Constitution of the New River Baptist Association

Article 1. This Association shall be known as the New River Missionary Baptist Association, and shall be composed of accredited messengers who are members of constituted churches, and of such others as may be invited to a seat by the consent of the body.

Art. 2. Each church in this Association shall be entitled to three messengers and one additional messenger for every twenty-five members in excess of fifty members. Any church wishing to sever its connection with this body may be allowed to do so upon an application duly made to the Association while in session, and a letter granted thereon. All members of standing committees shall be honorary members of this Association.

Art. 3. Churches are expected to send with their messengers letters to the Association, containing an account of their state, particularly of the additions and diminutions

of the last year, and other statistics of interest, together with full statistics of the Sunday schools under their charges. The letters should show what churches are doing for the cause of Christ at home and abroad, and generally whatever relates to their own peace and prosperity; and with them each church should forward money for the printing of the minutes, and also their contributions for missions.

Art. 4. Baptist churches desiring admission into this body shall petition by letters and messengers, and on giving satisfactory evidence of their being sound in their faith of the Gospel, and correct in practice, may be received by a vote of the Association; and the Moderator, in behalf of the body shall give their representatives the right hand of fellowship.

Art. 5. The offices of this Association shall be a Moderator, a Clerk, and a Treasurer, who shall be chosen by separate ballots, continue in office until others are chosen, and discharge the duties usually incumbent upon such officers.

Sec. 2. There shall be an Executive Committee, which shall be composed of seven members; the Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer of the Association being members and officers ex-officio, the other five members to be elected by the Association.

Art. 6. We acknowledge the independence of particular churches, and that no authority or jurisdiction is to be exercised over them by this Association, and therefore we would disclaim all power of making laws for them under any pretext whatever, but we deem it our duty to disown any church that we may consider unworthy of our fellowship.

Art. 7. This Association will be governed while in session by regular and proper rules and every motion made and seconded shall command attention to the body unless withdrawn by the mover.

Art. 8. Every question asked in the letters from the churches must be based on Scriptures, and may relate to the

faith, practice and church discipline, but the same shall not be taken under consideration except by a majority vote of the body.

Art. 9. Churches composing this Association shall be entitled to as many copies of the minutes of its proceedings as the money sent up with the letters call for, but each constituent church shall have at least one copy.

Art. 10. When a church shall neglect to make a communication to the Association for at least three years it shall be considered as having withdrawn and shall be dropped by a vote from the minutes, unless two or three members of the Association request its continuance and will engage to inquire into its standing and report at the next meeting of the Association.

Art. 11. It shall be the duty of the Association, from time to time, to suggest to the churches what they think most expedient to be done to promote the spread of the Gospel in the world, and to give the best advice possible in cases of difficulty, and to inquire into the cause or failure on the part of any church to report itself by letter and messenger at the annual meeting.

Art. 12. This Association, when convenient shall appoint the time and place of the next annual meeting—taking into account the convenience of the churches and the interest of the cause. This Constitution may be altered from time to time as experience may suggest, by a two-thirds vote of those present.

Minutes

Proceedings of the Fifty-fourth Annual Session of the New River Association, which convened with Starke church, October 30th, 1925.

Introductory sermon at 11:00 a. m. by Rev. S. S. Proctor, from 12th Chapter Romans.

Noon, refreshments.

Met pursuant to adjournment at 1:30. Moderator read 24th Psalm and prayer was offered by Brother C. A. Crosby.

Call for letters and enrolling messengers was next in order.

A motion was made and carried to dispense with the reading of letters and a committee on digest of letters was appointed as follows: J. W. L. Pinholster, L. C. Powell and J. S. Norman.

Election of officers was next in order which resulted in the election of Brother J. T. Quigley, Moderator, J. T. Barnes, Vice Moderator and D. W. Moore Clerk and Treasurer.

Brother J. W. Mitchell was present and recorded as correspondent from Jacksonville Association.

Call for petitionary letters: Antioch and Brooker churches presented letters asking for admission, which were received and the moderator extended the right hand of fellowship to their representatives welcoming them to New River Association.

The newly elected moderator came forward and took up his duties by appointing committees, and while so engaged Brother Mitchell addressed the Association in the interest of the Witness.

Brother Barnes read his report on Sunday Schools and discussed same. Brother Proctor made a talk on same subject.

A motion was made and carried that the clerk amend this report with information sent in by the letters.

Chairman of Executive Committee made his report and was discussed and adopted as read.

The Secretary of Evangelistic Brotherhood made a report to the Association, Brotherhood was recognized and report adopted as read.

A motion was made and carried to appoint a budget committee which the Moderator did.

