MINUTES

OF THE

FLORIDA BAPTIST ASSOCIATION.

G DSDEN COUNTY, FLA., October 16 1874.

The Florida Baptist Association this day convened with the Concord Church, Concord, Florida.

The introductory sermon was preached by Eld. W. W. Bostick, from the first clause of Acts, 4th chap. 16th verse.

After an intermission of one hour the Association met and was called to order by the former Moderator.

Read the letters and enrolled the names of the delegates.

On motion the letters from Mt. Zion and Mt. Beazor were marked. Elected Elder G. W. Hall, Moderator, and W. J. Carroll, Clerk.

· Called for letters. Received letters from Cool Springs and New Macedonia, which were made constituents of this body, and the right hand extended to their delegates by the Moderator.

Correspondents being called for, Eld. K. Chambers, State Evangelist, and Jacob Blount and Joseph Parrot, of the Bowen Association, presented themselves, and were cordially invited to seats with us.

On motion a geneaal invitation to visiting brethren was extended.

On motion, Oak Grove Church that was dropped from the roll last year, was reinstated as a constituent of this body.

On motion, the regular order of business was suspended, and a Committee was appointed consisting of Elders G.W. Bostick and J. B. Langston and Parker Ivey, to inquire into the soundness of the faith of the Mt. Zion Church, which had formerly gone off with the Gibsonites.

On motion, a Committee was appointed, consisting of Eld. W. J. Carroll and brethren James Walker, E. E. Barclay, D. Clark, K. Gatlin, A. Richards and M. McColeman, to decide who was the Mt. Beazor Church, there being two parties each claiming to be Mt Beazor Church.

The Moderator appointed the following committees:

On Preaching—Brethren A. Brown, I. Grant and S. Rudd. On motion, Eld. G. W. Hall was added to the preaching committee.

On Sabboth Schools—Eld. W. J. Carroll and Brethren W. B. Walker and N. A. Porter.

On Missions—Eld. W. W. Bostick, W. C. Barclay and I. H. Slaughter. On Finance—Brethren A. Bowen, James Walker and J. R. Kimbrew.

On Temperance - Eld. W. W. Bostick, and Brethren Thomas Hartsfield and W. H. Benton.

On Deceased Ministers and Deacons-Eld. J. B. Langston and Brethren

J. H. Wentworth and Parker Levy.

Elected the following delegates to the State Convention: Elder G. W. Bostick, G. W. Hall, R. P. Green, W. W. Bostic, W. J. Carroll, J. B. Langston, and Brethren J. R. Kimbrew, J. H. Wentworth, N. T. Scott and E. E. Barclay.

night, and Elder J. B. Langston to morrow at 11 o'clock.

On motion, adjourned until to-morrow at 9 o'clock. Prayer by Elder R. P. Green.

Met pursuant to adjonrnment, Saturday, Oct. 17. Prayer by the Moderator.

Minutes of yesterday were read and adopted.

The call for petitionary letters was renewed. Letters from Shady Grove

was handed in and read.

On motion, the Shady Grove Church was received as a constituent of this body, and the right hand of fellowship extended to her delegates by the Moderator.

Call for reports of Committees.

COMMITTEE ON TEMPERANCE.

Committee on temperance recommend the republishing of last year's report, which is as follows: We your Committee to whom was referred the subject of temperance, believe that the children of God should be temperate in all things, that they should neither manufacture, buy, sell, or use as a beverage, any intoxicating liquors, that as one has said, "it is a liquid hell and a distilled damnation" to all who drink it to excess, that any member is in disorder who manufactures, buys, sells or drinks intoxicating liquors, that any church is in disorder who holds such a member in fellowship, that all christians should abstain from the use of ardent spirits and persuade all men to do likewise. "Add to your knowledge temperance."

W. W. BOSTICK, Chairman. Brother Chambers was called to the chair and Brother Hall addressed the adience on the subject of temperance. The report was adopted.

COMMITTEE ON MISSIONS.

Committee on missions made the following report: "Go preach the Gospel to every creature? was the Saviour's command to his followers when he sojourned with them. That it is a command, and it is the duty of his followers in this day none will doubt or deny. "If ye love me keep my command ments." "Go preach the Gospel to all nations, &c." With the above facts before us, ought we not to ask ourselves individually, how can I claim myself to be a follower of Christ, when I do not give unto the Lord to advance His kingdom and glorify His name on earth as He prospers me. "He that giveth unto the poor lendeth to the Lord," What is of more importance to the poor than the Gospel of Christ, which is the sword of the Spirit, and the power of God unto salvation. Brethren let us look out upon the world, and behold we see perishing millions of our race without Christ or hope in the world, many are bowing to wood and stone, many are being swept to inevitable ruin under the influence of the soul damning doctrine Romanism, while many are lost in infidelity. Let us also look well and with much interest at our own state, our destitution is great, yea, very great. Many of our church es are without pastors, and more than half of the citizens of our State are without Christ and his preached word. Brethren, with these stupendous

