The second and annual meeting of the Woman's Missionary Union of the Santa Fe River Association was held by Vice-president Rosa E. Merryman, on the evening of Oct. 24, 1901. The Association having just adopted the report on Woman's Work gave way for the Woman's Missionary Union.

A paper on the History of Woman's Work in Florida was read by Vice-president, Mrs. R. E. Merryman. A letter of greeting from Miss Spalding to Woman's Missionary Union was read by Mrs. J. R. Cloud.

A letter from Miss Mary E. Taylor was read by Mrs. S. M. McCann. Delegates were enrolled from four Woman's Mission Unions and two Sunbeam Bands.

Mrs. R. E. Merryman reported work done during the year as follows:

Organizations, five W. M. U. and four Sunbeam Bands. Letters written, sixty-two, postal cards, thirty-six. Public meetings held, three. Assistance was rendered at one of them by Mrs. Susie Jackson, the other vice-president.

Collections at the four meetings amounted to \$10.29

Amount reported by the W. M. U. and Sunbeam Bands during the year \$145.39. Making a total of \$155.68.

Mrs. R. E. Merryman expressed her appreciation of the sympathy and co-operation that the women and children of the Association had given her. She expressed her thanks to the brethren for their unflinching courtesy in giving away for the W. M. U.'s at the Sunday School Conventions and Associations during the year. The W. M. U. re-elected by acclamation Mrs. Rosa E. Merryman and Mrs. Susie Jackson as vice-presidents for another year. •

Mrs. Susie Jackson, of Gainesville and Mrs. McFaden, of Hawthorne, were appointed delegates to the annual meeting of the W. M. U., at Marianna, Dec. 12th.

CONSTITUTION.

1. This Association shall be called the Santa Fe River Baptist Association.

2. This Association shall be composed of messengers from Baptist churches, of which they must be members, maintaining the Gospel discipline, and they must present letters from their respective churches certifying as to their election as messengers.

3. The object of this Association shall be the reunion of the churches, the promotion of the true Gospel, and the dissemination of Bible truth.

4. This Association shall meet annually, on the first day of which meeting it shall elect, by ballot, a Moderator, a Clerk and a Treasurer.

5. Any Baptist church newly organized may become a member of this Association by a letter petitioning for membership and giving information concerning organization and presbytery and by whom organized. Any church coming from another Association may become a member of this Association by presenting petitionary letter, accompanied by a letter of dismissal from the Association from which it comes.

6. This Association admits the right of any one of the churches comprising it to withdraw by application for a letter without assigning any reason for so doing. At the same time, this Association claims the right to withdraw from any church which departs from the principles of this compact by becoming heterodox in faith or disorderly in practice.

7. This Association shall be deemed an advisory council and shall treat the churches composing it as independent bodies in all matters of self-government, and shall at no time interfere with their rights.

8. This Association shall have an Executive Committee of five, of which the Treasurer shall be a member ex-officio. The other four members shall be elected annually by the Association, no two members being from the same church. Three shall constitute a quorum for business. The Executive Committee shall elect its own chairman and secretary and shall have power to fill vacancies.

9. The Associational mission work shall be under the control and supervision of the Executive Committee, and all missionaries shall make quarterly reports to them when called upon to do so.

10. All churches shall be entitled to two messengers for the first fifty members and one additional member for each twenty-five members after the first and for the major fraction thereof.

11. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive and disburse all funds of the Association, but only by order of the Association or Executive Committee.

12. This Constitution may be amended at any regular meeting of the Association by a two-thirds vote of the messengers present.
