MINUTES.

HOPEWELL CHURCH, October 8, 1884.

The South Florida Association convened this day with the Hopewell Baptist Church, Hillsboro county, Fla., at 11 o'clock, A. M.

Met pursuant to adjournment. Prayer by J. W. Hendry. Proceeded to call the roll and correct the list of names,

On motion, the names of Keyeville, Spring Hill and Sand Hill were dropped from the roll.

The report of the Committee on Temperance was received, and after many appropriate remarks by Brethren Chaudoin, Hall, Bostick, Pylant, Simmons and others was adopted, as follows:

TEMPERANCE.

We feel assured that Intemperance in the use of intoxicating liquors is one, if, not the worst, of the gross sins that afflict the citizens of our beloved country; and it is enjoined upon the followers of the blessed Saviour to abstain from all appearance of evil, and to keep ourselves unspotted from the world, Therefore, we consider that Christians should not visit drinking saloons, or other places of dissipation, nor to use intoxicating drinks as a beverage; and we respectfully suggest that if any member of any church of this Association is guilty of indulging in the use of ardent spirits as a beverage, that such an one be made the subject

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON PREACHING.

Your Committee on Preaching report that Elder L. J. Simmons will preach the Introductory Sermon at the next session of our Association, and Elder W. W. Bostick, at 11 o'clock Thursday, on the subject of Missions.

The following brethren volunteered to attend the State Convention, to be held at Orlando, Fla., in December next: Rev. J. M. Hayman, Rev. L. J. Simmons, Rev. S. Walden, Rev. W. W. Bostick, Rev. R. T. Caddin, C. L. Wilder, E. G. Wilder, W. T. Denham, J. C. Blount, J. M. Eddens, I. O. Harris, O. J. Frier.

The following query was sent by County Line Church: "Has a minister any scriptural authority to receive and baptize a person without the authority of the church?"

After some remarks by S. Walden, R. N. Pylant, and W. W. Bostick denying, and L. J. Simmons, W. N. Chaudoin, and J. W. Hendry affirming, the question was tabled.

Query No. 2, from Six-Mile Pond: "Is it right to receive divorced married persons into the church if they have not a scriptural cause for separation?" Answer: No.

On motion, the following resolutions were adopted:

Whereas, Some of our sister churches in Hernando county think it best to organize a new Association, and desire letters from this body to do so;

Resolved, That we grant said churches the privilege to withdraw from us to form said Association, requesting them to report the same to us at our next session.

Resolved 2nd, That this body engage in prayer for Bro. C. S. Reynolds and his motherless childrent also, to pray for our churches.

Whereupon the Association engaged in prayer, Bro. G. W. Hall leading.

Resolved 3rd, That \$10.00 of Sunday's collection be appropriated to the Bible work of the American Baptist Publication Society, and the remainder be equally divided between Associational, State, Home and Foreign

Resolved 4th, That we have six hundred copies of the minutes of this session of our Association printed, and the Clerk draw on the Treasurer to defray the expenses of printing and distributing the same; and that he send to each church according to the amount contributed by each for that purpose; and that he receive \$15.00 for his services.

Resolved. That the Moderator tender the thanks of this body to the brethren, sisters and friends of this community for their kind entertainment to this body.

On motion, and after extending the parting hand, the Association adjourned to meet with the Bartow Church, at Bartow, in Polk county, on Wednesday before the third Sabbath in October, 1885.
