CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE 1—NAME: The name of this association shall be called THE SANTA FE RIVER BAPTIST ASSOCIATION.

ARTICLE II-OBJECTS: The objects of this association shall be:

- (a) To encourage the spirit of cooperation between the member churches in their Divinely appointed work.
- (b) To provide direct missionary activity in reaching unevangelized areas within the bounds of the Association, and
- (c) To effect a closer cooperation between the churches and the Florida Baptist Convention and the Southern Baptist Convention, and a greater participation in the Denominational program of misssions education, and benevolence.

ARTCLE III-CHURCHES

- (a) This Association shall consist of Missionary Baptist Churches of regular faith and order, holding regular communication with the Association in its annual sessions, and subscribing to the beliefs of the Denomination and the objects fostered.
- (b) Churches presenting petitionary letters from other Associtions, and newly constituted churches presenting proper credentials of organization and articles of faith, accompanied by properly accredited messengers, may, by majority vote of the annual session, be received into membership in the Association.
- (c) This Association admits the right of any of the churches comprising it to withdraw by application for a letter without assigning any reason for doing so. At the same time, this Association claims the right to withdraw from any church which departs from the principles of this compact by becoming heterodox in faith or disorderly in practice.

ARTICLE IV—MEMBERS: This Association in session shall be composed of:

- (a) All officers elected by the Association.
- (b) The Pastors of the Churches in the Association, and
- (c) Messengers elected by their respective churches on the following basis, and certified to the Association in session in their annual letter or petitionary letter: Each church shall be entitled to a minimum of three messengers and two additional messengers for every twenty-five members or major fraction thereof over the first fifty members, except that no church shall be entitled to more than ten messengers.

ARTICLE V-OFFICERS:

- (a) The officers of this Association shall be: Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, Sunday School Superintendent, Training Union Director, Women's Missionary Union President, Brotherhood President, Chairman of Evangelism, Music Director, and Pianist.
- (b) Officers shall be elected at each annual session, from members of this Association, to take office immediately, except the Moderator and Vice-Moderator, who shall take office at close of final session. The Moderator and Vice-Moderator shall be elected by ballot from nominations made on the floor of the first session of the annual session, and shall not hold office for a period longer than two successive years. All other officers shall be nominated by the nominating committee. If a vacancy occurs in any office between sessions the Executive Committee shall elect an officer to fill such vacancy for the unexpired term. All officers shall serve until their successors have been elected.

ARTICLE VI-MEETINGS:

- (a) The Association shall meet annually at such time and place as the body shall have determined at its annual session. In emergencies, the Executive Committee may make such changes in the time and place of the annual session as will best serve the interests of the Association.
- (b) The Sunday School, Training Union, Women's Missionary Union, and Brotherhood officers shall conduct such meetings as are in keeping with the Denominational program.

ARTICLE VII—COMMITTEES

- (a) The Executive Committee shall be composed of:
- (1) All officers elected by the Association.
- (2) The Pastors of the Churches in the Association, and
- (3) One additional member from each Church. These additional members to be nominated by their respective Churches and elected by the Association in annual session.
- (b) The Program Committee shall be composed of the Moderator, Vice-Moderator, and Clerk.
- (c) The following committees, and any other authorized by the Association, shall, unless otherwise provided, each be composed of three members appointed by the Moderator: Nominating Committee, Resolutions Committee, Radio Committee, Budget Committee, and Missions Committee composed as follows: Moderator, Clerk and three additional members appointed on the following basis:

In October 1954, one for one (1) year, one for two (2) years, and one for three (3) years and thereafter one each year for a term of three (3) years.

ARTICLE VIII—AMENDMENTS: These articles may be made, altered or rescinded at any annual session of the Association up on a two-thirds vote of the members present, provided however, that one day's notice shall have been given, and that the proposed amendment shall have been presented in writing.

RULES OF DECORUM

SECTION I—DUTIES OF CHURCHES:

- (a) It shall be the duty of each church in the Association to forward to the clerk of the Association, at least three days prior to the opening of the annual Association, a written report on forms provided, specifying the names of her messengers and giving statistical account of the work of the previous year.
- (b) Each Church shall nominate a layman for membership in the Executive Committee and shall report such nomination in writing to the annual session.

