RESOLUTIONS ADOPTED.

1. That any brother of this Association attending any other association be requested to act as correspondent.
2. That the Clerk have the usual number of minutes published and that he be allowed fifteen dollars for his services and that the Treasurer pay for the same.
3. That it is our advice to our brethren to refuse to allow the Mormons admission to their homes or the use of their church houses, and that they decline to attend their meetings, because to do this would be to encourage them in spreading their nefarious doctrine.
4. That the thanks of this Association be extended to

the pastor and members of Eliam Church and community for the kindness and hospitality to the body during our stay among them.

5. That the Executive Committee employ a missionary during the next Associational year. We most heartily endorse the action of the Executive Committee as to men and means employed during the past year.

6. That the Treasurer be instructed to turn over to the State Board of Missions \$10 which he has on hand.

The hour for preaching having arrived, Bro. B. R. Moseley preached from John 17:24, after which the song, "God Be With You Till We Meet Again," was sung. The parting hand was given. Prayer by Rev. G. T. Leitner, and the Association adjourned to meet with the Munteocha Church Wednesday after the third Sunday in October, 1900.

CONSTITUTION.

1. This Association shall be called the Santa Fe River Baptist Association.

2. This Association shall be composed of messengers from Baptist churches, of which they must be members, maintaining the Gospel discipline, and they must present letters from their respective churches certifying to their election as messengers.

3. The object of this Association shall be the reunion of the churches, the promotion of the true Gospel, and the dissemination of Bible truth.

4. This Association shall meet annually, on the first day of which meeting it shall elect, by ballot, a Moderator, a Clerk and a Treasurer.

5. Any Baptist church newly organized may become a member of this Association by a letter petitioning for membership and giving information concerning organization and presbytery and by whom organized. Any church coming from another Association may become a member of this Association by presenting petitionary letter, accompanied by a letter of dismissal from the Association from which it comes.

6. This Association admits the right of any one of the

churches comprising it to withdraw by application for a letter without assigning any reason for so doing. At the same time, this Association claims the right to withdraw from any church which departs from the principles of this compact by becoming heterodox in faith or disorderly in practice.

7. This Association shall be deemed an advisory council and shall treat the churches composing it as independent bodies in all matters of self-government, and shall at no time interfere with their rights.

8. This Association shall have an Executive Committee of five, of which the Treasurer shall be a member ex-officio. The other four members shall be elected annually by the Association, no two members being from the same church. Three shall constitute a quorum for business. The Executive Committee shall elect its own chairman and secretary and shall have power to fill vacancies.

9. The Associational mission work shall be under the control and supervision of the Executive Committee, and all missionaries shall make quarterly reports to them when called upon to do so.

10. All churches shall be entitled to two messengers for the first fifty members and one additional messenger for each twenty-five members after the first fifty and for the major fraction thereof.

11. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive and disburse all funds of the Association, but only by order of the Association or Executive Committee.

12. This Constitution may be amended at any regular meeting of the Association by a two-thirds vote of the messengers present.
