CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE 1. This Association shall be called the Santa Fe River Baptist Association.

ART. 2. This Association shall be composed of Messengers from Baptist churches of which they are members, maintaining Gospel discipline.

ART. 3. The object of this Association shall be the re-union of the church, the promotion of the true Gospel, and the dissemination of the Bible truth by all laudable means.

ART. 4. This Association shall meet annually; on the first day of which meeting, shall be elected by ballot, a Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer.

ART. 5. All churches shall be entitled to two delegates only, unless they shall exceed fifty in membership, and then they shall be entitled to one additional delegate for every twentyfive after the first fifty.

ART. 6. The delegates shall produce to the Association letters from their respective churches, certifying their appointments as delegates, containing a statement of the condition of the church, and such other information as may be deemed important to the Association.

ART. 7. This Association shall be deemed an Advisory Council, and shall treat the churches comprising it as independent bodies in all matters of internal government, and shall at no time interfere with their rights.

ART. 8. This Association admits the right of any one of the churches comprising it to withdraw at any time from the body without assigning any reason for so doing, and claims the power to withdraw from and disown all churches which depart from the principles of this compact by becoming heterodox in faith or disorderly in practice.

ART. 9. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive and disburse funds at the discretion of the Association by petition.

ART. 10. Any church in good standing in the Baptist connection may become a member of this Association by petition, and render an account of the same.

ART. 11 This Constitution may be amended at any annual meeting by a vote of two-thirds of the members present, providing a notice of the same had been given at the preceeding meeting.

MINUTES

HAWTHORNE, FLA., October 28, 1890.

The Santa Fe River Baptist Association met this day with the Pleasant Grove Church, at 10 o'clock a. m. Exercises opened with a prayer service by G. W. Riles. The Association was called to order by the Clerk in the absence of the Moderator and Rev. P. W. Corr was elected Moderator pro tem. Prayer by Dr. Plummer.

Adjourned to 2 o'clock p. m.

The introductory sermon was preached by G. W. Hall, from text: Prov. 11, 30v.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

Association called to order at 2 o'clock. Prayer by Rev. J. A. Doll of Virginia.

The letters from the Churches were called for and read by Rev. G. W. Hall and Rev. G. W. Riles.

Petitionary letters were called for and responded to by the Ochwilla, Orange Creek and Perseverance Churches, and they were unanimously received into the fellowship of the Association, the Moderator extending the right hand of welcome.

The Association then proceeded to the election of officers which resulted as follows: Rev. P. W. Corr, Moderator; Rev. J. H. Crosby, Clerk; R. B. Weeks, Treasurer.

Visiting brethren were invited to seats with us and the invitation was accepted by Rev. N. A. Bailey, A'sst Cor. Sec'y State Board, sister L. B. Telford, womans' mission work, W. N. Chadoin, President State Convention and Corresponding Secretary State Board of Missions, J. C. Porter, State Evangelist and Financial Agent, L. D. Geiger, Alachua, P. O. Miller, Marion, J. A. Doll, Virginia, S. S. Proctor and G. T. Luterer, Beulah, Rev. J. W. Thames and S. E. Timmons, St. Johns.

On motion of Rev. G. W. Hall the Moderator and Clerk were allowed until services to-night to appoint committees.

The committee on Preaching reported that Rev. M. M. Wambolt preach to-night. text: Heb. 4, 12v.

At this juncture Rev. J. C. Porter addressed the Association in behalf of several very valuable books.

Adjourned to 9 o'clock, a. m., Oct. 29., with prayer.

Report of Committees being next in order, the Committee on Letters and Queries made their report which was adopted as follows:

REPORT ON LETTERS AND QUERIES.

Your Committee on Letters and Queries beg leave to report that no queries have been presented at the present session.

We are gratified to report the churches composing this Association are in a prosperous condition, and have enjoyed the blessings of the Holy Spirit. We have received three churches by letter this session; one of which, "Perseverance," organized this year with thirty-five members, deserves special mention.

We are gratified to report, also, the success of the Sunday-school work. One church, Eliam, having four schools; and one, Pleasant Grove, three, in good working condition. Some of the churches report prayer meetings. We earnestly request every church to organize prayer meetings as soon as practicable. We regret that the Woman's Missionary Societies receive so little attention, and recommend more earnest zeal in the future.

