After a short absence the committee returned and reported that they cordially recommended the two churches received as sound in the faith. Upon motion the churches were received, the names of their delegates enrolled, and the right hand of fellowship was extended them by the Moderator pro tem.

It was moved and carried that the rules be suspended and that a vote by acclamation be taken on the permanent officers, D. C. Andress, Moderator, John O. Wingate, Clerk, and W. H. Peebles, Treasurer.

Bro. T. E. Wainright being present, a motion prevailed that he be received as a delegate from Deep Creek Church.

Upon extending the invitation to seats to visiting brethren by the Moderator, W. B. Bennett, of the Piedmont Association of Georgia, and Bro. J. C. Porter, of the State Missions at large, accepted the invitation.

It was moved and carried that Bro. T. E. Wainright assist the Moderator in appointing the committees.

Letters from corresponding bodies were then called for, but none were presented.

The Ruhama Church letter was read and H. R. Stewart, E. C. Gillett, J. M. Cooner and D. G. Caldwell enrolled as delegates.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON TEMPERANCE.

Your Committee on Temperance are pleased to report progress in the great and glorious work of ridding our land and country of the liquor traffic. We heartily commend all legitimate means being used to drive the open saloon from our midst. We urge our churches to withdraw fellowship from their members who drink intoxicating liquors as a beverage or who sign liquor petitions. It is the sense of this body that Christian men should refuse to vote for a whisky drinker to fill a public office. Let us adopt the only consistent plan and vote as we pray.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON PERIODICALS.

We recommend that all our members take and read the Florida Baptist Witness, also the Florida Missionary Journal and Home Field. For our Sunday schools we recommend the Convention series published at Nashville, Tenn., by the Sunday School Board of the Southern Baptist Convention.

REPORT OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

We, your Executive Committee, make the following report of our transactions during the year:

We employed Rev. D. Sikes part of the time. Days of labor, 54; miles traveled, 1,570; sermons preached, 56;

family visits, 45; baptized, 5; Sunday schools addressed, 3; collected, \$11.28; for which we paid him \$60.

We employed Rev. D. C. Andress for twelve months. He reports that great interest has been manifested in all of the meetings. Sermons preached, 24; miles traveled, 827; prayer meetings held, 16; funerals preached, 2; baptized, 4; collected, \$5.80; for which we paid him \$59.40.

We also employed Rev. J. A. Thompson part of the time. He reports that good meetings have been held in all of his appointments. He preached to the Buford Grove Church, and reports that 27 have been added to the church and two are awaiting baptism. The Board has paid him \$27, \$5 to the First Baptist Church of Port Henry and \$3 to A. E. Ogilvie for postage and services rendered. Received during the year, \$180.46; paid missionaries, \$154.40; balance on hand, \$26.06.

Resolved, That the thanks of this Association be hereby tendered to the brethren and sisters of Ruhama Church, and the friends of the community, for the kind and hospitable treatment received at their hands.

Rev. N. S. Wainright moved that the Clerk be paid \$10

for his services, which was amended by Rev. D. Sikes that he be paid \$7. The amendment prevailed.

Upon motion of Rev. N. S. Wainright, the Clerk was instructed to draw on the Treasurer to pay for the minutes, after using the money sent up by the churches for that purpose. Also to draw on the Treasurer for his salary.

Upon motion the Treasurer was added to the Executive Committee.

CONSTITUTION

...OF THE...

St. Mary's River Missionary Baptist Association.

PREAMBLE.

In view of the increase of fraternal love, knowledge, usefulness and efficiency which must accrue from an association of churches in cordial union upon the principles of the Gospel, we now seek to be thus united, that by individual and collective action we may subserve the great objects of the Redeemer's Kingdom.

ARTICLE 1. This body shall be called the St. Mary's River Baptist Association.

ART. 2. It should be composed of such churches as hold to the doctrine of human depravity, the atonement of Christ, the election unto eternal life, regeneration and the perseverance of the saints, baptism by immersion, administered to none but professed believers, and the Lord's Supper, intended for those only who have been regularly admitted into the visible church.

ART. 3. The officers of this Association shall consist of a Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer, who shall be elected annually by ballot.

ART. 4. We believe in only one true and living God, and that there are three persons in the Godhead.

ART. 5. We believe the Scripture of the Old and New Testaments to be the only rule of faith and practice, both in the concerns of religion and the general affairs of life, and particularly in transacting the affairs of our churches.

ART. 6. We believe the Church of Christ to be a con-
