### Annuity

Dr. Paul Powell, president of the Annuity Board, has concluded his first year as president by describing the Board as "strong." The following highlights confirm this assessment.

The Annuity Board presently has more than 64,671 men and women with active retirement accounts. The number of retirees receiving annuity payments now exceeds 21,000 with \$52.1 million paid in retirement benefits in the first six months of 1991. The Church Annuity Plan membership has reached an all-time high of 34,306, and it increases everyday. In addition to this, there have been 9,357 churches and church staff personnel who have increased their contributions to their retirement accounts.

Assets now held in trust by the Annuity Board grew by more than one million dollars a day, increasing to \$3.19 million through June 1991.

In Florida, 1,038 churches have voted to place their pastor and/or church staff in the Church Annuity Plan. Enrollment of churches continues toward a goal of at least 70 percent of Florida Baptist Churches participating. If your church is not participating, one of the finest things you could do would be to lead your church to do so.

We were able to bring Dr. Richard Barber, who is our State Director of the Annuity Department to our association for a meeting with our pastors and staff. This meeting was well attended.

It has been my personal joy to assist two of our churches to move to the expanded Annuity Plan this past year. If your church is not now participating in this plan I want to encourage you to do so.

At the present time we have 14 of our churches in the Expanded Plan, we would like to see all our churches participating. If I can be of help to any pastor and/or church please do not hesitate to call me. I will be happy to assist you.

### Florida Baptist Family Ministries

Since 1904, Florida Baptist Ministries has grown from an orphanage to a statewide network of ministry to children, unwed mothers and their babies. adoptions, developmentally disabled adults, counsel to families of those in care, preventive counseling to individuals and families, and to senior adults. During 1991, 14 different services were provided from seven locations plus a network of licensed private families providing inhome foster care.

### MAJOR STEPS - 1991

- \* Accreditation received from the Council on Accreditation of Services for Families and Children, Inc. (A voluntary, extensive review and recognition of services of the highest quality in the nation.)
- \* Completion of the Mildred W. Carlton Learning Center on the Lakeland Children's Home campus. Made possible by major gifts from the Carlton Family and from a Cooperative Program Capital Improvements Grant from the Florida Baptist Convention.
- \* Complete renovation and preservation of the Emergency Shelter for teenage girls in Lakeland. Bought in the early 50s as a home for Superintendent T.M. Johns, this historic building was completely renovated with a Cooperative Program Capital Improvements Grant from the Florida Baptist Convention.
- \* Construction is underway to expand the Florida Baptist Retirement Center in Vero Beach. Thirty villa units will be completed in late 1991 and early 1992. All units are reserved by applicants waiting to move in. Also, a 15-room assisted living unit is being added. Approximately 75 additional senior adults can be served.
- \* Construction is expected to begin in the fall on a group home in Ft. Myers for dependent children plus an area social work office. The home is a partnership program with Royal Palm Association providing the facility and furnishings and services provided by Family Ministries.
- \* The first full year of the Maternity Group Home. Opened in the fall of 1990, the Home can serve six girls at a time.
- \* A Maternity Care Specialist was added to coordinate Christian alternative to abortion for unwed mothers. This position was developed earlier than what was projected in long range plans for the 90s as a result of work by the Sanctity of Human Life Committee and funding by the Florida Baptist Convention.
- \* The Giving Hope Campaign to secure private commitments over three years to help expand services has exceeded its base goal of \$2,000,000. The Campaign will be completed in early 1992.

#### Director of Missions

This has been a year of pastoral leadership change in our churches. Thirteen of 29 churches have changed pastors this year. In the 14 years that I have been your Director of Missions, we have never had so many changes. Our records indicate that only five of our present pastors were in their church before 1989.

This year I have been in 27 of the 29 churches in Middle Florida, and preached or spoke at some event in 22 of them. In the Taylor Association, I visited in 15 of the 16, and either preached or spoke at some other event in 12 of them.

I am grateful for the invitation to share in the churches. I preached 60 times this year, shared in one minister, and two deacon ordinations, and one ground-breaking service. I counseled with pastors and other individuals and worked with pastor search committees and others when asked.

