# Constitution of the Middle Florida Baptist Association

## ARTICLE I - NAME

This body shall be known as the "Middle Florida Baptist Association."

## ARTICLE II - COMPOSITION

**Section 1.** The membership of this Association shall be composed of messengers representing cooperating Southern Baptist Churches, the doctrinal beliefs and practices of which shall conform to those usually accepted by Southern Baptist Churches and to those contained in the *Baptist Faith and Message* adopted by the Southern Baptist Convention in 1963.

**Section 2.** This Association reserves the right to reject, in accord with Article II, Section 2 and 3 of the Bylaws, messengers from any church which shows itself to be unorthodox in faith or practice, or which willfully and persistently creates discord by refusing to comply with the spirit of this constitution.

**Section 3.** This Association may receive churches into its affiliation in accord with Article II, Section 4 of the Bylaws of the Association.

**Section 4.** Any church may withdraw from affiliation with the Association in accord with Article II, Section 5 of the Bylaws of the Association.

## ARTICLE III - OBJECTIVE

**Section 1.** The objective of this Association shall be to promote harmonious activity in carrying out the Great Commission of our Lord within the programs, agencies, and institutions of the Florida Baptist Convention and the Southern Baptist Convention.

**Section 2.** This body shall exercise no legislative or judicial authority over any church. It shall, however, offer fraternal counsel to any church requesting such assistance.

## ARTICLE IV - OFFICERS

**Section 1.** The general officers of this Association shall be a Director of Missions when employed by the Association, Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer.

**Section 2.** The duties of these general officers shall be described and defined in Article IV of the Bylaws of this Association.

**Section 3.** Election of these officers, except the Director of Missions, shall be annually. Such election and terms of service shall be in accord with Article III of the Bylaws of this Association.

## ARTICLE V - COMMITTEES

**Section 1.** There shall be an Executive Committee of the Association which shall be responsible for conducting the business of the Association between the regular meeting of the Association.

**Section 2.** The Executive Committee shall be composed of the pastor of each church, one other member elected annually by his church, the Associational officers listed in Article IV, Section 1, the Director of Missions, the Directors of each organization of the Association and Chairperson of all standing committees. It shall function in accord with Article VI, Section 1 of the Bylaws of the Association.

**Section 3.** All standing and special committees shall be authorized by the Association and shall be subject to the ratification and revision by the messengers in the annual session or by the Executive Committee.

**Section 4.** These committees shall function in accord with Article VI of the Bylaws of this Association.

## **ARTICLE VI - ANNUAL REPORTS**

**Section 1.** The churches affiliated with this Association shall furnish annually to this body the information requested by the uniform church letter to the Association.

**Section 2.** The Director of Missions, Clerk of the Association, and any person authorized to act as agent for the Association shall submit an annual report to the Association, setting forth such facts about his work as will clearly indicate the activity of the employee or agent.

## **ARTICLE VII - MEETINGS**

**Section 1.** The Association shall meet annually in October at such time and place as it may have selected at the preceding fall meeting. The purpose of this meeting shall be to dispense with matters of business related to the Association, to receive reports and recommendations from state convention agencies and associational organizations, committees and staff.

**Section 2.** The Association shall also meet in a one-session Semiannual meeting the second week in April at such place as it may have selected at the preceding fall meeting. The purpose of this meeting shall be primarily for inspiration, for electing officers for the ensuing denominational year, and for any other business deemed necessary by the Association.

**Section 3.** The Moderator, in consultation with the Executive Committee, may call special meetings of the Association and, in consultation with the Committee on Time, Place, and Preacher, make necessary changes in date or place of the annual and semiannual meetings. In such cases, the Clerk shall notify the churches in writing of the time and purpose of special meetings and of the reasons for changes at least two Sundays prior to the meeting.

## **ARTICLE VIII - CHANGE OF CONSTITUTION**

This constitution may be amended at the final session of any regular meeting of the Association by a two-thirds majority of messengers present and voting, provided that notice of such change shall have been presented to the Executive Committee at least 30 days prior to the Associational meeting and that such notice be given to the Association at the first session of such meeting.

