Florida Baptist Historical Society

The ministry of the Florida Baptist Historical Society was begun in 1894. The 2006 Journal of the Florida Baptist Historical Society features the autobiography of Edwin Hansford Rennolds Sr. (1839-1912) the historian-educator-founder of the society. We are grateful for our 112 years of existence and the support of the Florida Baptist Convention and our churches.

There were three primary events for the historical society this year. We now have a web site, we have begun a collection of books published by (Southern Baptist Convention) Convention Press, and our biographical sketch collection has grown to over 1500 biographical vignettes. We could not have done this without the help of many of our associations and churches.

We are available to assist you with your church history records, research, writing and publishing. We receive about 15 inquiries per week from researchers and we are having more and more writers visit our holdings located at The Baptist College of Florida library.

Twelve churches will be involved in the On Mission Celebration March 22-26, 2006. The Maguire State Mission Offering Goal was surpassed and \$1617 will be returned to Middle Florida Associa tion.

June 6, 2006The Moseley Hall property was sold and will be used as a Trucking Terminal and Office. The Security System and new Sign has been installed. The Children's Camp has 133 registered children and about 50 staff. Approval given to move funds from the Money Mar ket Account to a CD for better interest. Some Historical Events of Elizabeth Baptist Church

1831	Elizabeth Baptist Church founded (used log cabin). Church organized with
	Rev. Jesse Goodman as first pastor. Founding members: James & wife, Elizabeth
	Padgett Walker, Jesse Walker, Charles & Sarah Walker, Joseph & Caroline Kinsey.

Rev. Richard J. Mays of Madison County was called as pastor.

1834 Church constituted April 12, 1834, signed by Jesse Goodman and James Connel.

Florida became a state. Elizabeth represented by A.J. Whitehurst and Joel Walker at Annual Association Meeting at Concord Baptist Church in Madison

1853 R.H. Shackleford was ordained at Elizabeth. He was appointed to a special committee to confer with messengers from West Florida and Alachua Associa tion on the subject of organizing a Baptist State Convention.

Florida Baptist Convention was organized in the home of Richard J. Mays near Concord in Madison County.

One room Church was built (part of present building).

1913 Church transferred from Florida Association, which was formed in 1843 to Middle Florida Association, which was founded in 1900.

On September 20, 1931, Elizabeth celebrated its 100th anniversary. I.N. Aldrich preached the message. Mrs. Lizzie Standley read the church history.

In the early forties, a mission was organized. Services were held on Saturday nights and

Sunday afternoons. The wood frame building the services were held in was on the George Demott farm. After the close of World War II, it was disbanded and several families came into Elizabeth from the mission. Willie Lee Strawn was pastor. 28 people joined the church 1942-44.

1951 The church voted to have services every Sunday beginning on October 1, 1951.

1953 Additional Sunday School rooms, dining room & kitchen built, a 2-story structure off back.

Mr. & Mrs. I.W. Shepherd started the Elizabeth Cemetery Trust. This trust's interest is used to maintain the cemetery. An additional acre was given by Mr. B. J. Hambrick to the cemetery, which is a separate entity from church. Mr. & Mrs. H.M. Warren gave one acre of land for a pastorium. A well was dug.

1970 Pastorium completed and dedicated. Central air and heat installed.

Completed a \$237,000 renovation and building program, including a long awaited baptistery, new dining hall and kitchen, bathrooms, music room, classrooms, handicap ramp and nursery facilities. Frank Parrish donated a grand piano.

1991 Second pastorium purchased (located in Monticello).

1999 Note burned (1982 building).

1999-2000 Began and completed renovations and expansion of church sanctuary.

2002-2003 Completed with help from Campers on Mission and dedicated new

Fellowship Hall.

October 15, 2006 Celebrated 175th Anniversary; Dr. John Sullivan, Executive Director/ Treasurer, Florida Baptist Convention, Guest Speaker.

