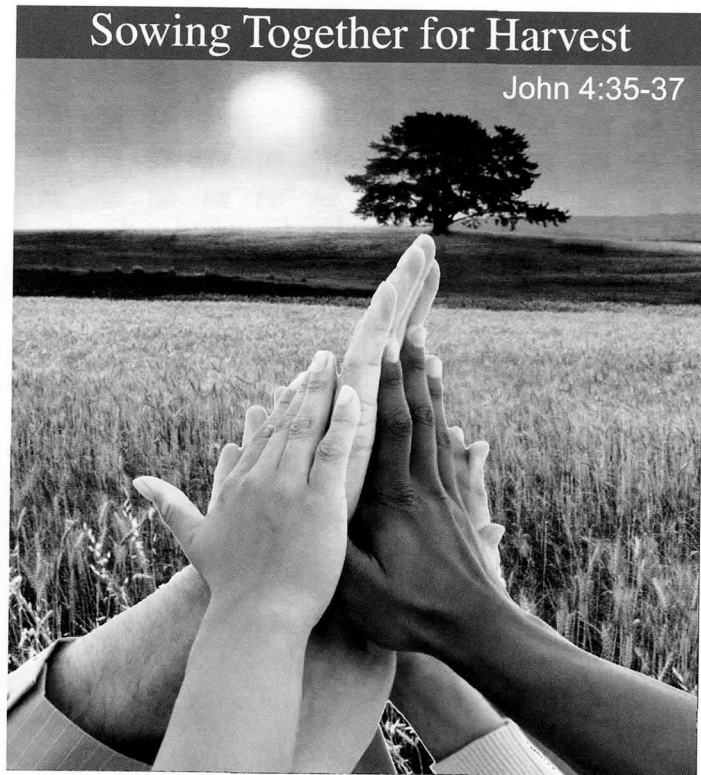

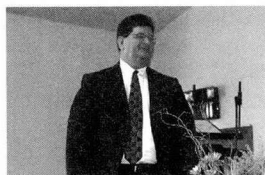

### December 2, 2008

- There were 1,212 Samaritan's Shoe Boxes prepared by Middle Florida Churches. Nine Churches selected gifts for Florida Baptist Children's Home.
- Approved Church Growth Stimulus Funds for Beulah and Hopewell Churches.

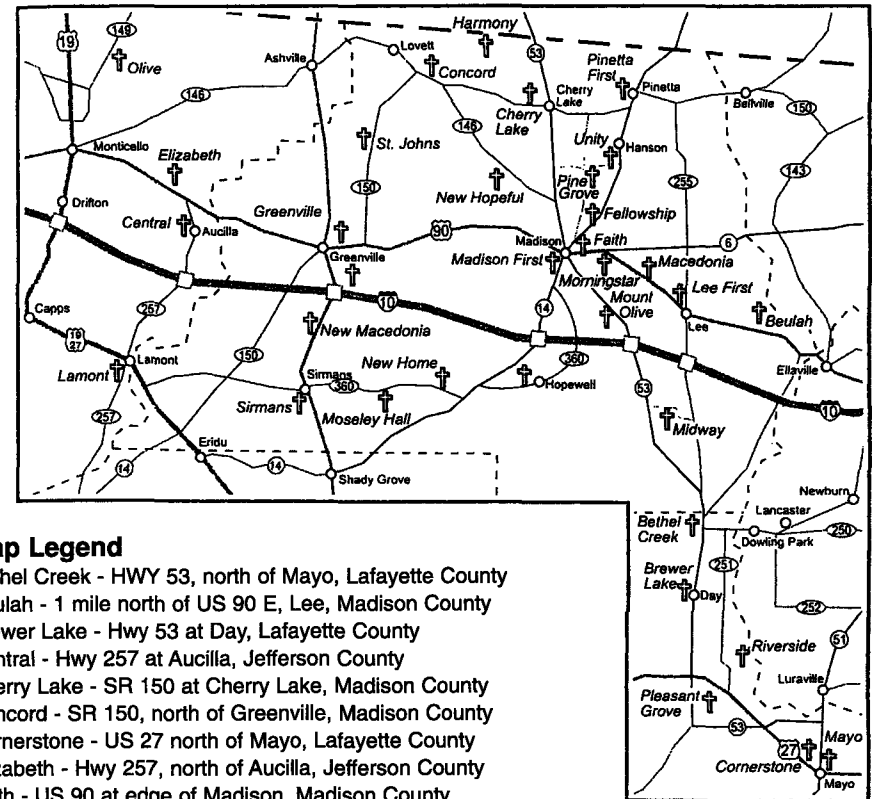