## **ARTICLE IX**

This constitution shall become effective upon the favorable vote of two-thirds of those present and voting at the final session of the Associational Meeting October 20, 1981, providing that written notice shall have been made to all churches, at least thirty (30) days prior to the meeting.

# Bylaws

## of the Middle Florida Baptist Association

### ARTICLE I - RULES OF DECORUM

**Section 1.** Each session of the general Association Meeting shall be opened and closed with prayer.

**Section 2.** This body shall use *Robert's Rules of Order Revised* as its guide for business procedure.

**Section 3.** At the beginning of each general meeting of this body and the Executive Committee, the Moderator may appoint a parliamentarian who shall give guidance regarding parliamentary procedure.

### ARTICLE II - MEMBERSHIP

**Section 1.** Each cooperating church shall be entitled to four messengers, of whom one shall be the Pastor, and one additional messenger for each 50 members or fraction thereof. However, no church shall be entitled to more than 10 messengers.

**Section 2.** If any church shall fail to have messengers present at any four consecutive general associational meetings (exclusive of meetings of organizations) (two years), a Credentials Committee shall be appointed by the Moderator to inquire into the state and intentions of the church. This committee shall make recommendations to the Association regarding the church.

**Section 3.** The Association reserves the right to reject messengers from any church which is not in accord with the doctrines, policies, and practices of the Association. Prior to such rejection, the Moderator shall appoint a Credentials Committee to inquire into the state and intentions of the church. This committee shall make recommendations to the Association, in a regular or called meeting regarding the church.

**Section 4.** Any church desiring affiliation with this body shall petition the As-

sociation in writing on a form approved by the Executive Committee no later than 45 days prior to the October meeting.

The Moderator shall thereupon appoint a Petitionary Letter Committee which shall receive the petition, confer with the petitioning church, and report their recommendation to the Association at the October meeting.

A church, which as a mission was under the sponsorship of an affiliated church, may be accepted at the October meeting in which recommendation was made. Others shall come under the watchcare of the Association for at least one year before being presented for affiliation. The Credential Committee, Moderator, and Director of Missions shall offer assistance and guidance during the watchcare period.

Churches under watchcare shall have all privileges except voting.

**Section 5.** Any messenger may be refused membership in the Association upon recommendation of the Executive Committee and upon a two-thirds vote of the messengers present and voting, at the annual meeting of the Association, for any of the following reasons:

- (1) Any member church willfully and/or habitually performing such practices as may be out of harmony with the doctrines and principles of the cooperating churches of the Association.
- (2) Any member church failing to give some financial expression of its desire to participate in our World Missions Program for a period of three consecutive years.
- (3) Any member church failing to present a church letter to the Association for three consecutive years.

Any church which feels that it cannot continue to cooperate in the fellowship and activities of the Association may dis-

continue its membership by written notice.

Churches desiring to transfer membership to another like Association and desiring a letter of recommendation should present in writing a notice of such intention at least thirty (30) days prior to the annual meeting of Middle Florida Association.

### **ARTICLE III - ELECTION OF OFFICERS**

**Section 1.** The Association shall, as it deems wise and appropriate, employ a Director of Missions as a salaried worker. This person shall be a general officer of the Association and an ex officio member of all associational committees.

In the event of a vacancy in this position, the Moderator shall appoint a Director of Missions Search Committee, who shall prayerfully seek out and present to the Executive Committee for approval, the person for the position. The Director of Missions Search Committee shall function in accord with Article VI, Section 7 (2) of these Bylaws.

**Section 2.** The general officers, except the Director of Missions, shall be selected by the Nominating Committee and presented for election at the April meeting of the Association. Nominations from the floor shall be received for these positions, if there be such. Those officers thus elected by the Association shall begin their terms of service at the close of the October meeting of the Association following their election. Should the Moderator-elect be unable to assume office at the October meeting, the Vice-Moderator shall become Moderator and a new Vice-Moderator elected at the October meeting in the manner described above. In the absence of the Moderator for any reason, the Vice-Moderator shall assume those duties. The Moderator and Vice-Moderator may be eligible to succeed himself only once.