Mayo Baptist Church History

Early in 1894, 19 members of Half-Moon Lake Baptist Church organized Mayo Baptist Church with Rev. H.M. Frier as pastor. The initial building was built on a site given by W.T. Dees and his wife. This was two blocks east of the former church on Main Street. That original building was destroyed by a hurricane in 1898 and never rebuilt.

It appears that from 1898 until June of 1909, Mayo Baptists worshipped in the Mayo Methodist Church on alternate Sundays, operating a union Sunday School. In 1905, the site on the corner of Hart and Main Street was given by the same donor and on June 18, 1909 the new building was dedicated debt free. Membership at that time was 86. The church withdrew from the Lafayette Association and united with Middle Florida in late 1909.

The first resident pastor was called in 1921, Rev. J.F. Russell, who served the church only half time. During the decade of the 20's, the church went to fulltime pastorates, but pastors remained for very short times, often as little as six months.

In 1930, Rev. A.M. Parker, father of Mrs. Marie Windburn, become pastor for several years and was called again following a brief pastorate by W. T. Newsom. Rev. Parker led the church until 1939, during which time the B.Y.P.U., later changed to Training Union, was established.

The first Brotherhood was organized in March of 1942. In 1944 the church attained its first membership of 200. In 1947 the first bulletin service was begun.

The longest pastorate in the history of the church began in 1949 when Rev. S.V. Cofield was called. He served until April of 1957, at which time he retired. He came back as interim pastor for a few months in 1961. During this time the building was renovated, with block walls on the outside and paneling inside, keeping the old building inside those two walls!

In January of 1966 the church licensed Bro. A.E. Wimberly into the gospel ministry. He was ordained in March with the Rev. Dave Alderman bringing the message.

The church observed J.D. and Irene Garden Day on December 4, 1977. J.D. had served as trustee for 30 years and Irene served as church treasurer for 38 years. (These are the two that made a very large contribution to the present fellowship building.)

The church completed an annex to be used as a fellowship hall in 1978, but needing the Sunday School rooms, it was converted for that purpose in October of 1993. At that time, the church had 182 resident members and 119 non-resident members.

To back up and get some important happenings between the above dates, on April 17, 1983, the late C.H. (Shunny) Goodwin, Jr. was ordained to the ministry. Rev. Carlton Owens, Director of Missions of the Middle Florida Association, brought the charge to the church and Dr. Roy Saint, pastor, brought the charge to the candidate.

In 1984, the Lucille Hart property was bought for additional educational space. The house was sold in 1993 and the site was then used for a parking lot. The long-range planning committee recommended in May of 1989 that we purchase five acres of land on Highway 51 North and this was approved.

In 1991 a full time Minister of Music and Youth was approved. Cheryl Harris served in this capacity for about eight years. The youth attended "Centrifuge 93" at Ridgecrest in July of 1993.

The Garden Worship Center was completed in 1995 and used as a fellowship hall, Sunday night services, and for the children and youth on Wednesday nights. On July 31, 2004, Mayo Baptist Church had "moving day." Almost every church member and some families that were visiting at the time, worked together to move from the former church building in town to our new sanctuary.

The two years following our move have been wonderful years. The Lord has greatly blessed us with growth in membership, fellowship, and leadership. Our present active membership is 164 with additions almost every week! Jimmy Legg is pastor.



History of the Pine Grove Baptist Church, 1856 – 2006

The earliest records of the Pine Grove Baptist Church are found in the minutes of the Florida Baptist Association for 1896 in a collection of Historical Sketches of the association churches. In this document it is stated that "This church was organized October 25, 1856, the organizing council being Elders R. J. Mays, Ryan Frier and S. C. Craft. The following were the constituent members: Jarvis J. Frier, Nancy Frier, Hiram Roberts, Mary Roberts, Mary Warren, Sarah A. Warren, Henderson M. Frier, and Elizabeth Woodward. The first pastor was S. C. Craft....In four years the membership increased to eighty-four." The church soon reached out to form a mission or "arm" which met at a school house near the residence of M. J. Williams. In 1865 this mission became the Macedonia Baptist Church. The church assisted in the formation of other churches, as well. In 1861 H. M. Frier was ordained at the request of the newly established Midway church to become their pastor. In 1887 a number of members were dismissed by letter to form the church at Hopeful (later New Hopeful). Also Oak Grove Church (which was located just east of Pinetta) was formed by members dismissed from Pine Grove in 1879.

