54. There were 145 messengers and visitors registered which included nineteen (19) pastors. Twenty-five churches were represented.

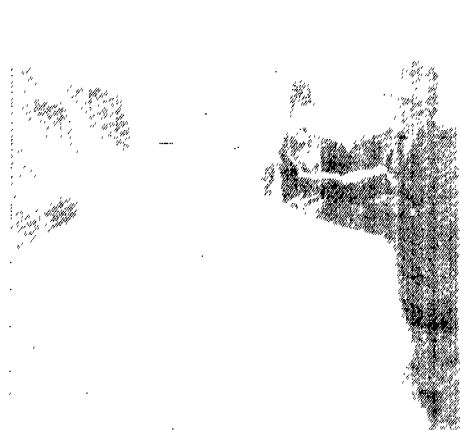

Sunday School Report

The 1994-95 Sunday School year in Middle Florida Association began with a Training School, led by state special workers and your ASSISTeam. Forty-nine leaders from twelve churches received motivation and training for the new year.

Winter Bible Study was conducted in churches.

Mozeta Buchanan, VBS ASSISTeam member, and Brewer Lake hosted our VBS Clinic in April. Sixty-one leaders from fifteen churches participated.

Ten churches were represented in the Sunday School Directors' Conference of the Key Leader Workshop in August. These folks will be working on goals and challenges for 1995-96.

Good things are happening in Sunday schools. Our total Sunday School enrollment as of September 30, 1995, was 2445; Study Course credits were awarded to individuals in churches.

Twenty churches reported VBS, with an enrollment of 1647.

Your ASSISTeam has contacted all pastors or Sunday school directors during the year to discover needs which we can help with. Literature and other helps have been provided as well as personal consultations where requested.

Florida Baptist Convention officially changed the name from Sunday School to

Bible Teaching-Reaching Department. This was done to signal that it is okay for churches to use some other name in place of Sunday School for Bible study if they wish.

The five-year theme Bold Mission Thrust has now ended. The new theme for 1995-2000 will be CARRY THE LIGHT, suggesting we are to carry the light to a darkened world. The 1995-96 emphasis is CARRY THE LIGHT: LIVE GOD'S WORD, which includes focus on reaching out to persons who live in spiritual darkness, caring for people through relationships, witnessing to unbelievers, and involving persons in a fellowship of love.

We are recommending a net increase of 9.6% in our associational Sunday School program for 1995-96, or 235 members. Our Associational enrollment goal will be 2680. This means an average per church of 8. Your ASSISTeam is available to help you as you strive to make your Sunday School grow and involve more people in Carrying the Light and Living God's Word.

We look forward to the following projects in 1995-96:

Dr. Mounts told me he deeply appreciated the interest and the attitude of the pastors and their obvious concern for families in the communities in which we live.

There are many resources listed in the Discipleship and Family Development catalog. I am impressed with the new *Right from Wrong* series developed by Josh McDowell and the Sunday School Board. The centerpiece of the study is the book *Right from Wrong — What You Need To Know To Help Youth Make Right Choices*. Also there are workbooks for adults, college students, junior and senior high students and children. A leaders guide is available for each age group. Also available are audio and videotape series.

The *Right from Wrong* series was developed after Josh McDowell did a survey among professing Christian youth and discovered an alarming trend. A large number of youth who profess to be Christians seem to be making the same decisions as non-Christians in the area of substance abuses, sexual immorality, and other moral decisions. McDowell says distinguishing right from wrong based on Biblical principals is obviously becoming increasingly difficult for many youth and adults. Many children and youth especially seem to be abandoning core Christian values. This series tries to impress upon all age groups that God is the ultimate truth, and all of their decisions need to be made comparing the nature of each decision to the very nature of God. The study challenges especially teenagers to develop a life-long habit of making right moral choices.

History of First Baptist Church, Madison, 1835-1995

Florida, 160 years ago, was still a territory. Andrew Jackson was President of the United States and John H. Eaton was Territorial Governor of Florida. Madison was three years away from becoming a formally constituted community.