The Beulah church asks for the next session of this Association. We beg to refer this matter back to the Association for their consideration.

The Committee on Publications made their report; which was discussed by Rev. L. D. Geiger, [in behalf of the BAPTIST WITNESS,] L. B. Plumer, J. C. Porter, G. T. Leitner. On motion the report of the committee on Publications be amended by adding after the words "OUR BRETHREN," the words "BE GIVEN" and striking out the balance of the sentence. Also, in the next sentence, strike out all the words after the word "CIRCULATION." Lost.

Adopted as follows:

ON PUBLICATIONS.

With the increasing improvement of the Lesson Helps and other literature, we earnestly urge our brethren to use only those publications in church work, which are issued by the institutions known by our name. And this both for the reason that they are unsurpassed in scholarship, and with a proper regard for the views we hold; any other practice must do violence to our self respect.

As to which Society or Publishing House should be patronized, we counsel the churches to apply business principles and buy where they can get the most for the money.

In mentioning our state paper, the FLORIDA BAPTIST WITNESS we would suggest to the publishers that a larger amount of news concerning the work of all our brethren would be more acceptable and profitable than so much reference to "yellow-legged chicken and downy beds" enjoyed by its editorial staff. We urge the propriety and justice of permitting a full discussion of the great denominational interests we all have at heart.

We pledge our renewed support to our paper and will endeavor to extend its circulation when objectionable features are removed so that we can induce people to subscribe for it.

We recommend, to the churches, the Missionary Magazines issued by our Societies.

We note, with gratification, that the American Baptist Publication Society has appointed an agent for our State, not alone for the business features, but for the prosecution of its seminary and benevolent work. Seven colored preachers, students of the Procheir Bible College, which is a part of the work of the P. B. C. received a grant of a fine library from this Society.

We urge in any seeming competition by our Publication Societies, that business principles prevail and brotherly love continue.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

Association called to order at 4 P. M. Prayer by Rev. L. D. Geiger.

The report of committee on Temperance was read and after discussion by Rev. J. A. Doll and Rev. L. J. Burton, was adopted as follows:

ON TEMPERANCE.

Your Committee on Temperance beg leave to report that although much has been said on this subject, yet much remains to be said. Various have been the stages through which the Temperance cause has already advanced, but there is still a more elevated position to which we must attain before the triumph of this noble enterprise will be complete; and that important point we believe can only be secured by the efficient aid of legislation, looking to the repeal of the license laws in the different states of this Union, and by safe and salutary prohibition laws substituted in their stead. Without this, we fear the Temperance cause with all its excellence, will be in danger of ultimate failure—which we pray, God forbid. It is therefore important, that all the friends of Temperance, morality, civil and religious liberty should agitate this subject whenever, and wherever opportunity presents itself. We submit the following resolution for your consideration.

Resolved, That the laws authorizing the manufacture and sale of ardent spirits, in the different States of this Union, are inconsistent with a virtuous and Republican Government, are the most fruitful source of intemperance in the land.

ON SUNDAY SCHOOLS.

We, your Committee, beg leave to report, that there is no department of church work which is developing so rapidly and

attracting so much attention as our Sunday School work. We are glad to report that nearly all our churches are maintaining good schools. We most heartily commend the Sunday School Convention of this Association. It will prove a great blessing to have all the Sunday School workers meet four times a year, and discuss the various methods of teaching. We would also recommend to the schools within our bonds the literature of our Denomination. We are glad to note that the great question of literature which is now agitating our denomination throughout this State, has been happily settled by our Sunday School Convention by leaving the matter with the churches.

Committee on preaching report that L. D. Geiger will preach tonight.

The Committee on Education made their report which was discussed by Rev. N. A. Bailey. On motion of Rev. P. W. Corr, that part which refers to teachers from our public schools, was stricken out. The report was laid on the table till night services. Rev. N. A. Bailey pending the discussion of this report, presented the claims of Jno. B. Stetson University, at DeLand and received the following cash and pledges for its endowment fund: Rev. W. T. Carleton \$50; Rev. Jno. A. Doll, \$50; L. W. Guernsey \$25; H. A. Fisher, \$25; E. B. Perry, \$1, cash; T. W. Thompson, \$5, cash; W. H. Donaldson, \$1, cash.

