WEDNESDAY MORNING SESSION

THE Nienty-fourth Session of the Alachua Baptist Association met with the Bushnell Baptist Church October 16th and 17th 1940.

THE Session was called to order by the Moderator, Rev. E. C. Tyner of Inverness, and the opening devotional was led by Rev. E. M. Freer of Dade City, Florida. Rev. W.S. Wade, pastor of the Bushnell church, gave an address of welcome and Rev. Ray Smith of Brooksville responded in behalf of the Messengers. Resume of Associational letters from the churches were read by Rev. J.C. Boatwright and W.S. Wade. Motion was made and carried that Messengers and Members present constitute the Alachua Association.

THE Program arranged by the program committee was adopted. Visitors and new pastors were recognized. It was called to the attention of the Association that Dr. C. M. Brittain could not be present because of illness and the Association united in a special prayer for Dr. Brittain led by R e v. A.B. Martin.

Mrs. Julia Williamson of Inverness gave the report on the Co-operative Program and speaking to the report urged every church support our missionary program. The report adopted.

Superintendent Johns of the Florida Children's Homo was recognized and given an opportunity to speak to the Association. Hr.
Johns gave an interesting review of the work
the boys and girls are doing in our Baptist Children's Home and stressed some of the
immediate needs showing that money invested
in these boys and girls would be of eternal

The report on the Florida Baptist Witness was presented and adopted after discussions by various pastors present urging that the Churches put the Witness in the budget.

WEDNESDAY NIGHT SESSION

THE Evening Services called to order by the Moderator and after the singing of a hymn and prayer, the Associational B.T.U. w i the Mrs. Julia Williamson of Inverness in charge, presented a group of Junior boys and girls in Sword Drill work. Some special musical numbers were also rendered by the group.

THE B.T.U. Nominating Committee read their report and recommendations. The report was adopted and Officers for Associational B.T.U. elected. (Rev. J.C. Boatwright, chairman of the nominating committee) Mr. D.H. McElrath of Wildwood was elected B.T.U. Asso. Director.

B. T. Lamb, Associational S. S. Superintendend, rendered a very encouraging report on the Sunday School work and called attention to some achievements of the past year and expressed the hope that the Association may soon be in the position to employ full time field worker. The report was further discussed by Rev. Ray Smith and Rev. J. C. Boatwright. The Session closed with benediction by the Moderator.

THURSDAY MORNING SESSION

THE Session opened with a congregational Hymn and Mrs. J.H. Hughes led the Devotional.

The report on Christian Education was called for and Prof. J.W.Compton representing Stetson University spoke with reference to the work of Stetson. Mrs. H.S.Cherry gave the report on Hespitals and made some timely remarks on the subject. Mrs. J. L. Green gave a most acceptable report on the Associational W.M.S. The Brotherhood report was read and Rev. Ray Smith speke to the report in the absence of Dr. J. H. Griffin.

After the singing of a Hymn, Rev. Ray Smith preached the Missionary Sermon.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

THE Thursday Afternoon Session opened at 1:30 P. M. with Mrs. J.L.Green leading the Devotion.

The report on the Relief Annuity Board was given by Rev. Ray Smith who also spoke to the report urging all pasters and Churches to accept the opportunity offered them by the Convention. Rev. Carl Howell of Leesburg, and Rev. J. C. Boatwright also spoke to the report which was adopted.

Mrs. W. M. O'Doll of Oxford gave the report on the Hundred Thousand Club and emphasized the importance of this movement and urged individuals, Sunday School classes and W.M.S. Circles, Young People's Unions, and other organizations to enroll in the Club and help Southern Baptists pay their debts. The report was adopted together with the resolutions offered.

Rev. J. T. Rawlins gave the report on Foreign Missions and spoke to the report making an appeal to all the churches to support our entire Missionary program. The report was adopted.

After some discussion, motion provailled that the Associational meeting dates for 1941 be changed to meet November 13, 7:30 PM and to adjourn November 15, Noon, 1941.

