MINUTES.

FIRST DAY.

ELIM CHURCH, COLUMBIA COUNTY, FLA., SATURDAY, OCTOBER 11, 1879.

In accordance with appointment, the Santa Fe River Baptist Association met with Elim Church, in its twenty-third annual session, Saturday October 11, 1879.

The Introductory Sermon was preached by Elder J. G. Taylor, from 1st Corinthians, 16th chapter, 10th verse.

The Association adjourned for one hour.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

On motion, Elder J. G. Taylor was requested to act as Moderator pro tem. and Bro. A. J. Cone Clerk.

A prayer-meeting was appointed for Sunday morning at 9 o'clock.

Adjourned, to meet Sunday morning at 9 o'clock.

SECOND DAY.

SUNDAY, October 12, 1879.

The Association met according to adjournment. Religious exercises from 9:50 to 10:50 p. m.

Elder W. N. Chaudoin preached the Missionary Sermon at 11 o'clock, from Isaiah, 49:13. After which a collection, amounting to \$25.05, was taken up for missions. Elder S. Sheffield preached, at the same hour, at the Academy. Elder R. F. Rodgers preached at 3 o'clock P. M., in the Church. Elder W. N. Chaudoin preached at the same hour, in the Academy, to the children.

THIRD DAY.

Monday, October 13, 1879.

The Association met, according to adjournment, at 9 o'clock, A. M. After prayer the Association proceeded to business.

The minutes were read and approved.

On the call for messengers from corresponding Associations, Bro. Samuel H. Burnett, from New River; Bro. Whitfield Walker, from Alachua, and Elder B. R. Moseley, from Suwannee, presented themselves and were received.

Bro. W. Walker stated that he had received a letter from Bro. McCallum, to the Association, which he had lost or 8

mislaid. He presented the claims of Bro. McCallum's paper to the brethren of the Association, and said Bro. McCallum would have been present himself if he had not been prevented by serious illness.

Bro. K. D. Edge was elected Treasurer.

On motion, it was

Resolved, That each Church of this Association be entitled to representation as follows: Two delegates for organization; three delegates for fifty members, and one delegate for every additional twenty-five members.

On motion of Bro. Ira J. Carter, it was

Resolved, That the thanks of this Association are due and are hereby tendered to Bro. James K. Sheffield, for his very liberal donation of \$32.00, balance due him by the Association for services as missionary, and also to Bro. S. Sheffield, for donation of \$9.00 due him.

On motion of A. J. Cone, it was

Resolved, That Sunday's collection be equally divided between the Associational purposes, and Indian and Foreign Missions.

On motion of the Clerk, it was

Resolved, That Churches of this Association, not represented by letter or delegates, have till the first of November to send their reports and contributions.

Within the past few months the Columbia Union has, to the best of her

ability, supplied this destitution, but now their means are exhausted, and we would urge upon the Association the importance of supplying this destitution at once.

Weeks the community has lost a good citizen, the poor a sympathizing and charitable friend, the Church an efficient worker, and his family-their loss cannot be estimated; and we would ask to mingle a brother's tears and offer a brother's sympathy in their great grief. Bro. A. E. Smith was born in the State of Ohio, and had been laboring in the ministry about siy years, at the time of his death, which occurred in April, 1879. He was a member of Eliam Church. Bro. Smith was an efficient warker in the Master's vineyard, and was instrumental in winning souls to Christ. He leaves a wife and two children to mourn his loss, but their loss is his gain.
