

Annuity Board Representative

For years Baptists have been used to calling the agency responsible for pastor/staff financial protection The Annuity Board. The name refers to only one aspect of the board's responsibilities, however. In order to give a broader definition to that responsibility the Southern Baptist Convention has approved a name change for the agency. The new name is GuideStone Financial Resources of the Southern Baptist Convention.

A significant milestone was reached at the close of 2004 as assets reached an all-time high of \$8.3 billion. In addition, the investment programs made available to GuideStone participants performed well for 2004, as well as since their inception in August 2001.

In a concentrated effort to offer more flexibility in plan options, deductibles and competitive rates, new health plans were made available to participants. The plans, along with the addition of a second network provider, have been well received and have had an impact on stabilizing rates. In addition to more participants using in-network providers to take advantage of medical discounts, the wellness emphasis that began three years ago also contributed to lower claims costs. Over 40% of participants received a decrease in the medical plan rates for January 1, 2005.

The Endowment ministry continued its work to make Southern Baptists aware of the tragic plight of retired ministers and their widows who were unable to plan adequately for retirement. Individuals and churches responded with open hearts and open hands as they helped to underwrite the financial assistance given to those who are in desperate need. This ministry comes under the "relief" aspect of the old "Relief and Annuity Board."

It may be of interest to see how Florida Baptists are responding to the services offered by the GuideStone:

Number of active churches in the Church Annuity Plan: 1,520

Percentage of churches active in the Church Annuity Plan: 72%

Number of persons receiving retirement benefits: 1,715

THE GIVING LIFE is the newest annual stewardship promotion plan on sacrificial giving. The Giving Life was provided for Florida Baptist churches this year, and gives prominence to spiritual growth issues. This program encourages Christians to grow in their involvement in, and support of, kingdom causes (Romans 12:1-2).

NEW MATERIALS prepared and provided by the Stewardship Department were presented to pastors, church staff and laypersons this year at the seminars which our association sponsors.

BUILDING FOR THE FUTURE: To date, the Stewardship Department has made available eleven trained consultants who have led 208 BUILDING FOR THE FUTURE (BTF) campaigns in Florida Baptist churches in the last 12 months, 10 churches have completed BTF programs, totaling \$4,529,737: Expect spiritual renewal to occur in members' lives and thousands of dollars in interest payments to be saved when your church uses BTF. This fine programs, which maximizes the resources of your own congregation, can be used in any size church in Florida.

YOUR CHURCH AND ITS MINISTRY OF STEWARDSHIP: Developing a ministry of stewardship in the church requires planning and an understanding of the available resources. Last year seven stewardship specialists worked with the director and associate director to conduct 46 Pastor Stewardship Meetings with approximately 850 pastors, staff members, and stewardship leaders from 476 churches in attendance; and 13 Lay Stewardship

Conferences with approximately 373 in attendance from 135 churches. In addition, approximately 60 churches received personal training and assistance through our department's church consultations. Middle Florida sponsored clinics and seminars in our own association, and will do so in the year to come.

THANK YOU FOR YOUR SUPPORT as we continue to proclaim the message and meaning of biblical stewardship. Florida Baptist churches face monumental challenges in the years ahead. Please let us know how we can assist you in your vital ministry of developing faithful stewards.

The committee was charged with reviewing reports, documents and other materials submitted and to report back to the Association at the October Annual Meeting.

On August 22 at 7:00 PM, the committee met to do its work at the Association Office. It was decided that a meeting with the church would be of great value to both the committee and the church so a meeting was arranged for September 12 at 7:00 PM.

The meeting was well attended with good participation by both parties. The church were gracious hosts and provided wonderful refreshments.

After careful study and review of materials, sharing of personal first-hand knowledge of the church and its wishes to fellowship and minister with us, it was a unanimous decision to recommend to you that the First Baptist Church of Greenville be received under the watch care of the Middle Florida Baptist Association. They will have all the rights and privileges of membership except voting. Should this recommendation be approved by the Association, it will be necessary for the First Baptist Church of Greenville to take another vote on their desire to be affiliated with our Association in nine months (July 2006). Should this vote by the church be affirmative, the Middle Florida Baptist Association would take a final vote on the question of admission at our Annual Meeting one year after the watch care ap-

proval had been granted. Upon a favorable vote the First Baptist Church of Greenville will be granted full fellowship with Middle Florida Baptist Association with all rights and privileges of other member churches.

