MELROSE, FLA., Oct. 30, 1889.

The Santa Fe River Baptist Association met this day with the Eliam church at 11 o'clock a. m. Exercises opened with reading of Scriptures and singing the 174th hymn in Baptist Hymnal. Prayer by Rev. S. S. Proctor.

The Introductory Sermon was preached by Rev. B. B. Hamilton from text 1st Peter, 1st chapter and 13th verse.

In the absence of the Moderator, the Association was called to order by the clerk, and Rev. L. J. Burton was chosen Moderator *pro tem*. Adjourned for two hours.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

Association called to order at 2 o'clock p. m. Prayer by Rev. B. R. Mosely.

The letters from the churches were called for and read by Rev. B. R. Mosely and Bro. S. E. Timmons.

Proceeded to the election of officers, and resulted in the choice of Rev. L. J. Burton, Moderator; Rev. J. H. Crosby, Clerk; and R. B. Weeks, Treasurer.

Visiting brethren were invited to seats, which was accepted by Rev. E. Trice of the Florida Association, Rev. J. C. Porter of Alachua., Rev. J. A. Mosely and B. B. Hamilton of the St. Johns, Bros. W. T. Carlton, ———. Holt of the Marion Association, and Rev. W. N. Chaudoin, Cor. Secretary Mission Board, and Sister L. B. Telford, Cor. Secretary Woman's Mission Work.

Letters of Correspondence called for and enrolled as follows: Rev. S. S. Proctor and G. T. Leitner of the Beulah Association, Rev. H. M. King, Bro. S. E. Timmons and Rev. B. W. Beck, of the St. John's, and Rev. W. G. Patterson of the New River.

Appointment of committees being in order. On Preaching and Nominations, Bros. J. S. Weeks, R. B. Weeks and Deacons of the church.

On motion of Rev. G. W. Hall, the Moderator and Clerk be allowed until services to-night to appoint committees. At this juncture, Rev. E. Trice made an appeal in behalf of Carribel church which resulted in \$15.60 in cash collection.

Committee on preaching reported that Rev. J. C. Porter

preach to-night at Eliam church, and Rev. S. S. Proctor at Baldwin School house.

Report of Committee on Sunday Schools

was read and addressed by Revs. J. C. Porter, B. B. Hamilton, W. N. Chaudoin and G. W. Hall.

On motion of Bro. Hall, it was laid on the table and the letter of the Tabernacle church, Jacksonville, be read and delegates' names enrolled. This business being disposed of, the discussion of the previous subject was resumed by Bros. Whitfield, W. Walker, S. S. Proctor, and adopted as follows:

The Sunday School is the church at work. It is a field

where the old and young, the parent and child can labor together. This department of church work is scarcely less important than the regular preaching of the Word.

It is the duty of our churches to elect Superintendents who will be regular in attendance, and prompt in conducting the exercises of the schools. We recognize the utter impossibility to carry on a successful Sunday School with a slothful, indifferent Superintendent. Much care and prudence should be exercised, also in the appointment of teachers.

Our pastors and churches should see that those who teach have the spiritual and mental qualifications. Let them first be taught of God, then "study to rightly divide His word and give to each their portion in due season."

We would recommend the Sunday School literature of the American Baptist Publication Society, Philadelphia, Pa., also "Kind Words," Atlanta, Ga., as excellent helps; but let it be understood that they cannot take the place of the Bible. We recommend the Bible first, midst and last, and urge all the teachers to require their pupils to use it in their classes.

Every soul that has been born again has felt the "sweetness" of redeeming love, which possesses in its very nature a burning desire that every soul in all the world be brought to a saving knowledge of the truth as it is in the "Lord Jesus Christ." Therefore it follows of necessity, that every regenerated soul will do all they believe to be necessary to send the blessed Gospel of the Son of God "to every creature." But thousands of our church members have not been properly instructed in what is taught in God's word on the subject of Missions, nor in what is being done in all the world to win souls to Christ. Therefore we recommend to all our church members the importance of furnishing themselves and families with the "Home Field," "Baptist Basket," "Foreign Mission Journal" and other papers from which they may obtain all the information necessary.

We also urge upon pastors of churches and Missionaries, the necessity of preaching on the subject of "Missions" to their churches and congregations, at least once every three months. To this end we would earnestly request our pastors and Missionaries to canvass the churches and congregations and make faithful efforts to place a copy of each of our missionary periodicals in every family. ed the Saviour's head at the burial and bathed his feet with her tears. Woman is ever ready with her means and influence, to convey to others the blessed Gospel of our Lord and Saviour.

We are glad to say that these societies have not only become a fixture, but a necessity to our sisters; and while discouragements and disappointments loom up before them, there is a bright side to the picture.

Sister Telford informs your committee that the Societies in our State are doing well, exceeding her most sanguine expectations, and that according to population, and with the Baptist ladies of Florida, are in the advance of any State in the Union. REPORT OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

MELROSE, FLA., Nov. 1, 1889.

The Executive Committee of the Santa Fe River Association, for the Associational year, A. D., 1890, met to-day. L. J. Burton, Moderator, presiding. The work of the Committee for the past year was presented by Bro. R. B. Weeks, and on motion of Rev. G. W. Hall, the requests of Yulee and Windsor churches were granted to wit: That the Rev. J. H. Crosby give to each of these churches one appointment a month, and that we pay him for his services \$50 each per annum, and all that he collects on the field, and that the Moderator address a circular letter to each church, urging upon them the importance of the work on hand, and request them to take up monthly contributions and to forward the same to R. B. Weeks, Treasurer, Hawthorne, Fla.

All churches are respectfully requested to send at least three delegates to the Associational Union, to be held at Gainesville, Florida, on Friday and Saturday, embracing the 5th Sunday in December, A. D., 1889. Adjourned to meet in Gainesville, Fla. on 5th Sunday in December, 1889.

CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE 1. This Association shall be called the Santa Fe River Baptist Association.

ART. 2. This Association shall be composed of Messengers from Baptist churches of which they are members, maintaining Gospel discipline.

ART. 3. The object of this Association shall be the re-union of the church, the promotion of the true Gospel, and the dissemination of the Bible truth by all laudable means.

ART. 4. This Association shall meet annually on the first day of which meeting it shall be elected by ballot, a Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer.

ART. 5. All churches shall be entitled to two delegates only, unless they shall exceed fifty in membership, and then they shall be entitled to one additional delegate for every twenty-five after the first fifty.

ART. 6. The delegates shall produce to the Association letters from their respective churches, certifying their appointments as delegates, containing a statement of the condition of the church, and such other information as may be deemed important to the Association.

ART. 7. This Association shall be deemed an Advisory Counsel, and shall treat the churches comprising it as independent bodies in all matters of internal government, and shall at no time interfere with their rights.

ART. 8. This Association admits the right of any one of the churches comprising it to withdraw at any time from the body without assigning any reason for so doing, and claims the power to withdraw from and disown all churches which depart from the principles of this compact by becoming heterodox in faith or disorderly in practice.

ART. 9. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive and disburse funds at the discretion of the Association by petition.

ART. 10. Any church in good standing in the Baptist connection may become a member of this Association by petition, and render an account of the same.

ART. 11. This Constitution may be amended at any annual meeting by a vote of two-thirds of the members present, providing a notice of the same had been given at the preceding meeting.