**Section 3.** In addition to those general officers, the Associational Nominat-

ing Committee shall present for election at the April meeting the following directors and their associates: Sunday School, Discipleship Training and Family Life, Woman's Missionary Union, Brotherhood, Music, Pastoral Ministries, Evangelism, and Stewardship. Each of these directors may enlist additional organizational leadership as needed and provided for within their organizational setup.

**Section 4.** Vacancies in all positions, except the Director of Missions, occurring between the October and April meetings of the Association shall be filled by the Nominating Committee working in conjunction with the Executive Committee.

**Section 5.** No more than two persons from any church shall be permitted to hold positions as general officers and/or organization directors in this Association simultaneously. No person shall serve simultaneously on two standing committees or as a general officer and an organizational director. This provision excludes those who are serving in places of responsibility at the time of the adoption of these Bylaws, and shall become effective as these persons shall terminate their services.

### **ARTICLE IV - DUTIES OF OFFICERS**

**Section 1.** The Director of Missions shall be available to the churches of the Middle Florida Association, limited only by his time and schedule, in the following capacities:

- (1) Associational Promotion - He shall promote the activities of the Middle Florida Association on invitation from the local churches.
- (2) Teaching and Preaching - He may be available to the local church for:
  - A. Teaching in church study courses, January Bible Study; Studies for Pastors; Sunday School; Discipleship Training; Woman's Missionary Union; Brotherhood and Music Departments.

B. Pulpit supply, not to exceed two (2) consecutive Sundays, for which he may be remunerated by the local church.

C. Revivals

(3) Conferences and Counseling - He shall be available for some conferences and counseling as follows:

A. With pulpit committees (at their request)

B. With pastors

C. With others as needed and requested

(4) Materials and Equipment - He will be responsible for storing, maintaining and making available audio visual aids, tracts, brochures, etc. as may be needed and requested.

(5) Special Services - He may be available for ordinations, dedications, etc., upon invitation by the local church.

With regards to missions and denominational activities, the Director of Missions shall:

(1) Promote the denominational program; keep before the people and the churches the World Mission Program of Southern Baptists; promote the Cooperative Program.

(2) Assist in locating new missions sites and lend help in starting new missions.

(3) Lead in the promotion and planning of simultaneous efforts such as World Missions Conferences, Evangelism Campaigns, Stewardship Revivals, Forward Program of Church Finance Clinics.

(4) Keep denominational leadership posted on changes in associational, organization and church leadership.

The Director of Missions shall:

(1) Have general supervision of the association office and shall supervise any secretarial work in the office.

(2) Work with all associational department directors in the planning and promotion of their work and in coordination with calendar of activities.

(3) Work with all associational commit-

tees in their area of assigned responsibilities.

(4) It shall be the responsibility of the Director of Missions to promote special days and emphasize conventions and other denominational meetings to the Association, to inform the *Baptist Witness* and other news media of items in the Association. He shall endeavor to visit all the churches during a church function at least once a year in order to maintain and promote the associational program, and shall do all within his power to promote unity, goodwill and cooperation among churches, pastors and church leaders.

(5) The Director shall serve for an indefinite term at the pleasure of the Director and Association.

(6) Termination.

a. When the Director desires to terminate the relationship he shall give written notice to the Association, through the Executive Committee at least 30 days prior to the end of his service.

b. Should the Association wish to terminate the relationship the following procedures shall be followed:

1. Interested parties shall bring their views to the attention of the Executive Committee.

2. The Executive Committee shall meet and counsel with the Director and if they deem it appropriate, bring a recommendation to the Association at a special meeting called in accordance with the Bylaws of the Association.

3. Any vote to terminate must pass by 3/4 majority vote of those present and voting with a minimum of 50 percent of the churches of the Association represented at the special called meeting.

4. The Director shall be granted

30 days severance pay.

### **Section 2. The Moderator**

- (1) The Moderator shall preside at all general meetings of the Association.
- (2) He shall appoint all committees not otherwise provided for.
- (3) He shall serve as chairman of the Executive Committee and shall submit a written report of the work of this committee to the October meeting of the Association.
- (4) He shall serve as chairman of the Program Committee.
- (5) He shall be an ex officio member of all association committees.