SECTION II DUTIES OF OFFICERS:

- (a) Moderator: It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside at all sessions and appoint all committee not otherwise provided for. He shall serve as Chairman of the Executive Committee submitting a written report of its work to the annual session. He shall also be Chairman of the Program Committee. He shall countersign all checks of disbursement.
- (b) Vice-Moderator: It shall be the duty of the Vice-Moderator to perform all the duties of Moderator in his absence. He may also preside at Moderator's request. He shall serve as Vice-Chairman of the Executive Committee and of the Program Committee.

(c) Clerk:

- (1) The Clerk shall keep a correct record of the proceedings of the Association, supervise the printing and distribution of the minutes, keep a regular file of the published proceedings of the Association, and deliver same, with all other materials belonging to the office, to his successor.
- (2) He shall send to the clerks of the churches the "Associational Letter" report forms at least thirty days prior to the annual session.
- (3) He shall notify in writing, immediately upon their election or appointment, all persons elected to office or appointed on committees.
- (4) He shall serve as Secretary of the Executive Committee, keeping a correct record of its proceedings and notifying its members in writing of all regular and special meetings.
- (5) The clerk shall receive remuneration for his service, the sum to be fixed by the association at its annual session. Additional funds may be provided for the expense of his office.

(d) Treasurer:

- (1) The Treasurer shall receive and disburse all Associational funds. All receipts shall be deposited in a public bank and all disbursements shall be made by check signed by Treasurer, countersigned by Moderator.
- (2) All expenditures shall be authorized by the Executive Committee or the Association in annual session before disbursement is made.
- (3) Permanent records shall be kept, including cancelled checks and bank statement, and shall be delivered to his successor.
- (4) Written reports shall be made quarterly to the Executive Committee and annually to the Association in annual session.
- (c) Other Officers: The officers of the Sunday School, Training Union, Women's Missionary Union, Brotherhood, and Chairman of Evangelism shall perform the functions usual to their offices, following the plans outlined in their respective Denominational publications. The Executive officer of each department shall present at the annual session, a written report of the work of his department. The Music Director and Pianist shall have charge of the music at Associational and Executive Committee meetings, and shall endeavor to promote the cause of good music at the Churches.

SECTION III—DUTIES OF COMMITTEES:

- (a) The Executive Committee shall transact all business of the Association between annual sessions. It shall meet quarterly at a time and place decided upon by the committee, and at other times and places upon the call of its chairman. If a vacancy occurs in any office between sessions, the Executive Committee shall elect an officer to fill such vacancy for the unexpired term.
- (b) The Program Committee shall suggest the order of business for the annual sessions. Persons expected to make reports or otherwise take part in the program shall be notified in writing at least one month prior to the session.
- (c) The Nominating Committee shall, by written report at the first session of the annual session nominate all officers of the Association except as otherwise provided. The Committee shall have personally conferred with each nominee at least one week prior to his nomination. The Committee shall serve throughout the year and if a vacationcy occurs in any office between sessions, shall make nomination to the Executive Committee of an officer to fill such vacancy for the unexpired term.
 - (d) Other Committees shall perform the duties assigned them.

SECTION IV—AMENDMENTS: These Rules of Decorum may be made, altered, or rescinded at any annual session by a majority vote of the members present, all proposed amendments shall be presented in writing.

SECTION V: The parliamentary law which shall be used in the government of this Association shall be ROBERTS RULE OF ORDER (Revised).

It has been a pleasure and privilege for me to serve as your President for the past five years. Untold blessings have been mine. Many changes have been made in the work and our Association has been prompt to make the necessary adjustments and has moved steadily forward in most phases of the work. The Societies have been most cooperative and have reaped the results of earnest, prayerful effort.

We began the year with 23 Societies - two disbanded during the first quarter leaving 21 active. To date there are 23 Societies including two recently new ones, Archer Road Chapel and Forest Park Chapel. We welcome them into our Association. The membership to date (excluding the new Societies) is 980. We had 100% reporting quarterly to the Association through all the Societies for the year. All regular and Executive Board Meetings were held in conjunction quarterly at the following places: Hawthorne; Pinegrove, Gainesville; Parkview, Gainesville; and Melrose.