Plans were discussed to make a contribution to the Florida Baptist Children's Home for Thanksgiving.

The various committees appointed during the session made their reports.

The Session adjourned with prayer.

(REPORT ON STATE MISSIONS)

A wise and constructive State Mission program is necessary if we faithfully carry out our Lord's command to witness for Him both in Jerusalem and unto the uttermost parts of the earth.

Through our S.S. and B.T.U. Departments we helping to win the lost to Christ, devel o p and train young Christians, organize Sunday Schools, and Training Unions. We encourage Bible Stewardship through our Brotherhoods and W. M. U. departments; and through our Student work seek to win and hold for Christ the large group of boys and girls who have left their Baptist homes to study in our colleges and universities.

We mantain a strong evangelistic work in the State, and until recently employed three full time evangelists, who have held gracious revivals in city, town, and country all over Florida.

We are helping to support 61 missionary pastors as we strive to give the Gospel to the poor. We are aiding in the support of Bro. Willie King who is our missionary to the Indians. The Board is also aiding 45 Churches through its Building and Loan fund.

We make possible the publication of the Florida Baptist Witness by a direct gift of \$6,000.00.

The most notable achievement of Florida Baptists in recent years is the institution of the Ministers' Retirement Plan. Some of our pastors have already retired under the plan. We now have 225 pastors and 279 of Churches enrolled in the plan. Others should enroll without further delay.

(State Mission Report Continued)

Florida Baptists made some advances last year as compared to the year before, giving a total of \$223,846.53 for all causes with \$121,090.80 of this amount going to the cooperative program.

The Board depends on three sources for its income: first, its pro-rata part from the cooperative program funds; second, the special gifts by W.M.S. B.T.U., S. S. and Church Offerings for State Missions during October; third, a donation of \$6,500.00 from the Sunday School Board to help maintain the work of the S. S. and B.T.U. work. All designated funds are sent to the objects for which they are designated without deductions whatsoever.

We recommend that every church take the every-member-canvass and we appeal to the churches to increase their gifts to the cooperative program.

Southern Baptist Mospital Report

During the year our Hospital cared for 13, 723 patients, giving them 71,515 days of service. 1,956 persons were given 9,837 days of free service. The Hospital has complete 14 years of service and for the fourteebth time is able to report no deficit. A new buill ding has recently been completed with enlarged departments. Many of our Missionaries, State workers, and aged ministers, have been treated during the year free of charge. We are carrying out the healing ministry of our Lord through this service.

(Mrs. H.S. Cherry, Chm.)

THE war clouds which have been threatening for several years have burst, sending their downpour of destruction and death upon defenseless populations. But even out of the wreckage and ruin, the Son of Righteousness is rising with healing in His wings.

The Foreign Mission Board now has 4 5 6 Missionaries and 2,900 native workers in the 16 countries in which it is operating.1,683 churches are scattered throughout the semission fields, of which 1,180 are self supporting, and 3,269 outstations. The total membership of these churches is 236, 265. 18,606 were bandized during the past year into these churches.

The indebtedness of the Boatd has rapidly decreased, having been reduced during the past seven years from \$1,110,000 to \$245,000. It is firmly believed that the Board will be out of debt when its one hundredth anniversary is observed in 1945.

Gifts from the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering have been growing larger through the years, the 1939 offering was \$330,424.70. As a result of these gifts scores of Missionaries have been sent, chapels and schools and homes erected, hospitals have been repaired and enlarged.

Thrilling accounts of the progress of the Gospel, the work of Missionaries, in all of our Mission fields cheer our hearts. Although Europe and the Near East are torn and bleeding, as well as China and other parts of the world, our Missionaries are staying with their work and the Lord is blessing the efforts with crowning glory.

Report Relief Annuity

This plan fills a long felt need for a workable retirement plan which could be supported by the ministers and churches. The ministers should be sufficiently interested in their future welfare to cooperate with the plan and the churches should be interested sufficiently in the welfare of the ministry to contribute to a fund which will insure their future financial independence.

