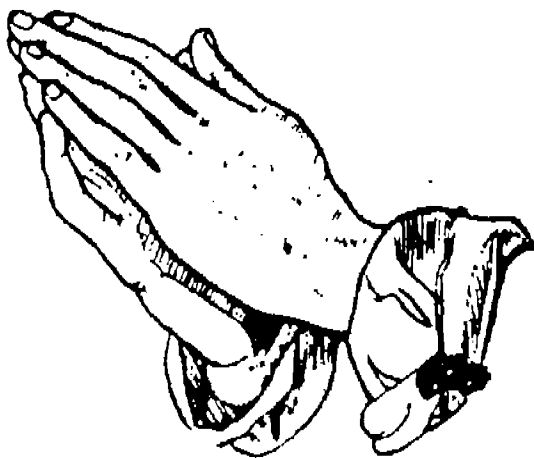


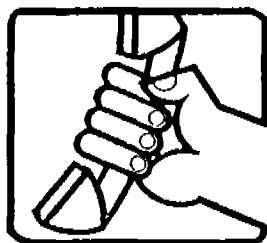

1992 Highlights

- The Southwest Florida Children's Home opened in Fort Myers in August. The Home is a partnership with Royal Palm Association providing the group home and area social work office and services provided by Family Ministries.
- The Northwest Florida Children's Home was started in Pensacola. A merger with the Ninety & Nine Boys Ranch has made it possible to begin that ministry. Planning is under way to enhance and expand that service to boys and girls.
- Publication of the first comprehensive directory of Crisis Pregnancy Centers in Florida. Copies are available to anyone interested.
- Expansion of the Retirement Center, Vero Beach, was completed. Thirty villa units for independent living in a Christian community have been opened. Assisted Living is a new level of care for those who need help but do not need full nursing care. Service is available in this new unit for 15. Total capacity now is 160.

The central dining room has been doubled in size and completely redecorated. A welcoming spot!

1992 Support

Florida Baptists have been a major source of support for the Florida Baptist Children's Homes since 1904 and the Florida Baptist Retirement Center since 1959.

This year, Cooperative Program gifts will provide \$1,220,554. Add to this the special Mother's Day Offering (\$600,000 goal) and designated church gifts (\$279,500), and Florida Baptist churches will give approximately \$2,100,000 toward a budget of \$7,250,000 during 1992.

STATE BOARD OF MISSIONS REPORT

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for allowing me to represent you on the State Board of Missions. I have enjoyed being on the Board the last five years and am sincerely grateful to you for the trust you placed in me. I have attended all State Board meetings, all committee meetings, sub-committee meetings, work group meetings and have completed all special assignments given to me by the Board.

My assignment this year has been on the Program Committee. I was honored to be selected to serve as vice-chairman of this committee. We developed a plan that will be presented to the State Convention for emergency relief for families of unemployed ministers. Details will be provided later. Basically this plan provides \$1,500.00 per month for three months for ministers who have paid \$25.00 per month into the program or \$1,500.00 for six months to those who pay \$50.00 per month. The plan also provides for a percentage reimbursement to those ministers who leave the ministry, leave the state or upon death if you have not received benefits from the plan.

Healthcare costs are one of the greatest concerns in America. At the present time there are over 57 proposals to reform health care. With exorbitant doctor fees and astronomical health care related costs, something must be done to control these escalating costs. Concerning health care costs, Senator Tim Wirth of Colorado said, "the average American says, I'm not afraid to die, but I am afraid to get sick." Last year 300 billion dollars were spent on defense of our nation and 800 billion dollars were spent on health care. The State Board of Missions, realizing this problem, is working to alleviate some of the financial strain on ministers and their families by providing H.M.O.'s (Health Maintenance Organizations) to provide complete health care at reasonable costs. We hope to make this available in larger cities this year, more details will be forthcoming.

The State Board of Missions approved a 1.5 million dollar financial aid package to help damaged churches in South Florida affected by Hurricane Andrew. Two hundred fifty thousand dollars of that would come from the Maguire State Mission offering. The original goal for the Maguire State Mission offering was \$1,082,000.00. This was revised to \$1,332,000.00 in order to acquire the necessary funds for the hurricane relief. The State Board strongly encourages each church to increase its giving to the Maguire State Mission offering in order to reach this increased goal. The regular Maguire State Mission offering is used for new churches, pastoral assistance, migrant ministries, Haitian sunday school literature and student mission teams. The 1.5

million dollar aid package will be used to provide salaries for the pastors and staffs of the affected churches, to help make up the difference between insurance and rebuilding costs of church buildings, to help cover the cost of contents not covered by insurance, to help cover costs of building materials and to help meet the needs of affected families.

