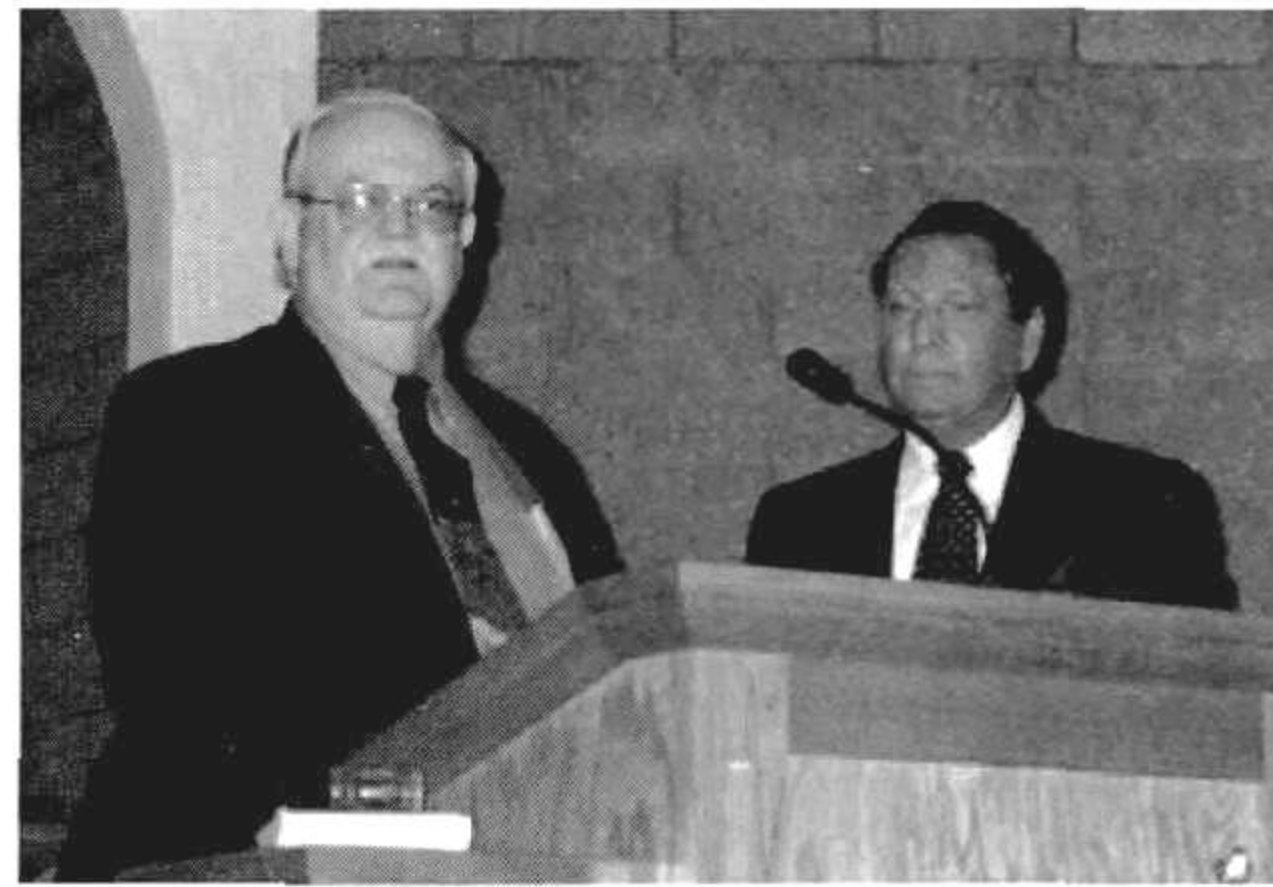

During my time on the State Board of Missions I have come to appreciate the dedication and efficiency of the State Convention under the leadership of Dr. John Sullivan. Our convention exhibits great financial responsibility

Mission Trip 2003 Fayetteville, West Virginia

What a mighty God we serve! Annual Church Profile (Digest of Letters)

We have 32 churches one mission and one new church start.

The information from 33 Annual Church Profiles reveals the following information: 32 churches have Sunday School with an increase of 100 over last year; 24 churches had VBS giving an enrollment of 1848; 21 churches reported Discipleship Training giving an increase of 67 members over last year; Music enrollment increased by 146 from 33 congregations; 21 churches have WMU giving a decrease of 4; 20 churches have Brotherhood with an increase of 28; total receipts from 32 churches were \$3,129,580, an increase of \$108,000 over last year. The total mission giving was \$423,795, an increase of \$30,676 over last year. Association Mission Gifts totaled \$84,202, an increase of \$1,758 over last year.

In 2003 our Association reported 133 baptisms, 156 baptisms were reported in 2002. In 2003 our Association reported 6,599 members; last year 6,510 members were reported.