It is thought that the church may have begun as early as 1832 in unorganized services, however, by 1835, the First Baptist Church of Madison, known then as Hickstown Baptist Church, had been organized and duly constituted. The formation of the church was led by Alexander Mosley, R. J. Mayes, and a group of stalwart and devoted Missionary Baptists. The church was located in the San Pedro Section of southwest Madison County, the county seat at the time. The name Hickstown came from a Mikascuki Indian chief, driven out of Leon County by General Andrew Jackson to the area we still know as Hickstown. The chief, known by the English name of John Hicks, befriended the settlers and they honored his kindness by naming their church "Hickstown Baptist Church." There is a beautiful legend surrounding those early days. Indians on the war path approached the church and seeing through the windows the settlers kneeling in prayer crept away in respectful silence. Perhaps this was the beginning of the friendship between the kindly chief and the Baptists. A picture of this incident hangs in the vestibule.

The settlers began worshipping in their first formal meeting house in 1840. It was only five years after its inception that the members erected their building right here on Meeting and Base Street.

The Founding Fathers of Madison Courthouse, the official name of Madison, gave a parcel of land to the Methodist, Presbyterian, and Baptist on which to build their houses of worship. The Baptist Church has remained very close to the original location through the years. In 1850 the church became known as the Madison Baptist Church. In 1922 the name

was changed to the First Baptist Church.

This church has been at the heart of several significant steps for Florida Baptists. In 1854 The Florida Baptist Convention was established at Concord Baptist Church led by R. J. Mays, a former member of the church, and first President of the Convention. Other members, W. B. Cooper, B. S. Fuller, and H. Z. Ardis also served as Presidents of the Convention and Madison was the meeting place for the convention in 1866, 1868, 1871, 1876, 1878, 1880, and 1897.

It was at the 1880 session that the State Board of Missions was organized. Six of the church members served on this new board. You will recognize some of the family names: E. D. Beggs, J. O. Harris, S. B. Thomas, John W. Beggs, B. F. Wardlaw, and J. F. B. Mays. The State Board of Missions was located at Madison for 20 years.

According to Dr. Doak S. Campbell's history of the Florida Association in 1903, "The state wide organization of the Women's Missionary Union was formed in Madison.

The physical growth of the church has been one of unfoldment in membership and financial abundance. In 1861 there were 45 members on roll, by 1923, 193. Today there are over 600 members. The budget was \$350 in 1894, in 1923, \$8,798, and today the budget is more than \$150,000.

From the long low hand, hewn buildings with homemade appointments the church has grown even more beautiful and useful. The present sanctuary built in 1956 is most probably the fifth constructed by the congregation. The saving and preserving of the 1898 sanctuary, which was erected under the leadership of Stephen Crockett, has proven to be a wise one. The classic beauty and reverence that surrounds the structure are an inspiration for all. The beautiful old organ with its handpainted pipes done by the beloved pastor, W. G. Stacner, was completely restored in March of 1989.

During its 160 years the church has been served by strong and faithful pastors. The longest pastorate of note was that of H. Z. Ardis, who served for 20 years. He was the grandfather of Mrs. Anna Stanton a well remembered member and organist for the church. Rotation of positions of leadership in the church has unfolded in recent years, but there are some tenures in the early years that are remarkable. Mr. James Hardee served for over 30 years as Chairman of the Board of Deacons. The magnificent stained glass baptismal window was given in his memory by his family. Mr. Van H. Priest served also for more than a quarter of a century in this position as well as 20 years as Sunday School Superintendent. Both W. P. Knight and Lacy Woodard took care of the monies of the church for more than three decades each. Dr. J. J. Conway was church clerk for almost 20 years. Mrs. Juanita Ragans has been at the musical instruments here for 50 years that I remember. Our present pastor, Dr. Roy Saint and his family have served in Madison for going on 7 years.