### **Section 3. The Vice-Moderator**

- (1) The Vice-Moderator shall assist the Moderator and shall preside in his absence or at his request.
- (2) He shall serve as Vice-Chairman of the Executive Committee.
- (3) He shall serve as chairman of the Committee on Committees.
- (4) He shall serve as chairman of the Administrative Committee.

### **Section 4. The Clerk**

- (1) The Clerk shall make, correct, and supervise the printing and distribution of the minutes of the Association and shall serve as secretary of the Executive Committee.
- (2) He/she shall be responsible for all associational correspondence.
- (3) He/she shall notify in writing, immediately upon their election or appointment, all persons elected to the office or appointed to committees.

### **Section 5. The Treasurer**

- (1) The Treasurer shall have charge of all funds and hold title, as Trustee to all properties of this Association, subject to the order of this body.
- (2) He shall disburse funds as directed by this body or its Executive Committee, or as directed by the donors, and shall make an annual report of all receipts and expenditures, and such other reports as may be requested by the Executive Commit-

tee.

- (3) The Treasurer shall provide information and assistance as needed in the formation of the annual budget.

### **Section 6. Other Officers**

- (1) The officers of the various organizations of the Association shall perform the functions usual to their office, following the plans outlined in their respective denominational publications.
- (2) The director of each organization shall present a written report to the Executive Committee and a written annual report to the Association at the October meeting.
- (3) The Music Director shall represent the church music program on the Associational Council; report on work of the associational music programs to the Association; lead in enlisting and training associational music officers; counsel with church leaders on administering their music programs; lead in providing music personnel for the annual business sessions of the Association and other general types of associational meetings; and provide inspiration, training, and information to assist local church leaders in planning, conducting, enlarging, and improving their music programs.
- (4) The Stewardship Director shall seek to expand:
  - A. Church leadership's understanding of biblical stewardship;
  - B. Understanding and use of the proposed church stewardship organization;
  - C. Knowledge of church leaders related to available stewardship materials;
  - D. Church participation in stewardship activity based on available material. He will seek to create an atmosphere of importance and urgency for the entire subject of stewardship. He will serve as THE responsible person in the



Association for developing Christian stewards. He will encourage a wholesome, positive attitude toward stewardship, mission support, and the Foundation and Annuity programs.

- (5) The Evangelism Director shall promote a concern for winning the lost throughout all churches by working with pastors, Sunday School directors, and outreach leaders. He will, with resources available, assist church leaders in understanding and building Spiritual foundations for Evangelism and helping in developing practical skills for practical witnessing. He will plan and conduct programs designed to inform Baptists about evangelistic opportunities and to inspire in them zeal for this task. He shall cooperate with departments of evangelism of the Florida Baptist Convention and the North American Mission Board of the SBC in promoting evangelism in the churches of the Association. He shall provide and interpret information and inspiration regarding evangelism through appropriate conferences and rallies.
- (6) All organizational directors shall be nominated by the Nominating Committee to the Executive Committee for their consideration, approval and endorsement at the Semiannual meeting.
- (7) All organizational directors shall submit their respective budget requests to the Administrative Committee no later than July 1 of each year for inclusion in the proposed budget for the ensuing church year to be presented to the Executive Committee.

## **ARTICLE V - PERSONNEL POLICIES**

### **Section 1. Vacation**

First through fifth year - two weeks per calendar year

Sixth and thereafter - three weeks per

calendar year

Vacation may not be carried over from one calendar year to another without the prior approval of the Association upon recommendation of the Executive Committee.

### **Section 2. Sick Leave**

Sick leave shall accrue at the rate of one normal workday per month to a maximum of 52 days. Sick Leave shall be used for employee and immediate family.

### **Section 3. Compensation**

As set forth in the current budget. When speaking in the churches on behalf of the Association, no honorarium should be expected (Except for pulpit supply - See Article IV, Section 2b).