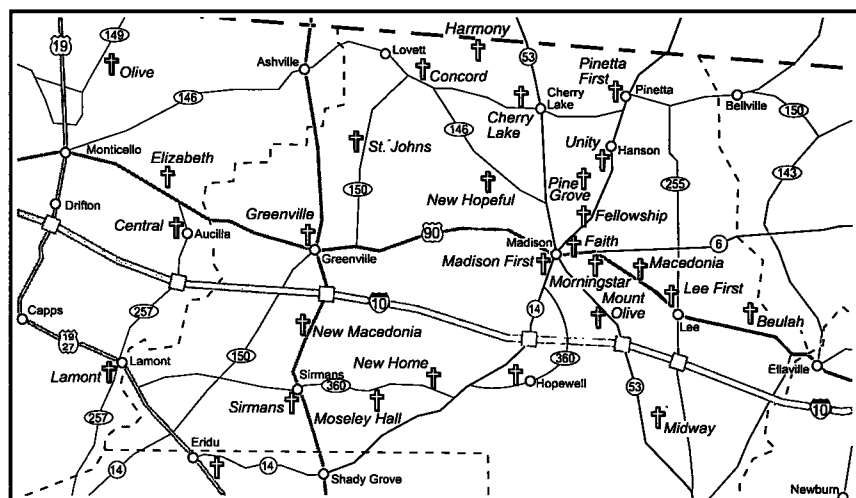

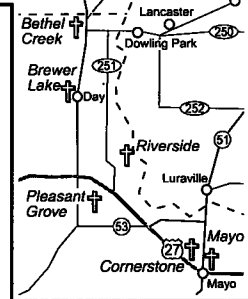

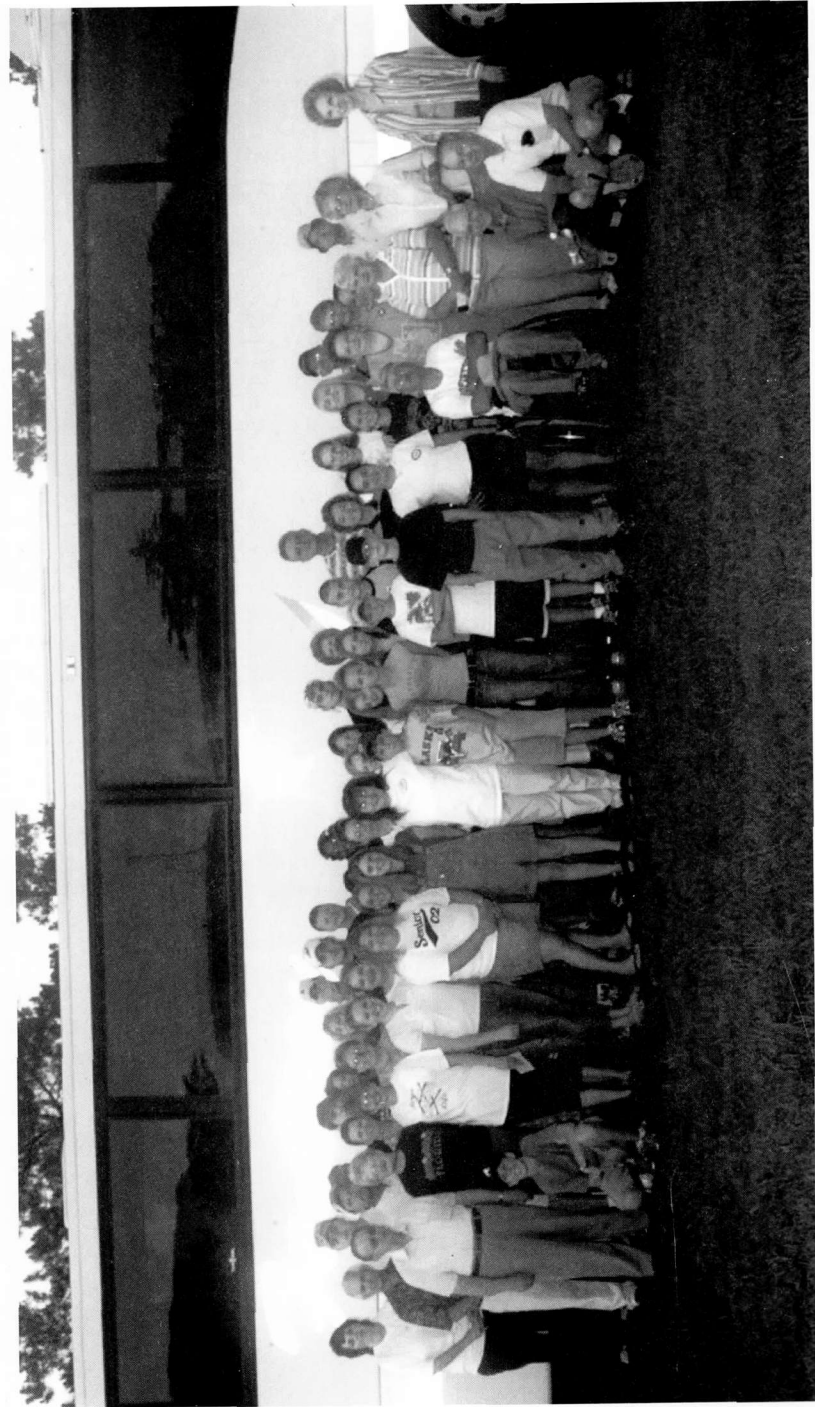