The following is a compilation of the year's work as reported: YOUTH WORK: There are 41 Auxiliaries including 15 Sunbeam Bands, 23 Junior and Intermediate G. A. 's, 2 Y. W. A. 's, with a total membership of 605 of which 28 are new members. The R. A. report is excluded for the first time since the Brotherhood has accepted sponsorship and will include them in their report. Two new offices were added to the Young People's roster, Y. W. A. Director and Sunbeam Leader, making a full quota of Youth Workers in our Association. The Annual Youth Rally was held in July at Parkview Chapel with well over 200 young people and W. M.S. members present. The speaker for this meeting was Miss Pearl Todd, missionary to China and Japan. A Coronation and Recognition Service was held at the Southside Baptist Church with 13 Maidens, 17 Ladies-in-Waiting, 3 Princessess recognized, 7 Queens were crowned, one Queen received the Scepter, and one was recognized as Queen Regent. Two G. A. Council Meetings were held with approximately 90 in attendance. Eighteen Auxiliaries observed the Seasons and Week of Prayer, with 16 observing all three. They contributed through Lottie Moon Offering \$75.96, Annie Armstrong Offering \$39.31, and State Missions Offering \$53, 41, 196 gave through the Cooperative Program through their Churches, 60 are tithers, 26 participated in Community Missions under direction of their leaders, 38 Mission Study Classes were conducted with 91 G. A. 's reading additional approved Mission Books. The W. M. U. promotes an Annual Church Night of Stewardship with the Youth Organizations participating.

PUBLICATIONS: Subscriptions of W. M. U. members to "Royal Service" 409; Y. W. A. members to "Window of Y. W. A." 16; G. A. 's to "Tell" 106;

Sunbeams to "Sunbeam Activities" 45.

MISSION STUDY: Two Associational Mission Study Institutes were conducted by the Association Chairman, one in January on the Home Mission Series, and one in October on the Foreign Mission Series. Forty-four Missions Study classes were conducted locally on Home and Foreign Missions and classes of study in Stewardship and Prayer, with 324 W. M.S. members reading additional approved mission books.

PRAYER REPORT: Eleven Societies definitely promoted use of the Calendar of Prayer, 16 observed all three Seasons and Week of Prayer, with only two observing two weeks, 10 Societies have maintained Intecessory Prayer Leagues throughout the year.

COMMUNITY MISSIONS: Seventeen Societies promoted Community Missions Activities with 650 members actively participating in such projects as Community Surveys, Soul-Winning activities, Cottage Prayer Meetings and Visitation before Revivals, participation in the Alcohol Education Program, working in Vacation Bible Schools, giving cash and supplies to Institutions, and helping in local situations.

STEWARDSHIP: 770 members in 18 Societies contributed regularly through the Cooperative Program through their Churches. 430 are tithers. Cash gifts include: Foreign Missions (Lottie Moon Fund) \$3,341.21, Home Missions (Annie Armstrong Fund) \$1,392.92, State Missions \$832.64, other gifts promoted by State Office \$407.10. The budget was necessarily increased \$90.00 in order to take care of the training of all the eligible Associational Leadership. This includes 10 Associational Officers to the State Leaders Conference at Daytona Beach and the State W. M. U. Meeting annually. Nine of the officers attended the Leader's Conference in September, including the new President. The budget to date is \$360.00, which adequately takes care of the needs of the Association. Additional help is given toward training the youth workers through their leadership schools and in promoting the youth work. The Association gave generously to various mission causes through the Quarterly Meetings receipts during the year.

In accord with our new Watchword---"Behold, I have set before thee an open door---" (Revelation 3:8), we would be constantly aware of the tasks and needs before us and avail ourselves of every opportunity given us through Woman's Missionary Union to explore to the fullest those things which will help us succeed in carrying out the great command "Go ye---."

TRAINING UNION REPORT

1957

There are 26 Training Unions in churches of which there are 3 missions, in this Association and with a total membership of 2,704.

We have had four Mass Meetings with the following attendance record, "M" Night in the Gainesville First Church, 353; Our March Rally in the Gainesville Eastside Church, 86; A July Meeting in the Parkview Mission, 111,

and a September Meeting in Alachua, 137. (The average attendance throughout the year about 176.) There were very inspiring and able speakers in all of our meetings, and there were excellent singing as well. Our March Rally in the Eastside Church was particularly important because there we had the elimination contests for both the Young People's Speaking and Intermediate Bible Sword Drill. We were represented by two young men in the District Tournaments held in the Lakeshore Church in Jacksonville, (The speaker was unopposed in the Eastside Rally we held.)