The State Board of Missions will be recommending a \$24,485,828.00 budget to the State Convention, which is a 2.31 percent increase over the 1992 budget. The recommended division of these funds will be 42.2 percent designated for the Southern Baptist Convention causes which is a 3.8 percent decrease; 49.6 percent to the Florida Baptist Convention causes which represents a 1.2 percent decrease; 5 percent for pastoral aid and 3.2 percent for annuities. With one thousand people moving into Florida each day, and realizing that 75 percent of our people are lost, it is imperative that we minister where we are. I would strongly encourage the messengers who are elected from our churches to support this budget. It is fair in its distribution of funds and a great deal of planning and prayer went into its preparation. The Southern Baptist Convention allocation was reduced to meet two critical areas of concern, pastoral aid and annuities.

In personnel action, the Board promoted three convention employees. Brenda Forlines, an associate in the Mission Ministries Department, was selected as director of the newly created Community and Migrant Ministries Department. Steve Baumgardner, Director of the Accounting Department was named Director of the Business Services Division. Baumgardner succeeds Richard C. Broome, who will retire December 31, 1992. Scott Holt, an accountant with the State Convention, will replace Baumgardner as Director of the Accounting Department. The Board also approved the position of Director of the Cooperative Program. This position will be filled in May 1993.

I would like to say a word about Baptist response to Hurricane Andrew. More than 3,600 Southern Baptist volunteers, from 19 states, have traveled to the Miami area since the hurricane struck on August 24th. Many of the first volunteers prepared and served 80,000 meals a day to victims of the hurricane. John Sullivan, Executive Director of the Florida Baptist Convention, said, "we will be in South Florida until the job is completed." We all need to pray and give sacrificially to the relief effort, but for the grace of God it could have been us. It is gratifying to see volunteers from the Dakotas and Montana working in South Florida. Norm Wagoner from the Dakota Fellowship said, "we appreciate Florida, they have given so much to us over the years. We are just glad we can be here." People also came from South Carolina to help in the cleanup who were victims of Hurricane Hugo.

The State Board of Missions and the Florida Baptist Convention are there to assist you. If you have a problem, feel free to get in touch with them for assistance. If I can be of service to you in any way, I will be happy to do so.

Thanks again for permitting me to serve on the State Board of Missions. It has been a rewarding experience for me and I hope I have been able to contribute to some extent to its success.

Discipleship Training

Discipleship Training is crucial to the churches in growing disciples and developing believers. The Associational discipleship training program has the responsibility of helping each church to organize, improve and enlarge its program of discipleship development.

This year's theme is **DiscipleALL: Discipleship Training for all Members**. Curriculum and special interest studies will focus on helping members to realize the importance of their own discipleship and leadership development.

Attendance at "M" Night, 1991 was 170 - statewide attendance was 5,742. This year "M" Night will be November 23 at Madison First.

An Associational Discipleship Training Leadership School was held February 24-25 at Greenville Baptist Church. Attendance was 74 with 8 of our churches represented and three churches from neighboring associations.

Our Association had no one participating in the Children's Bible Drill or Youth Bible Drill or Speakers' Tournament. Churches are asked to prayerfully consider what our Lord would have us do in 1993 with Bible Drills. The purpose of Bible Drills is to help children and youth increase in knowledge of the Bible, develop skills in effectively handling the Bible, and begin developing memory skills. Participating also helps gain poise and confidence as they respond to drill calls with speed and accuracy.

In the first six months of 1991-92 church year a total of 2,101 churches in Florida requested 51,488 awards in the church study course system. Figures for our Association will not be available until the end of September. Again this year three special awards will be presented from the state Discipleship Training Department at "M" Night. These awards will go to the churches with (1) the largest total number of study course awards, (2) the largest number of awards in Discipleship Training Leadership, and (3) the largest percentage of total awards compared to resident membership. Our Association helped Florida gain recognition in Baptist Doctrine Study and Discipleship Training Leadership awards all over the Southern Baptist Convention over the past few years.

Of the 29 churches in the Middle Florida Association 23 reported discipleship training this year.

THANKS for the privilege of serving as your Discipleship Training Director.

We must recognize that the funds made available to us are Cooperative Program funds and could and would be used in other areas of work were they not allocated to us.

This help is on a year to year basis. We will be evaluated each year before any help is given.

Stewardship

Bountiful Giving

"Make up...your bounty;" give "as a matter of bounty, and not as of covetousness." (2 Corinthians 9:5)

Bounty may not be a common word in our vocabulary, and the way we would use the term bounty would be quite different from the way Paul used it in 2 Corinthians 9:5-6. For Paul, bounty meant **"giving generously."**

Paul urged the Corinthians to give of their financial resources to help the needy Christians in Jerusalem.

The word bounty originally meant **"praise."** It then gained the meaning of **"blessing"** a **"gift"** not only of words but material things. Bounty therefore, is a good description for the offering which would bless the Christians in Jerusalem and cause them to praise God.

Paul's point is that we are to give to bless others and to be a blessing for God. It was in this context that he urged the Corinthians to contribute to the collection for Jerusalem. He said, *"Make up...your bounty;" give "as a matter of bounty (blessing), and not as covetousness"* (2 Cor. 9:5). In other words: Do not give in order to get.