This church has been instrumental in the establishment of several other churches. In 1841 Concord Church was constituted and lists six charter members who transferred their

membership from Hickstown Church. In 1943 this church "participated in the consummation of the organization in Elizabeth Church, Jefferson County." In 1964 several members went to help establish Faith Baptist Church. In 1986, 55 members of the church formed Fellowship Baptist Church in Madison.

Among the members who have made their commitment for full-time service are: Dr. John G. McCall, 1937; Reverend Norman Cartledge, 1937; Reverend Henry Langford, 1938; Reverend Robert Burnett, 1940; Reverend J. R. Dykes, 1952, Miss Nita Ruth McCullough, Foreign Missionary to Nigeria, 1953; Reverend Kenneth Hudson, 1954, Dr. Earl Davis, 1956; ~~Reverend~~ James W. Browning, 1957; Reverend Lewis Humes, 1980; Reverend John P. Page, 1981; Reverend Terry Humes, 1984; and Bill Webb, 1993. We have been blessed with many of our young people that are serving our Lord in churches all around.

Since 1835 the Lord has richly blessed First Baptist. Our heritage states, and our present ministry proclaims that God is continuing to bless and we pray that we will continue to be a blessing.

History of New Home Baptist Church, Madison, 1921-1995

The Summer of 1921 marked a great event for this Community. Mainly because of the road conditions leading to New Prospect Church, God laid upon the hearts of the people in this community to build a Church in which they could attend more conveniently. Brother Jim Bass and Brother Alex Tuten, Sr. along with the help of Brother Eddie Bass, as a boy of 17, cut the first brush for an arbor on a Friday in 1921. Brother Jim Bass and Brother Alex Tuten, Sr. built the brush arbor on the South side of the Begg's pond to be used as a meeting place for what is now known as New Home Baptist Church. Among the first members to unite by baptism were Dessie Bass, Maggie Lee Devane, and Mr. and Mrs. John Devane.

Reverend J. L. Rutherford was the Pastor until the summer of 1922. By 1923, he had a small eighteen by twenty-six foot building built on an acre of land which was donated by Brother J. Q. Leslie. He organized the Church with twenty-three members. The first deacon was Brother Jim Devane and Sister Lula Bass was the first Treasurer. Dessie Bass Rutherford was the first clerk. Brother Walter Shaw, Brother Eddie and Brother Milledge Bass were the first trustees ever elected. Rev. Willie Barrow was the third paster. In 1928 a Sunday School was organized with Mr. Jim Devane as the First Sunday School Superintendent.

At the close of a revival in 1945 the Church went into a short conference. Rev. C. J. Lewis was serving as pastor and Rev. R. C. Alderman was the visiting evangelist. It was decided upon unanimously to build a new Church. The following committee was appointed: Brother Jim Shaw, Chairman, Brother Sid Bass, and Sister J. Eddie Bass. It was also voted unanimously that the committee be authorized to act for the Church. This Committee gathered a good bit of money and material.

At a conference on January 31, 1947 a new committee was appointed. They were Mr. Johnnie Tuten, Mr. Albert Tuten and Mr. Lucian Floyd. The blocks for the walls were

put up in January of 1947. The floor was poured the twenty-seventh of August, 1947. The roof was put on in May, 1947. Brother Jim Shaw donated the roof.

The first service held in the new building was Sunday School on Sunday afternoon August 31, 1947. Mr. Lucian Floyd was the superintendent and Mr. Jim Shaw was the Adult teacher. The first preaching service was held that Sunday night with Rev. Carl Webb conducting the service. Rev. Alva Horton came at eleven o'clock the following day. This began the first revival service in the new building.

A training union was organized in 1948 with Mrs. Lucian Floyd as director. We had one union with forty-four members.

The foundation for Sunday School rooms was laid in February of 1951. The Church began full-time service in July of 1953. The Sunday School rooms and walks were completed in September of 1953. The porch was added the following October. A Brotherhood was organized March 22, 1954 with Mr. Sim Andrews as President, a W.M.U. and Girls Auxiliary were organized October 3, 1956 with Mrs. J. Eddie Bass as president.