**Section 4. Work outside the Association**

Three weeks for conferences and conventions

Two weeks for revivals and/or campaigns

**Section 5. Employees on less than a full-time basis shall receive these benefits on a pro-rata basis.**

## **ARTICLE VI - DUTIES OF COMMITTEES**

### **Section 1. Executive Committee**

- (1) The Executive Committee shall transact all business of the Association between the regular meetings of the Association.
- (2) It shall meet regularly the first week of even months.
- (3) It shall meet in special session as the Associational Council and Moderator may deem necessary providing the members of the committee shall have been notified at least one week in advance.

### **Section 2. Committee on Committees**

The Committee on Committees shall be appointed by the Moderator at the October meeting of the Association. They shall recommend at the Semiannual (April) Meeting the names of persons who shall serve on the standing committees of the

Association for the ensuing associational year.

### **Section 3. Membership**

Membership on each of the standing committees excluding the Executive Committee shall be on a rotating basis, with the terms of one-third of the members expiring each year, after the respective members have served for three years.

### **Section 4. Standing Committees**

(1) The Nominating Committee shall be composed of three members and shall seek out and recommend persons to serve as general officers and as organization directors of the Association in accord with Article III, Sections 2-5 of these Bylaws. It shall also, recommend to the Association, which shall convey such recommendations to the Florida Baptist Convention Board of Missions, a person to serve on the Board when a vacancy occurs.

(2) The Administrative Committee shall be composed of five members with the Vice-Moderator being one and serving as chairman. This committee shall give administrative oversight to the staff of the Association in matters of personnel, office, and financial administration, and to make recommendations concerning changes in the Constitution and Bylaws. To accomplish this purpose, the Administrative Committee shall:

A. serve as the Personnel Committee of the Association, and as such shall:

a. recommend for employment and dismissal all associational personnel other than the Director of Missions, following guidelines approved by the Executive Committee;

b. recommend to the Executive Committee staff personnel policies, salary, benefit schedules, and job descriptions, and shall be available to counsel with staff members when nec-

essary;

B. serve as Finance Committee of the Association, and as such shall:

a. work with the Treasurer in setting policies for handling and disbursing funds and reviewing the financial status of the Association;

b. prepare the budget to recommend to the Executive Committee and the Association each year based upon the needs and requests of the various organizations and programs and the ability of the churches to provide. (The proposed budget shall be presented to the Executive Committee for review and approval at its August meeting. It shall then be presented to the Association for adoption at the October meeting for the ensuing church year.)

C. act as needed for and on behalf of the Executive Committee between meetings of the Executive Committee. When meeting in an emergency situation at the call of the Moderator or Vice-Moderator a quorum of at least four members present shall be required. Such emergency action will come before the Executive Committee for approval. The Moderator or Vice-Moderator must be present;

D. serve to enlist and coordinate volunteer office assistance as needed;

E. make an annual review of the Constitution and Bylaws, and review all requests for changes to such.

(3) The Missions Committee shall be composed of five members and shall provide and interpret information on mission needs in the associational territory to the churches in the Association. It shall train church mis-

sions committees for their work and assist the churches and associational organizations to conduct mission work and when necessary, it shall conduct mission work not being done.

- (4) The Youth Activities Committee shall be composed of three members who shall plan and implement associational activities designed to promote inspiration, harmony, and cooperation among the children and youth of the churches.
- (5) The United Christian Action Committee shall be composed of three members, which shall aggressively oppose the evils of alcohol, pornographic literature, gambling, the illicit use of drugs, and similar problems that have a detrimental effect upon society. This committee shall promote legislation and law enforcement related thereto. It shall make full use of all resources available to it through appropriate organizations.
- (6) The Program Committee shall consist of the Association Council. They shall plan, promote and publish the programs for the Semiannual and Annual Meetings in conjunction with Section 6, Paragraphs 1.2.3 and 4.
- (7) The Camp Committee shall be composed of five members and have the power to organize itself. This committee will make recommendations regarding age group camps for children and/or youth. The Camp Committee shall be responsible for prayerfully planning, staffing, promoting, evaluating and fiscal accounting through the Associational office for the camp(s) each year. This committee shall nominate a Camp Director for each camp to the Executive Committee for their consideration, approval and endorsement by their August meeting. Should a vacancy occur, the committee shall recommend to the Executive Committee a replacement. Upon approval

of the Executive Committee the Camp Director(s) shall serve as an ex-officio member of the Camp Committee. The Camp Director receives policy direction and guidance from the Camp Committee and exercises direct and indirect supervision over teachers, counselors and other camp staff. The duties include:

- A. work in cooperation with the Camp Committee in the planning of program, selecting teaching material and other activities for camp;
- B. work in cooperation with the Camp Committee in enlisting staff for camp activities;
- C. perform other duties in the administration of camp, as assigned by the Camp and/or Executive Committees; and
- D. make the final decision in discipline.