Having been founded just two years after the Florida Baptist Convention was constituted at the plantation home of R. J. Mays, and by some of the same early Baptist leaders, the fledgling Baptist Convention met with the young church in connection with a union meeting on January 29, 1860. The terrible Civil War loomed on the horizon from the very earliest days of the new church, profoundly affecting its very being, as was true of all the churches in North Florida and surrounding regions. Quoting the early historical sketch once more, "At the church conference of March 21, 1863, the clerk was directed to make a

list of its members who had enlisted in the army, and to ascertain the dates, if possible, of the deaths of any who had been killed or had died. It appears that this list was kept open to the close of the war, since the statement is given that fifteen went and only five returned."

Nevertheless, the young church persevered. In minutes dating back to 1887, church records show Pine Grove actively involved in the work of the association, and in sending delegates to the fifth Sunday union meetings, which were an important source of information and fellowship in those early days. It was probably from these early union meetings, according to historian Edwin Browning, that the idea for a new association was born, more geographically central to the growing area of Madison and surrounding counties. Thus on November 9, 1900, Pine Grove sent clerk J. L. Warren, L. A. Seals, and G. E. Blair as messengers for the constituting of the new Middle Florida Baptist Association, meeting at Macedonia, Pine Grove's "daughter" church.

During the period leading up to and following World War I the Southern Baptist Convention was having considerable financial problems, brought about by the national economic downturn. It implemented during this time the historic "Seventy-Five Million Campaign" to erase the huge deficit which was hindering its work of missions and ministry. In the business meeting of Sept. 6, 1919, Pastor S. B. Cole appointed a committee to plan Pine Grove's part in the state and national campaign. So Pine Grove, struggling little church that it was, became a part of this massive Convention-wide effort.

The first Sunday school was organized in July of 1927, following a talk by George W. Broom from the Florida Baptist Convention. Though the growth of the church has always been very gradual, and sometimes non-existent, there have been times when large numbers of people have been added to the church. These have come during the annual "protracted meetings," usually held during the summer. This was especially true during the 1920s when several of those whose families are still active in the church became members, and were baptized in nearby ponds or "sinks."

Because the church couldn't afford a full time minister, most of the pastors during these early years had a very short tenure. In fact, the "annual call" was a fixture of Pine Grove and many other churches during this period. It was not until Rev. A. M. Rowe was called on April 19, 1931, that the church enjoyed a long pastorate, with the pastor living on the field. In spite of the hardships of these depression times, Pastor Rowe persevered, and served until 1946, making his the longest tenure of any pastor up to that date. The immediate past pastor, Phil Heard, served from 1989 to 2005.

The next period of Pine Grove's history might be called the "building phase." It was during this period that the original frame building was replaced with the present worship center in 1966. The baptistry was added in 1972, new colored "Krinkle-glass" windows in 1990, and it was completely refurbished in 2003. The origin of the old building is unknown, but it was the earliest building remembered by the oldest church members. A three room block Sunday school building was built behind it in 1959, to which a six room addition was added in 1982. The present fellowship hall was added on the north side of the worship center in 1995, which also includes a kitchen, two classrooms, rest rooms, and storage areas. Two pastoriums were also built during this period, the first in 1957 on Hwy. 145 in Hanson. It was later sold and the present brick pastor's home was built in 1979 just south of the church on Rocky Ford Road.

The church has never been large in size, and has always been located in the open country, with no surrounding community to draw from. Yet its people have been faithful, and God has blessed it for 150 years. This anniversary was celebrated during a ten month period beginning in January of 2006 with special services each month, and culminating on October 22, 2006, with a historic homecoming/sesquicentennial celebration. May God be praised for His faithfulness, and may His people remain faithful for the generations to come.