The Florida Baptist Convention continues to be helpful in many ways to our churches and association.

We are especially grateful for their commitment to provide \$5,147.00 in Cooperative Program funds to assist the Mission District. We have been using surplus funds in the Mission District budget for the last two years. However, those funds are depleted and with rapidly increasing cost of medical insurance, we would have serious problems without their assistance.

Thank you for allowing me to serve as your Director of Missions. Call me if I can be helpful.

#### The Petitionary Letters Committee Report

August 22, 1990, Middle Florida Baptist Association received a petition for affiliation from Concord Missionary Baptist Church. The Petitionary Letters Committee made a thorough investigation and determined that Concord Baptist Church met the qualifications for affiliation in accordance with the Constitution and Bylaws of Middle Florida Baptist Association. After much study, consultation and prayer, the committee recommended that Concord Baptist Church be received under the watchcare of the Middle Florida Baptist Association. At the 91st annual session in October of 1990, the Middle Florida Baptist Association voted to receive Concord Baptist Church under a watchcare status for a period of one year.

According to Article Five item two of the Constitution and Bylaws, a church after watchcare relationship of nine months must vote and record, reaffirming their desire to be a member of Middle Florida Baptist Association. On July 21, 1991, Concord Baptist Church met in a special conference, the purpose of this meeting was to ratify their prior decision requesting membership in Middle Florida Baptist Association. A motion was made by Wayne Hudson and seconded by Philip Roberts, to further petition Concord Baptist Church for full fellowship in the Association. The motion carried by a unanimous decision.



#### Discipleship Training

**Discipleship Training** is crucial to the churches in growing disciples and developing believers. The associational discipleship training program has the responsibility of helping each church to organize, improve and enlarge its program of discipleship development.

This year's theme is **DiscipleALL...Discipleship Training for all members.** Curriculum and special interest studies will focus on helping members to realize the importance of their own discipleship and leadership development.

Some other things our Middle Florida Associational Discipleship Training has done and will do to help the churches with their training opportunities are:

- 1. The 1990 Associational "M" Night attendance was 277 (Statewide attendance 8,354). Our goal for this year is 350. "M" Night 1991 will be held November 26 at First Baptist Church, Madison.
- 2. Associational Discipleship Training Leadership School Training: A New Look Seminar was held January 22 at Midway Church. Attendance was 48 with 12 churches represented.
- 3. A doctrinal study (The Doctrine of Lordship) Clinic was held at the Associational Office March 26. Attendance of six with three churches represented.
- 4. Associational Children's Bible Drill held March 18 with three participants. Fellowship was the only church represented. Alicia Dixon represented Middle Florida Association at the state drill April 6 in Graceville. The 1992 associational drills and tournaments will be held March 16 at the Associational Office.
- 5. In the first six months of the 1990-91 church year a total of 1,877 churches in Florida requested 53,107 awards in the Church Study Course system. Figures for the Associations will not be available until the end of September. Again this year three special awards will be presented from the state Discipleship Training Department at "M" Night. These awards will go to the churches with (1) the largest total number of study course awards, (2) the largest number of awards in Discipleship Training Leadership, and (3) the largest percentage of total awards compared to resident membership. By the way, this association also helped Florida gain #1 recognition in Baptist Doctrine Study and Discipleship Training Leadership awards all over the Southern Baptist Convention.
- 6. A Discipleship Training Leadership School will be held February 24 and 25. Its emphasis is on training leaders to be able to lead age group (ongoing program) and/or special interest (short-term) discipleship training.
- 7. Of the 28 churches in the Middle Florida Association, 23 reported discipleship training this year. Last year 23 reported discipleship training.

#### State Board of Missions

It has been a privilege for me to serve you on the State Board of Missions. I have served a three-year term on the Board. I was appointed to a second three-year term which began November 1990. I have enjoyed these four years on the State Board of Missions very much and am sincerely grateful to you for the confidence you placed in me by allowing me to serve in this capacity. The experiences I gained in my first term on the State Board has enabled me to serve more effectively in my second term. I have attended all meetings of the State Board, except for one where I was incapacitated because of an operation, all committee meetings, work group meetings and have completed all special assignments given to me by the State Board of Missions.