The Royal ambassadors were organized October, 1958.

The Church began its building program under Rev. C. J. Lewis and continued under Rev. Dorman Gay and Rev. Dozier Sapp. The Church with its furnishings as it was, was dedicated to the Lord on May 19, 1957. Rev. D. O. Alderman conducted the dedication service. This began our annual Homecoming Day on the third Sunday of May.

At the close of the Spring revival, April 9, 1961, the Church was to have dinner on the ground. God saw fit to send rain, which laid upon the hearts of the people the need of a kitchen. In the afternoon services the spirit led Brother Sim Andrews to ask for pledges for the kitchen to be constructed. \$223.00 was donated in pledges.

In past years the young people of this Church have enjoyed observing Youth week. A

most out-standing youth week was observed May 14th through the 19th, 1961, closing out with an out-standing Youth Rally, Rev. Eldridge Lyons, Pastor. This Youth Week marked the beginning of Youth Rally.

August 27, 1969 this Church being without a Pastor, entered a called business meeting and the Pulpit Committee recommended Bro. Richard A. Miley of Mississippi as Pastor. He was unanimously elected and accepted the call August 31, 1969.

Homecoming May 17, 1970, Jack Pickles, Philip Howell, and Mickey Tuten were ordained as Deacons. They made a Deacon Board of seven.

The first Bible School held in our Church was June 5 - 9, 1970 with 24 enrolled.

The initial mention of a pastorium for the Church was made in April 1971. The house was to be built on land donated by Mattie L. Leslie and Claude Pickles. Bro. Philip Howell was elected as building fund treasurer. The Church decided to begin work when the building fund reached \$3,000. On November 5, 1972 a ground breaking ceremony was held for the pastorium. Work continued on through the winter, spring and summer - finally on September 7, 1973 an open house was held for the completed project. The pastor and builder Rev. Richard Miley moved in on November 11, 1973. A little over 3 years later the complete mortgage was paid off with a note burning and dedication held on January 25, 1976.

February 1974 found the Church extending their ministry through the use of a bus. Pledges were received in the amount of \$1,157.26, the cost of the bus was \$1,076.26. The bus was instrumental in a large number of youth attending. Many of whom were saved and became active members of the Church. A year later (Feb 75) it was decided to sell the bus in favor of using vans. Several times the ministry was changed from Sunday morning, Sunday evening and Wednesday nights back to just Sunday morning. The Church van was sold in October 1983, thus ending this nine year ministry of New Home Baptist Church. The \$1,500.00 from this sale was placed in the Building Fund.

Mrs. Sarah Tuten resigned as Church clerk after serving for 23 years. The resignation was

accepted with much regret and with highest praise for a job well done. A beautiful Bible was presented to her on May 16, 1976. Efforts to remodel the Church began in the Spring of 1976. Work on the front of the Church, choir loft and baptistry was completed August 7, 1976.

The first Baptismal Service in the Baptistry was held on August 15, 1976. Gilbert, Helen, Rhonda and Retha Richardson were the first to be baptized. Two weeks later John and Asa Pittman. A total of 6 during the first month of use.

The mural for the Baptistry was painted by Wayne Bass and the drapes donated by Mr. & Mrs. Lewis Hames.

Brother Miley resigned effective March 3, 1977. The Sunday school attendance was 100 his last Sunday. Brother John Dorman began as Pastor on April 10, 1977. Sunday school attendance was 102 his first Sunday.

Mrs. Robbie Andrews was commended for her 25 years of faithful service of preparing the communion bread for the Lord's Supper observances in July 1978.

High attendance days have recorded over 100 in attendance several times in Sunday School, but 143 on May 16, 1976 still stands as the record.

The second of our 2 current bells was donated in memory of Mrs. Lula Devane and Mrs. Alice Tuten by Steve and Steven Tuten and accepted by the Church September 12, 1982.

Brother Charles Williams called as pastor January 18, 1986.