The qualifications for this position include:

- A. being knowledgeable in the Bible;
- B. being willing to give of time and effort;
- C. possessing love and concern for children/youth and their relationships to God;
- D. being able to communicate well with adults, children, and youth.

#### **Section 5. Association Council**

The Association Council shall be composed of the Director of Missions, who shall serve as chairman, the Moderator, the directors of Sunday School, Discipleship Training and Family Life, W.M.U., Brotherhood, and Music, Pastoral Ministries, Evangelism, and Stewardship, as well as the chairs of all standing committees. The Council shall meet as needed. They shall serve as a primary planning group for the associational activities and shall formulate the associational calendar of activities and shall serve as the Program Committee to prepare the program for the April and October general meetings of the Association(in

association with committees of Section 6, Paragraphs 1, 2, 3 and 4).

### **Section 6. Temporary Committees**

The Temporary Committees of the Association shall be appointed by the Moderator at the April Meeting. They shall function in accord with the following guidelines, and shall terminate at the close of the following April meeting.

- (1) The Time, Place and Preacher Committee, composed of three members, shall recommend to the Association dates, places and speakers for the major addresses for the October and April meetings of the Association during the ensuing year.
- (2) The Resolutions Committee, composed of three members, shall receive all resolutions properly introduced in accord with Article 6, Section 3, of these Bylaws and shall bring the Association such other resolutions or recommendations as it may deem appropriate.
- (3) The Memorial Committee, composed of three members, shall lead the Association in a suitable memorial service in honor of all deceased members of the churches affiliated with the Association.
- (4) The Committee on Committees (Article V, Section 2)

### **Section 7. Special Committees**

Special committees shall be appointed by the Moderator with the advice and consent of the Executive Committee, for specific functions as the needs may arise. They shall terminate upon the completion of their duties as herein described.

- (1) The Petitionary Letters Committee composed of five members, shall receive petitionary letters from churches desiring affiliation in the Association. It shall make full investigation to determine if such churches are qualified for affiliation in accord with the Constitution and these Bylaws of the Association. They shall recommend the disposi-

tion of all such petitionary letters. (Note: The petitionary letters should include items such as

- A. Date and result of church vote to request Association membership;
  - B. After watchcare relationship of nine months, a vote reaffirming the desire to be a member should be taken and recorded;
  - C. a statement of intention to participate and cooperate;
  - D. Constitution, Bylaws and Covenant;
  - E. Evidence of cooperation given.)
- (2) The Director of Missions Search Committee, composed of five members, shall seek out and present to the Executive Committee the person to fill the position of Director of Missions when it becomes vacant according to qualifications and descriptions provided in Article IV, Section 1 of these Bylaws.

## **ARTICLE VII - GENERAL**

**Section 1.** No organizations, committee, or officer of this Association shall create an obligation or debt involving associational funds unless duly authorized by the Association or Executive Committee.

**Section 2.** These Bylaws may be amended at any October session by a two-thirds vote of the members present, provided, however, that thirty(30) days advance notice, in writing, stating clearly the proposed change and reason for making same be made to all churches.

**Section 3.** All resolutions shall be submitted in writing, and shall be automatically referred to the Resolutions Committee. All resolutions thus referred shall be reported back to the Association by the committee with recommendations. No resolution shall be presented during the closing meeting of any session of the Association, or at any one session meeting except by the Resolutions Committee.

## ARTICLE VIII - ENABLING CLAUSE

These Bylaws shall become effective upon the favorable vote of two-thirds of those present and voting at the final session of the Associational Meeting Octo-

ber 20, 1981, providing that written notice shall have been made to all churches at least thirty (30) days prior to the meeting.