facts before us, let us reso've in our hearts, that henceforth our motto is, never to cease until the word of God is preached to every citizen of our State, this we can do, first, by giving our hearts to God in earnest prayer and supplication, that he would be with his people and sanctify their efforts to the salvation of sinners, and the upbuilding of his kingdom in our midst. Second: By putting about twelve Missionaries in the State, and at the same time support them so that they can give their whole time to the work of the ministry, this we can do if each baptist in the State will only give the small sum of one dollar. We trust there is not a baptist in Florida that is not ashamed to say that he or she cannot and will not give one dollar for the cause of Christ. To withold from the Lord that which is His and that which His cause needs is sin. And last though not least, the Fronida Baptist, edited by Elder H. B. McCallum, Lake City, Fla., has done much good and will do much more as a Missionacy in the State. Only two dollars brethren and that sweet little messenger of peace, truth and joy, of sound doctrine with many good sermons will visit you fifty-two times in one year. Let us work at home and abroad for the Florida Baptist, and in so doing we will greatly advance the cause of our blessed Saviour in our State. All of which W. W. BOSTICK, Chairman. is respectfully submitted.

Elder W.W. Bostick made a stirring appeal in behalf of Missions and Eld. K. Chambers made a Missionary address showing that the Florida Baptist

was a great instrumentality in the cause in the State.

On motion the following Executive Committee was appointed: Elder G. W. Hall, R. P. Green and Brethren N. T. Scott, P. A. McGriff and W. C. Hendry.

Elder G. W. Bostick addressed the Association in behalf of the The Baptist, published by Elder J. R. Graves, Memphis, Tenn.

Addresses by Agents called for.

On motion, adjourned until half past one, P. M.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

Association met pursuent to adjournment. Prayer by Brother Trice. Elder W. W. Bostic addressed the Association on the subject of Indian Missions, after which a collection was taken up amounting to five dollars.

Elder K. Chambers addressed the Association on State Missions.

On motion this Association requests the State Baptist Convention to appoint an Executive Committee composed of one member from each Associa: tion within its bounds to effect a concert of action in maintaining State Mis-

A collection was taken up for Elder K: Chambers, amounting to nine dollars and sixty-five cents.

Elder G. W. Hall presented the importance and value of a book entitled Georgia Baptist Historical and Biographical, by Elder J. H. Campbell.

The Committee appointed to visit the Gibsonite Convention, reported as follows:

Your committee who was appointed last year to visit the Gibsonite Convention, and remonstrate against their course, in constituting without any articles of faith, beg leave to make the following report :

We can say that we were received very kindly and treated brotherly by them. We believe our labors of love among them has resulted in some of them returnining to our churches. As you have witnessed even at your present session, and we assure you brethren that we endeavored in the Spirit of Christ to do the very best we could. Those of us who met with them were C. D. Campbell, J. M. Rushin, R. P. Green and K. Chambers, all of which is respectfully submitted.

On motion J. C. Gibson was permitted to make a brief statement to this body in reference to the course he had taken.

Elder W. W. Bostick introduced the following preamble and resolution: Whersas one J. C. Gibson formerly a member of this Association has introduced heresies in some of the churches composing a part of this Associa tion, and has ceased to be an orthodox minister of this denomination. And whereas the said Gibson has organized some churches, and whereas some of said churches still hold to said heresies. Therefore be it,

Resolved by this Association, That we condemn the action of the said J. C. Gibson and discountenance his organizations as orthodox churches, and as such withold our fellowship from them. Which was adopted.

We the committee appointed to investigate the standing of the Mt. Zion Church report as follows:

We, your Committee to whom was referred the duty of investigating the standing of the Mt Zion Church, report that we have performed the service nd are fully satisfied that that body is now occupying a true scriptural po ation and recommend that they be received into this body.

Your Executive Committee beg 'leave to' submit the following report .-Finding some funds on hand and learning the great destitution in the Southern portion of our Associational bounds, we engaged Elder R. P. Green as Missionary to go to that destitute field, whose report we subjoin below.

We also found the Association indebted to Elder W. J. Carroll for Missionary labor done in 1872, which we have liquidated. Again we have allowed Elder S. J. Richards the sum of \$20,00 for labor as Missionary in connection with Elder R. P. Green.

Dear Brethren we learn from the report of your Committee on Missions the sad state of many of our churches, and the lamentable destitution in our own bounds. We urge you to come to the resene brethren. There are men saying, here am I send me. And shall we not send them? Let the sequel proclaim a loud YES. We submit the report of our Missionary. Miles traveled 1968; sermons preached, 169; families visited, 170; prayed in families 186 times; delivered eight Sunday School lectures; baptized 34: received by letters 8; restored 7; constituted one church; assisted in ordaining five deacons. All of which is respectfully submitted.

Head was sixty-seven years of age, and departed this life in March of the present year, and may we all be enabled to live the life of the righteous, and may our last days be like his. REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON ME. BEAZOR CHURCH.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON SARBATH SCHOOLS.

We your Committee on Sabbath Schools, owing to the meagre reports from the Churches within our bounds, and the lack of interest manifested by the Churches, would suggest that a Committee consisting of eight, including the Moderator and Clerk of the Association, be appointed to labor with the Churches in their respective com nu rities, and urge the necessity of having a school in every Church or neighborhood. We also suggest that the Committee have meetings for the purpose of discussing and devising the best means of keeping alive an interest in the schools.