A tape ministry was started in March of 1987 with 5 recorders and 5 men helping. Three more tape players were added in April of 1987.

September of 1987 plans for a new fellowship hall were first mentioned - photos, drawings and a building committee began functioning and was still in the planning phase through February 1988. During November of 1987 the front doors and porch of the Church were repaired at a cost of \$500.

It was agreed to receive 2.3 acres of land from Mrs. Mattie L. Leslie to bring our total acreage to five acres. The Church decided to give a love offering of \$500/ an acre. (1988)

The building permits for the fellowship hall were in progress during March 1988, however more detailed plans were required. During October the building committee was appointed: Wayne Bass, Donnie Tuten, chairman and Sim Andrews. By shifting funds from the General Building Fund, \$15,000 was available to begin construction. Members were asked to pledge to subscribe an additional \$15,000. The building was well underway by May of 1988. By July the roof was on and the building ready for wiring and AC/Heat ducts.

On this date, April 24, 1988 the Church was stunned at the death of deacon Eddie Bass. He had served in this capacity approximately 55 years. A special Memorial service was held at the evening worship hour with each deacon giving special remembrances of him. Funeral services were April 25, 1988.

During August the Church was further saddened by the sudden passing of Bunch Tuten, a faithful member all his life.

Brother Charles Williams is leaving as Pastor but will be designated as Associate Pastor to preserve Annuity benefit and membership will also remain here. His last Sunday was May 28, 1989.

Gene Stokes was called as interim pastor to begin serving the first Sunday in July. His family moved their letter on July 7, 1989.

The Church voted to call Brother Gene Stokes as Pastor effective the first Sunday of December 1989. Invitations were sent to Hopewell, Mosely Hall, Sirmans and New Macedonia to participate with us in a Fifth Sunday fellowship service. This has become a highlight of each quarter with great fellowship, inspiration and participation by our sister Churches.

Work on the fellowship hall continued with the septic tank installation. The building was to the point of selecting interior finishes and floor covering during December 1989. By April the fellowship hall had cabinets installed. It was decided to combine Homecoming and the Dedication service for the Fellowship Hall with Brother Williams as speaker in May 1990. During June, tables and chairs for the Fellowship Hall were ordered (15 tables and 120 chairs).

Mrs. Alva Lee Walker Smith blessed our Church greatly through her Last Will and Testament, by a generous bequest in excess of \$11,000. to the Church's building fund. In keeping with the request of family members, a steeple will be placed on the Church in her memory and to the glory of Our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

David Floyd was called as Music & Youth Director effective October 1992.

January 10, 1993 a building committee consisting of Judy Blanton, Wayne Bass, Darrell Tuten, Linda Howell, Geri Bucher, Sylvia Cruce was selected.

The re-roofing project was undertaken July 23 and 24, 1993. It was accomplished by the men and volunteers from Greenville Baptist Church.

Mention of insulating the Church was first made here and was accomplished at the cost of material on approval in July 1993 through the generosity of Arthur Worley and crew furnishing the labor.

Item 2 of the priority list was approved with plans for accomplishment. It was decided to begin work on these plans January 17, 1994 and work continued with old partitions renovated; wiring roughed in, paneling chosen for room walls (March 1994) and floor covering as well. Project was substantially completed in May 1994.

Many mission causes have been supported by our Church: Honduras, Disaster relief efforts in Taylor County, Ecuador, North Carolina, Jamaica, Mexico and now supporting Charis Williams on a monthly basis in the Philippines (2 year consultant November 1993 - November 1995).

On August 6th the old fellowship hall mysteriously burned and was a total loss. Insurance coverage amounted to \$4,500. The building committee is now beginning plans for implementing item 3 on the priority list - Vestibule/Steeple. Plans will be submitted in early 1995.

Thanks be unto our Lord and Savior for his Grace and Mercy, as well as, his bounteous blessings upon the people here at New Home. To Him be all the honor and praise for the continuity and progress of His Church.