My assignment this year has been on the Program Committee. I would like to share with you some of the things the State Board worked on this year. The Board approved nine changes to the Constitution and Bylaws of the State Convention. These outline the responsibilities of the Convention employees and provides clarity and continuity to the Bylaws.

The Board employed four persons to bring new approaches to Ministry. Barbara Sue Curnutt of Dallas, Texas was hired as the new director of the Woman's Missionary Union, Missions Division. Her duties will be to plan, conduct, supervise and evaluate the programs of Missions Education and the Woman's Missionary Union Department. Cecil Seagle was selected to be the new director of the Brotherhood Department. Among his duties will be to plan, conduct, supervise and evaluate the Brotherhood Department programs in the State of Florida. He will also assist on the associational and church level, providing counsel in developing new approaches to mission education and ministry. Loy W. Reed was elected to the position of Director of the Student Ministries Department of the Education Division of the Florida Baptist Convention. Renaud Balzora was selected as Associate Director of the Language Missions Department of the Missions Division. In selecting these individuals the State Board of Missions was looking for people who were creative, could motivate and inspire people in Missions Education and Missions Involvement.

I would like to discuss the budget for a moment. The State Board of Missions is recommending a budget of \$23,932,434.00 for 1992. This is a slight decrease .37 percent from our 1991 Cooperative Program budget and is based on a shortfall of gifts received by the State Convention through July 31. Final approval of the budget will be made by the messengers to our State Convention in November. The State Board of Missions is recommending that 50.82 percent of the funds be retained for Florida Baptist Programs of Missions, evangelism and other ministries. The remainder of 49.18 percent would be sent to the Southern Baptist Convention. We are also recommending that 3.18 percent of the funds sent to the Southern Baptist Convention be designated to support the Pastor Annuity Program. We felt this was important to strengthen the Annuity fund as many of our pastors who are retiring find it difficult to make ends meet on the annuity they receive. I would strongly encourage the messengers who are selected from our churches to support this budget, it is sound and a great deal of planning and prayer went into its preparation.

The State Board of Missions recognizing the need for additional support for the local associations, strongly encourage churches to give at least three percent of their undesignated church receipts to the association. The state average of gifts from local churches to the Cooperative Program is 9.1 percent. We encourage you to at least meet this level of commitment. The State Board also approved a change in the distribution of funds received for world hunger. In the past 10 percent of the monies received was used for hunger in our state and 90 percent was sent to the Southern Baptist Convention for use by the Home Mission Board and the Foreign Mission Board. Because of the increasing need in Florida the Board made a decision to retain 25 percent of these funds for local use.

Purchase has been completed for the Deerfield Beach property which is to be used for a South Florida Urban Training Center. A committee has been appointed to develop plans for its use and recommend ways to fund the center's operation. The Baptist Building, which is the headquarters of the Florida Baptist Convention in Jacksonville, has just been completely renovated at a cost of just over one million dollars. It was in a sad state before the work began but now it is in excellent condition. Should you be in Jacksonville go by and visit this fine facility.

The State Board of Missions is recommending to the Florida Baptist Convention that we enter into a formal partnership with Montana, North Dakota and South Dakota. The need is great because of the lack of churches to minister to the people. The ministry is difficult because of the great distances and sparce population. The State Board of Missions is recommending that each church enter into a partnership with a church in one of these three states. If your church would be interested in doing this please contact the Missions Division of the Florida Baptist Convention and they will assist you in forming this partnership. Every church could at least be involved in a prayer partnership and the involvement could extend as far as your ability would allow toward meeting needs of the church you are in partnership with.

If I can be of assistance to you in anyway please let me know and I will be delighted to help you. The State Board of Missions and the Florida Baptist Convention are there to help you, as a church or individual, if you have a need please contact them for assistance.

Thank you again for allowing me to serve on the State Board of Missions. My life has been enriched by this experience and I hope in some small way I have been able to make a positive contribution to its achievements.