The plan provides for contributions from three sources: first, from the ministers who send three per cent of annual salary; second, from the churches they serve the same amount of three percent of annual salary; and third, The State Convention sends two percent of the total salaries of participating members.

We believe this to be a practical plan and that every paster and church in the State should take advantage of the opportunity offered for the security of our ministers.

Report Hundred Thousand Club

It is a great source of joy to all of us that a large portion of our indebtedness has been paid through this club. We appeal to every pastor, S.S. teacher, B.T.U. W.M.U. and all individuals who can to join this club so that Baptists may have the joy of a debtless Denomination by 1945. We are asked to give one dollar per month over and above our regular church pledges and the plan provides for the continuation of our present missionary work while at the same time we are decreasing our Denominational indebtedness.

THE Alachua Association has ten active W.M.S. organizations with a total membership of 281 reported for the past year. All Organizations are working togetheraccording to the State plan for work for the W.M.U. We have 60 subscriptions to the Royal Service Magazine and a program is given from this quaterly each monthin each of the Societies.

A Rally has been held in each district of the Association, quaterly, with a well planned program. Such speakers as Miss Ruth Kersey, Missionary Nurse from Nigeria, Mrs. Emmitt Ayers from China, and Miss Phylis Sokol, a converted Jewess, h a v e brought inspiring accounts of their work and experience to our meetings. Mrs. J. B. Boatwright was guest speaker at a Rally meeting and told of her visit to the Mission fields in Nigeria, and later taught a Mission Study Book, "Give ye them to eat." Miss Mary Wilson and Miss Theo Thomas, our State Field Workers, visited us, and gave helpful suggestions for our work. Mrs.G.H. Morthland, Weirsdale, Divisional President, and Mrs. T.M. Johns have both been he lpful in visiting and instruction.

WE are deeply grateful to our Heavenly Father who has watched over us, and our prayer for the year is that we may find richer and deeper meanings in our W. M. U. watchword: "Laborers together with God."

THERE are 16 Sunday Schools in the Alachua Association, with a total enrollment of 1227 and with one class making the Standard for a period of six months. There were 31 teacher's and Officers Training Schools, three Daily Vacation Bible Schools with an enrollment of 227, average attendance of 166. Sixteen Sunday Schools observed special programs.

This is an improvement over any previous year. The Associational program in February was given by the Children from our Florida Baptist Children's Home, and an offering of approximately \$18.00 was taken.

The Associational S. S. Programs have been patterned after the S.B.C. suggestions and we believe that the work has improved to the extent that a full time field worker would be a great advantage to the work. The Association is working toward this end and it is hoped that it may soon become an accomplished fact.

All but one of the monthly meetings were held during the year, one having been postponed because of rain. Interest in the work is gradually improving, for which we are truly grateful.

our Constitution (continued)

The Executive Committee shall have general, supervision of the work fostered by the Association. It shall meet quarterly and plan for the promotion of various interests of the organized work, using its best efforts to stimulate the spirituality and activity of the churches, and shall make report of its work to the Association in its annual session.

8 The Association shall meet annually at such time and place as may be agreed upon by the body; or, when necessity arises, by the Executive Committee.

- 9. Churches may be admitted to membership in this Association by representatives bearing a potitionary letter with statistical data; provided they are found to be orthodox by a committee appointed by the Moderator. Upon a favorable vote of the body, the Moderator ator shall extend the hand of followship and behalf of the Association.
- 10. The Association shall have the right and the power to withdraw followship from any church in its membership, upon grounds which it may deem justifiable.
- 11 Any church shall have the right to withdraw from the Association upon due notice to the Body.
- 12. Any Church failing to report to the Association, neither sending representatives or letter, twice in succession, shall be dropped from the roll of active members and put on a list of "inactive churches."
- 13. This Constitution may be altered or amended by a two-thirds vote of the body in session.