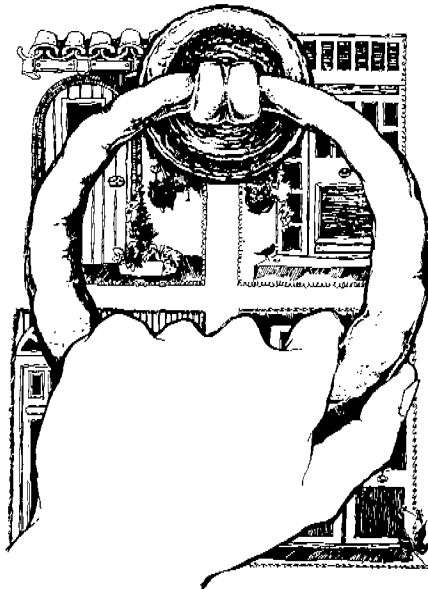

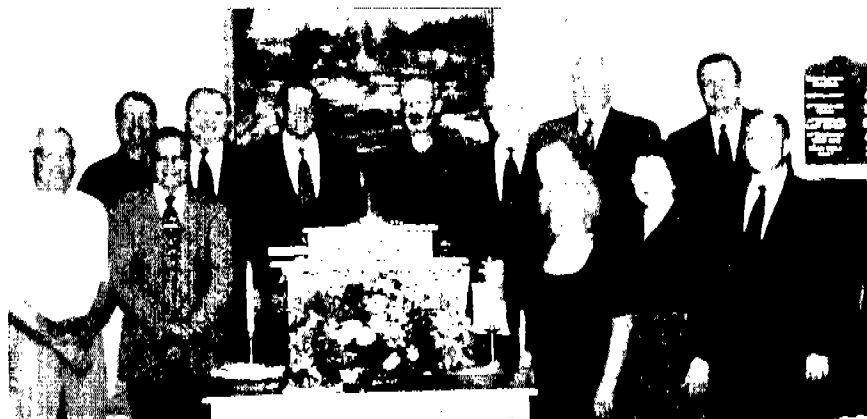

# Discipleship Training

Here are some sobering thoughts concerning the year 2000 and beyond.

- Some shall depart from the faith. I Tim. 4:1 *"Now the Spirit speaketh expressly, that in the latter times some shall depart from the faith, giving heed to seducing spirits, and doctrines of devils;"*
- Some shall deny the faith. I Tim. 5:8 *"But if any provide not for his own, and specially for those of his own house, he hath denied the faith, and is worse than an infidel."*
- Some shall cast off their first faith. I Tim. 5:12 *"Having damnation, because they have cast off their first faith."*
- Some shall be seduced from the faith. I Tim. 6:10 *"For the love of money is the root of all evil: which while some coveted after, they have erred from the faith, and pierced themselves through with many sorrows."* and (I Tim. 4:1)
- Some shall err concerning the faith. I Tim. 6:21 *"Which some professing have erred concerning the faith. Grace be with thee. Amen."*
- Some shall overthrow the faith of others. 2 Tim. 2:18 *"Who concerning the truth have erred, saying that the resurrection is past already; and overthrow the faith of some."*
- Some shall be reprobate concerning the faith. 2 Tim. 3:8 *"Now as Jannes and Jambres withstood Moses, so do these also resist the truth: men of corrupt minds, reprobate concerning the faith."*

The disciple has a transformed life, and this life is attainable by all believers. Paul says in Romans 12:2, *"We are not to allow any part of our life to be molded by the world, we are to be "being changed" into the image of God in Christ."* This is the essence of discipleship.

The greatest need in our churches today is to have our people; especially our

teachers and leaders changing daily into the image of Jesus. It would seem that Jude is our Biblical champion of Discipleship Training. He states in his pointed warning that Christians are to contend for the faith. I love Sunday School and believe it is the evangelistic hub of church life. I also love Discipleship Training and believe with my heart that it is the "spokes" of the "church wheel". A wheel will continue to work with a solid hub and a few weak spokes but with many weak "spokes" the wheel's ability to function is compromised and in the above Bible study we can see that the year 2000 and beyond could be difficult for "wheels" (churches) with weak or missing spokes.