We almost reached our goal of 600 requests for Study Course awards during the year as our latest total reported by our State Office is 591.

RELIEF AND ANNUITY BOARD REPORT

The Relief and Annuity Board of the Southern Baptist Convention releases this information:

First: This completes thirty-nine years of service.

Second: Of the 27,688 pastors in 1957 almost 16,000 of them were members of the various retirment plans of the Board.

Third: Last year 3,174 retired ministers and denominational workers received a total of \$1,626,211.59 and also 1,474 other aged preachers and their widows were on relief rolls and received a total of \$320,443.24.

Fourth: The problem of the Board is concerned with is the large number of ministers who have no protection and they have to rely upon designated monies from the Cooperative Program and special offerings to take care of

these aged ministers and their wives.

Fifth: None of the money held by the Board from the paying members of the various plans is used for relief, as constantly there is becoming a larger and larger number to go into retirement. The number who go into retirement each year exceed the number who pass to their heavenly rewards by quite a large number.

REPORT OF FIELD SECRETARY

Dear Friends of this Association: It was my pleasure to begin a very pleasant work with you on January 1, 1954, and it so continues to this good day of the 1957 annual meeting of this Body.

At the beginning some 45 months ago, we had a total of 75 churches in this, the Sixth Missions District of the Florida Baptist State Convention.

We had two missions.

Today, we have 80 churches and 6 missions, despite the fact that two churches have disbanded, due to conditions beyond their control, and one church found it necessary to revert to the status of a mission for the present time.

We have experienced a rather heavy turnover in the field of leadership, and particularly in pastoral leadership, which has had a rather telling result upon the stability of our church programs. All phases of the work have been affected in these changes. Especially has this been true in evangelism

and in training in stewardship.

In each church there has been "The faithful few" who "Stayed by the stuff" regardless of difficulties which were met in the attempt to "Carry on" the work of that particular church. It seems that God, may have chosen to carry the load by the faithful hands of a few, rather than to use the teeming masses "Who can't spare the time for such things."

During the almost four years that we have worked together, your Field Secretary has traveled a total 78,380 miles and preached 590 times. This is equivilent to driving an average of 435 miles and preaching 13 times each week around the calendar, and yet you see how little has been accomplished by all the forces of our combined churches and missions.

ALSO during the time above mentioned, almost a half-million people have come to live in Florida with us. About 150,000 each year; about 3,000

each week; or about 425 people per day.

IF all these incoming people were Baptists, and if they formed new churches, THEN it would require about 300 new churches per year, with an average of 500 members each, to care for these new Floridians. HOWEVER, they are not ALL Baptists, and those of them who ARE Baptists are finding their way into many of the Baptist Churches which are already here when

they arrive.

THIS puts our churches to the test. M re than ever, we need great Christian Members in our Baptist Churches to "Show the New-comers the say. " REACH the new-comers during their first six-weeks here, or risk never reaching them. We need strong-church-programs of activity, challenging the new comers. Greater than Florida has ever witnessed is the opportunity for great preaching. Certainly God, has His Man for "Such a time as this" who can fill the place of a strong Christian Pastor and lead the people when they are provided in such great numbers. We need to teach Christians how to observe the Christian Sabbath, both, the ones in the church pew on the Sabbath and those who are elsewhere, giving THEIR witness. New Comers need to be taught that Florida is not a State where the laws of the Christian Sabbath have been abolished. Baptist Christians who have already been here for quite some time may be a bit late in giving their Christian Witness in the sort of way that would be most pleasing to God. Should Pastors be afraid to call our attention to these facts? One of he sorry sights in Florida, is to see the people at work on the Christian Sabbath; building houses, plowing their fields, cutting the grass in the yard, fishing, - almost in the front doors of some of the churches. AND this is without regard to what anybody thinks or says.

WHAT CAN WE DO: - If each Association will elect five of their very best and most practical Christian leaders, to serve on an "Associational Missions Committee," and let them serve on a rotating basis over a five year period, THEN, we can begin to lay plans in a very definite way toward more "Preaching Places" and more Sunday Schools. MORE MISSIONS in EVERY ASSOCIATION is the greatest answer we have to offer at this moment. Through these committees, with well planned meetings and a carefully planned Mission Program for their local association, our contribution toward the great goal of "30,000 more preaching places by 1964" will render a great a Christian Witness, that can be measured only by Eternity.