The committee wishes to express appreciation to the First Baptist Church of Greenville for their desire to be a part of us and for supplying materials needed for study.

As chairman, I would like to thank the entire committee for their diligence, contributions and cooperation in accomplishing this important task.

This year saw revivals in a brand new fashion among eighteen (18) churches as they clustered in "triads", swapped staff and rotated meeting places. This was well received and has served as a stimulus for other cooperative ventures.

Our gifts to the Association, State Missions, and Cooperative Program also increased.

The Counseling Ministry has continued to be well used by the community at large, as well as by many of our congregations. Due to the untimely death of Dr. Don Dunlap this ministry was in transition, but thanks to answered prayer and the desire of Dr. Debbie Dunlap to pick up the practice it is now in full operation again. Pray that we will continue to be sensitive to the opportunities and challenges God brings our way.

Disaster Relief Report

This has been a very active year for response to disaster situations. People from our churches have risen in response to the needs of others and worked 3 hurricanes and 1 training workshop.

Four men responded to Milton after Dennis came ashore. They were housed at First Baptist Churtch of Milton and did cleanup for 3 days.

Two trips were made in September to Hattiesburg, Mississippi in response to Katrina. A total of 32 people ministered during these trips. Both men and women served, and a tractor was taken on each of these trips.

Our October trip was in response to Rita and the mission was to Lake Charles, LA. Ten men responded and took along a tractor. The main work was putting on tarps and cleanup.

Six of our people responded to help on the feeding unit for the day of training at Green Cove Springs, Florida.

Florida Baptist Historical Society

The Florida Baptist Historical Society has had an existence since 1894. The Florida Baptist Convention has seen a need down through the years for the collection, storage, publishing and interpretation of important events in the life of our convention. The FBHS is committed to service to Florida Baptist churches.

Some things have happened this year of note. We have assisted at least ten churches in the writing of their church history by providing them pertinent resource information.

We have collected over 1,400 biographical sketches of pastors who have served in Florida. We have published a monthly newsletter entitled Then and Now. We have published a fall journal that chronicles the history of our Florida Baptist State convention agencies. We have purchased more historical resources that are available to us on microfilm only.

Within the next six months we plan to be on line with our new website that can be accessed through FloridaBaptistHistory. org. We are also making a committed effort to collect copies of associational minutes from all of our associations.

Our newest research collection is an attempt to get as many Convention Press books as possible that have been published by the Southern Baptist Convention. These are the old paperback study course books that go back as far as 1919. Some are hardback but most are cardboard back and are

packed with Baptist history and research information. We are asking our churches and associations to assist us in forming this important collection.

The future of our history is bright as we work together to collect, preserve and publish data that will serve our people and honor our Lord.

Highlights of Executive Committee Meetings

December 7, 2004In celebration of the 150th Anniversary of the founding of the Florida
Baptist Convention, the association had an exhibit booth at the state
convention meeting in Jacksonville November 8-9, 2004. Middle
Florida Association and Florida Baptist Historical Society jointly
sponsored a celebration at the site near Concord Church on November 20, 2004 with Dr. John Sullivan as guest speaker. Billy Bailey and
Steve Tuten of Moseley Hall Church (1901-2004) stated their decision to close the church and deed the property to the association.
A motion was made and seconded to accept the property. Approval
was given to purchase 1.1 additional acres of land for \$9,000 per acre
from Jack McLeod who donated the office site.

February 1, 2005Guidelines for the use and sale of Moseley Hall Property was approved as drawn up by the Administrative Committee. The transfer of \$18,663.57 was made on January 31, 2005. A \$10,000 Moseley Hall Endowment Fund was set up which will enable Moseley Hall to continue in ministry as long as the world stands with only interest being used. Guidelines for Faithful Servants ministry was approved. Budget amendments made were: #702 Moseley Hall Property, #800C for Faithful Servants Ministry. The Maguire State Mission Offering Goal was surpassed and \$893 will be returned to the Association for

mission purposes.