We all like a bottom line, so here it is: for our folks to have a consuming passion to be like Jesus and be transformed into something they could not become on their own, they must become disciples. At some point they must commit to the journey of obedience which will affect their personal value system and behavior, their family and church life and how they interface with the world. Discipleship is at the core of leading our people to be energized to evangelize, to be restored to righteous and abundant living, and to be brought to the place of joyful and meaningful service. Paul says it best in his **magnificent obsession** (Phil. 3:8-12) *"...that I might know Him and the power of His resurrection and the fellowship of His suffering..."*

This last year the meeting formerly known as M Night was attended by the magnificent minority. Several D.T. directors attended the Key Leaders' Workshop held at Faith and were shown how the spokes fit the wheel. As always, I am available for on site consultations and advice on how to do "spoke" repair. Keep on keeping on as kingdom workers and carrying out the Commission of making disciples.

## Pastoral Ministries

Pastoral Ministries is about the greatest need in the church today -LEADERSHIP. Leadership has the ability to see the vision of pastoral ministries become reality. The definition of pastoral ministries concerns the GUIDING, PROTECTING, FEEDING and NOURISHING of a church in order that the church may grow, develop and reproduce itself in the world. Little of this will happen unless there is leadership. Where healthy leadership is present the people are obedient to God. This work is supported by the Pastoral Ministries Department of the Florida Baptist Convention. Stephen Hogan is the Director of Pastoral Ministries, and Bob Bumgarner is the Associate Director.

During the past months, the Pastoral Ministries Department has sought to give leadership development through the following assigned tasks: Pastoral Leadership, Pastoral Care, Staff-Relations/Supervision, Deacons, Church/Denominational Secretaries, Forced Termination, Multi-

Staff, Personal/Professional Development, Summer Youth Ministers, Church Officers/Committees, Religious Education Coordination, Ministers'/Deacon's Wives.

Through these tasks, Pastoral Ministries touches the local church through state events, associational events, and individual consultations.

The information from 29 Annual Church Profiles reveals the following information: 29 churches have Sunday School with an increase of 48 over last year; 23 churches reported Discipleship Training giving a decrease of 29 over last year; Music enrollment decreased by 141 from 29 churches; 20 churches have WMU giving an increase of 95; 15 churches have Brotherhood with a de-

crease of 74; total receipts from 29 churches were \$2,357,350, an increase of \$67,404 over last year; total mission giving was \$372,766, an increase of \$31,328 over last year.

In 1999 our Association reported 156 baptisms, 124 baptisms were reported in 1998. In 1999 our Association reported 6,008 members, last year 6,155 members were reported.

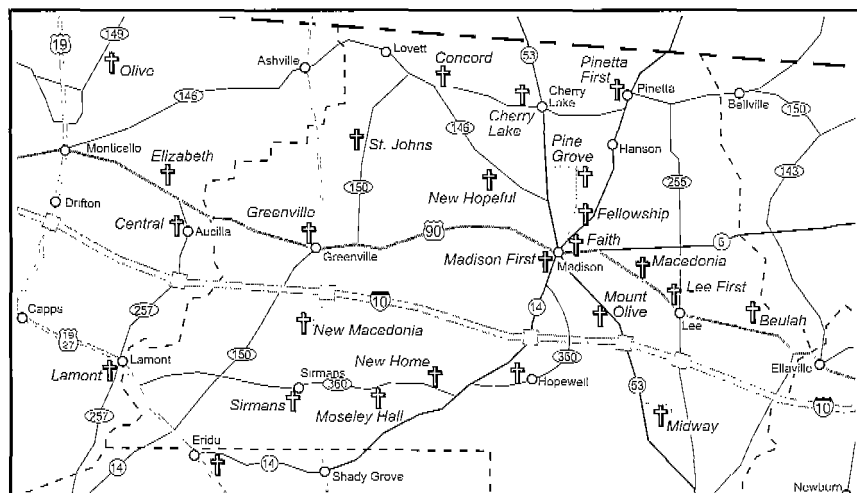