On motion of J. H. Crosby that when we adjourn, it be to meet with the La Crosse church at La Crosse, Fla., on Tuesday after the 4th. Lord's day in Oct., in 1891. Adopted.

Prayer by Rev. G. W. Hall. Adjourned to 9 o'clock tonight.

NIGHT SESSION.

Preaching by Rev. L. D. Geiger from Isa., xxviii—20. At the close of the sermon Rev. J. C. Porter addressed

the Association in behalf of two young men who are trying to educate themselves for the ministry, and whom Bro. Porter has agreed to carry through Stetson University. Responded to, in cash and pledges. Cash, by collection \$9.75. Pledges, Rev. L. D. Geiger, \$10, Rev. J. H. Crosby \$10, Rev. N. A. Bailey \$10, Rev. J. A. Doll \$5, C. A. Barry, \$1, Rev. J. W. Thomas, \$1, S. E. Timmons, what he can raise, Deland Misson Society, \$5, Leesburg Mission Society, \$5, Micanopy, \$10, Rev. S. S. Proctor \$5; Hawthorne and Waldo would raise all they could. Eliam church, \$15.

THURSDAY, OCT., 30, 1890.

Association called to order by Rev. S. S. Proctor, Moderator, pro tem. Prayer by Rev. J. H. Crosby.

Committee on Deceased Ministers and Deacons made their report, which, after discussion by Rev. G. W. Hall, was adopted as follows:

We, your Committee beg leave to report that with sorrow of heart we have to announce that it has pleased Almighty God to call from our midst, since our last meeting, and from the cares and labors of this life,, our venerable and beloved brother, Rev. REPORT ON EDUCATION.

The importance of a Christian education cannot be over estimated, and the necessity for such education should be kept constantly before our people. This Association and all the Baptists of the State have an Institution of learning in the Jno. B. Stetson University, that every Baptist in the State should feel belongs to them and should have our contributions and our prayers. We are glad to report progress in our State University, in the number of students and in the efficiency of of this Institution to carry out the great principles for which it was founded.

We would recommend to all the members of this Association the importance of aiding in raising the remainder of the amount

necessary to complete the endowment fund of ten thousand dollars, by which this grand Institution becomes the property of the Denomination in this State without incumbrances.

On motion of Rev. P. W. Corr, all discussions and appeals be limited to five minutes. Adopted.

On motion, the following resolutions were adopted in regard to an Executive Committee, were adopted after discussion by Rev. S. S. Proctor and Rev. P. W. Corr :

Resolved, 1st. This Association shall have an executive committee of seven, of which committee, the Moderator, Clerk, and Treasurer shall be members, ex-officio, and officers ex-officio. The other four members of the committee, to be elected annually by the Association. Four shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Resolved, 2nd. The Associational Mission work shall be under the supervision and control of the Executive Committee. The missionaries employed reporting their work to the Executive Committee at its quarterly meetings, or whenever called upon to do so.

Resolved, 3rd. The Executive Committee shall have power to fill all vacancies.

Moved to amend by adding the above three articles at the next meeting of the Association.

REPORT ON MISSIONS.

The first impulse of a new-born soul is to praise God and glorify his Redeemer. The next impulse is to tell others of his

new-found joy and how precious his Saviour is to him. This blessed impulse carries men and women across the ocean and into the most hostile and dangerous heathen lands and leads them to spend their lives in toil and hardships that they may win souls to Christ.

Others who cannot go themselves make regular contributions that they may send the gospel tidings to the lost of earth.

Brethren we are glad to report that much has been done in the Home and Foreign fields during the past Associational year. Our missionary, Elder J. H. Crosby, has accomplished much within the bounds of our own Association, and another prosperous church added to our number, is found among the fruits he has been blessed to gather in. Our State missionaries have been abundantly blessed in their labors together with the pastors who have aided them in the destitution of our own State; and such a Harvest of precious souls have been gathered in as never before in one year in the history of this State. Our Foreign missionaries have been much blessed and the number of missionaries increased. The outlook for the future is grand and glorious for the extension of our Redeemer's Kingdom. We would also recommend to the churches and pastors of this Association that they set apart one day every three months to a meeting in behalf of Woman's Mission Work and that the pastors be requested to preach or deliver an address on the subject.