Committee on religious exercises reported that Brother Barnes preach tonight and Brother Harry Lewis lead in devotional exercises 9:30 tomorrow, and that Dr. Bullen preach at 11:00.

Adjournment.

SATURDAY MORNING

Moderator called the association to order.

A motion was made and carried to add to standing committees a committee on the orphanage.

Introductory sermon and evening sermon for the first day.

A motion was made and carried that a committee be appointed to draft resolutions of appreciation for the services rendered this Association by the retiring moderator, Rev. L. W. Kickliter.

Committee on digest of letters made their report which was adopted.

Treasurer made his report and was adopted as read. Association gave way for preaching, 11:00 o'clock, after which refreshments were served.

Moderator called Association to order at one o'clock. A motion was made and carried that the budget be referred back to the churches and for them to let the chairman know by December 1st.

Brother J. W. L. Pinholster was appointed chairman budget committee.

Mrs. F. A. Scott made her report on woman's work.

Committee on deceased ministers and deacons made their report and was adopted.

The committee on temperance not being present a

motion was made and carried that they mail in the report to the clerk and the same be printed in minutes.

Committee on finances reported \$76.52 from all sources. A motion was made and carried that the committee on temperance be made a standing committee.

Resolutions of thanks were voted Starke for their kindness and generous hospitality shown us during our stay with them.

Brother J. T. Barnes was elected member state board missions.

The following were elected messengers to State convention: D. W. Moore, Thos. Hansen, E. L. Wilson, J. T. Quigley, L. W. Kickliter.

Rev. Thos. Hansen was elected delegate Southern Baptist Convention, which meets in Houston, Texas.

The following were elected executive committee: J. T. Barnes, L. W. Kickliter, J. L. Harrell, J. W. L. Pinholster, J. L. Norris, D. W. Moore, J. T. Quigley.

Association adjourned to meet with Hope Church at Theresia, Florida, on October 27th, 1926. C. A. Crosby to preach the introductory sermon and Rev. P. J. Carrin preach at the night service.

SABBATH SCHOOL REPORT

We, your committee, rejoice to report, that the Sabbath School interest has increased during this associational year.

We find that out of the 14 churches, that 9 have Sabbath Schools, with an enrollment, approximating about 550 pupils. Each church that has made reports to our union meetings show that there has been better and a more regular attendance in their Sunday schools this year than last year. This certainly is inspiring. If each church would send messengers with the report of the Sunday School work done in their church, we would make a more accurate report, besides this would be a great stimulus, to the Sabbath School work.

We find that from the best information, that there has been about \$550 contributed for missions, from the Sunday Schools; and about \$555.48 for Sunday school expense. These figures are not what they should be; but considering the few consecrated Christians, that labored diligently and with untiring energy to accomplish this; we can only say well done, good and faithful ones, you certainly have the missionary cause at heart.

We, your committee wish, to say to those churches that have no Sabbath Schools, that you are not filling the mission for which you were constituted. Every church in this

Association were constituted as a Missionary Baptist Church; and should be earnestly engaged in teaching missions; and there is no better way to teach missions than in the Sabbath School.

We your committee wish to say, that in and around every church that has no Sabbath School the immoral influences seems to predominate, because the people and children are taught the great moral and spiritual principles of the Holy bible. It is our great privilege to teach and train our children these great principles.

May God's Holy Spirit wake up every church in this association to its full duty in the work of teaching God's word to dying men and women, who are lost in sin.

MISSIONS

The crowning glory of Southern Baptist people is the splendid missionary zeal that has characterized them throughout the years. As Baptists we recognize our responsibility to God to carry out the great commission of our Lord and to seize the opportunities God places before us for carrying out this last command. In obedience to the spirit and the will of Christ he must claim the souls of men in all the world for our Redeemer.

The wonderful way in which God has blessed the labors of our workmen in foreign fields should move us to maintain the ground already taken for Christ, and to put forth greater efforts to advance our work in all parts of the field, which is the world. This, however, we have not been able to do; for in order to hold what we have already won it has been necessary for our Boards to incur large and distressing debts leaving not the slightest chance to increase our activities along any part of the far-flung battle line. Our present situation in this respect is most serious, and should receive the prayerful attention of all our people.

We suggest that much earnest prayer be given in both our homes and our churches that the gifts of the people for this great work of the Kingdom may be increased, that all debts be paid and that sufficient money be given to carry on the work on a largely increased scale. This great task must lie upon our hearts more heavily than it has ever in the past. The least we can do for those who leave home and friends and go into the blighted places of the earth because of their love for Jesus and lost men is to support them by our prayers and our gifts.