Some among the Corinthians might have feared that their generosity in this offering would lead to their own poverty. Instead, generous giving would lead to their enrichment. This principle of giving (sowing and reaping, 2 Corinthians 9:6) is true today.

Some classic biblical examples of bountiful giving are the poor widow who gave her all; Zacchaeus who gave half of his wealth away; Barnabas who sold his land and gave all the money to the Apostles for distribution as needs dictated; and the Macedonians who gave out of their extreme poverty.

We are to be bountiful givers. We have a bounty to give which assures that our churches will continue to share the gospel with a lost world through its planned ministries. We acknowledge God's ownership and our stewardship through our bountiful giving.

Remember, when we cease to be good stewards of our material blessings that God has bestowed upon us, then it may be that Satan has dealt us a near death blow. Do not be guilty of withholding from God, for He never withheld from you.

Stewardship: Managing correctly that which God has entrusted you with.

Annuity

While the economy has been very sluggish and interest rates have gone down invested retirement funds through our Southern Baptist Annuity Program continues to do very well, in fact well above the average, or, about 7.50 to 8.50 percent in the fixed fund.

I want to call upon all churches and pastors to take close look at the pastor retirement account. Please note the following: At the age of 30, the pastor and the church begin contributing through the Expanded Plan the amount of \$105.00 a month into the pastor's retirement account, then the State Convention contributes matching funds in the amount of \$35.00 a month and assuming an 8% earning rate, the pastor's account would grow to \$282,000 by age 65. This would give the pastor and spouse \$28,000 annually for the rest of his life. Naturally, if you contribute more your retirement income would be more. If, however, you wait until you are 42 years of age to begin the same contribution your retirement benefit would only be \$8,900 annually.

Has the church or pastor ever considered that eleven out of twelve wives will be widows? Pastors, churches, if you do not provide retirement for your pastor, think what that means for their future.

Many of our churches do participate, however, some do not. Every church needs to be sure their pastor and family is supported through the Expanded Annuity Plan of the Southern Baptist Convention.

One other consideration: Pastors are considered in the group of the most unhealthy people and tend to live shorter lives. There are death benefits for the family left behind should the unexpected happen. Look at the following table:

Concord Baptist Church

Concord Missionary Baptist Church was constituted on June 20, 1841. Charter members were Joshua W. P. McCall, William T. Johnson, Richard J. Mays, Mary McCall, Elizabeth Johnston, Harriet Johnston and Elizabeth A. Mays, white; Elbert, Phillis, Marmadore, April, Marshall and Nancy, black members.

Concord had a part in organizing the Florida Baptist Association in 1843. Brother R. J. Mays and Brother J. N. P. McCall were delegates. Brother R. J. Mays bought the twenty acres of land where Concord is located from the government August 23, 1847. The minutes for February 1848 tells of the church taking a subscription list to pay for the New Meeting House.

November 20, 1854 the Florida Baptist Association, West Florida Association and Alachua Association met at Concord to organize the Florida Baptist Convention (meeting held at Brother R. J. Mays home, the Clifton Mansion). Brother R. J. Mays was elected the first president of the convention.

In 1870, the black members took their letters out of Concord to organize New Canaan Baptist Church.

In 1870 Concord joined the Old Mercer Baptist Association, then in 1874 the New Mercer Baptist Association was organized, which Concord joined. Concord remained with the New Mercer until 1878, then went back to the Florida Baptist Association. In 1882 Concord went to the New Mercer Baptist Association. Concord went to the Florida Baptist Association in 1900. In 1907 Concord went to the New Mercer Baptist Association and stayed until 1990-1991. Concord joined Middle Florida Baptist Association (Note: Late 1930's or early 1940's Concord had voted to join the Middle Florida Baptist Association, but failed to get a letter of dismissal from Mercer Baptist Association).

The present Church Building was built about 1885-1887.

Concord celebrated one hundred years June 15, 1941. Brother Edwin B. Browning, Sr., moderator of the Middle Florida Baptist Association was asked to assist in preparing and executing the celebration.

In 1952 Concord started having preaching two Sundays a month, Brother William T. Cain, pastor. Also Sunday School rooms were started. In 1955 Concord started having preaching every Sunday, Brother Billy Southerland, pastor. (Note: Training Union had more in attendance than did the Sunday School for several years). Concord built the Fellowship Hall or Education Building in 1958-59. In 1971 Concord bought a House Trailer for the pastor to stay in on weekends, pastor was Brother George Dodd.

Concord joined the Middle Florida Baptist Association in 1990.

Concord celebrated one hundred fifty years in June 1991. Brother Carlton Owens, Director of Missions, Middle Florida Baptist Association and Brother Glen Owens, Assistant Executive Director, Florida Baptist Convention were present to help with the celebration.
