CONSTITUTION OF THE NEW RIVER BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

Article 1. This association shall be known as the New River Missionary Baptist Association and shall be composed of accredited messengers who are members of constituted churches and of such others as may be invited to a seat by the consent of the body. An accredited messenger shall be one who has been duly elected by his church as a messenger or alternate. Others eligible to be invited to a seat shall be members of the constituted churches, who may be enrolled to make a number equal to the quota allowed that church. All pastors of the churches in the Association shall be enrolled as messengers but only those holding membership in constituted churches of the Association shall be eligible for office.

Article 2. Each church in this Association shall be entitled to three Messengers and one additional messenger for every twenty-five members in excess of fifty members. Any church wishing to sever its connection with this body may be allowed to do so upon an application duly made to the Association while in session, and a letter granted thereon. All members of standing committees shall be honorary members of this Association.

Article 3. Churches are expected to send with their messengers letters to the Association, containing an account of their state, particularly of the additions and dimunitions of the past year, and other statistics of interest, together with full statistics of the Sunday School under their charges. The letter should show what churches are doing for the cause of Christ at home and abroad, and generally whatever relates to their own peace and prosperity; and with them each church should forward money for the printing of the minutes and also for their contributions for missions.

Article 4. Baptist churches desiring admission into this body shall petition by letter and messengers, and on giving satisfactory evidence of their being sound in their faith of the Gospel, and correct in practice, may be received by a vote of the Association at the annual meeting and the Moderator be authorized to extend the right hand of fellowship in behalf of the Association.

Article 5. Section 1. The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, an Associate Moderator, a Clerk-Treasurer, each of whom shall be chosen by separate ballot. These officers shall be elected at the opening session of the annual meeting.

Article 5. Section 2. There shall be an Executive Committee composed of: (a) The officers of the Association, (b) All pastors of churches cooperating with the Association, provided they hold membership in some church in the Association, (c) Associational Sunday School Superintendent. (d) Associational Training Union Director, (e) Associational W. M. U. President, (f) Associational Brotherhood President and Music Director, (g) Any church without a pastor who represents them on the board may

elect one member to represent them, who shall conduct all business of this Association between annual meetings. A quorum shall be 10 members.

Article 6. We acknowledge the independence of particular churches, and that no authority or jurisdiction is to be exercised over them by this Association, and therefore we would disclaim all power of making laws for them under any pretext whatsoever, but deem it our duty to disown any church that we may consider unworthy of our fellowship.

Article 7. This Association will be governed while in session by regular and proper rules and every motion made and seconded shall command attention of the body unless withdrawn by the mover.

Article 8. Every question asked in the letters from the churches must be based on the Scriptures and may relate to faith, practice and church discipline, but the same shall not be taken under consideration except by a majority vote of the body.

Article 9. Churches composing this Association shall be entitled to as many copies of the minutes of its proceedings as the money sent up with the letters call for, but each constituent church shall have at least one copy.

Article 10. When a church shall neglect to make a communication to the Association for at least three years it shall be considered as having withdrawn and shall be dropped by a vote from the minutes, unless two or three members of the Association request its continuance and will engage to inquire into its standing and report at the next meeting of the Association.

Article 11. It shall be the duty of the Association, from time to time, to suggest to the churches what they think most expedient to be done to promote the spread of the Gospel in the world, and to give the best advice possible in case of difficulty, and to inquire into the cause of failure on the part of any church to report itself by letter and messenger at the annual meeting.

Article 12. The Association shall hold its sessions annually at such time and place as the Association may elect. The Executive Committee, however, shall be authorized to make such changes in either time or place of meeting as may be found to be expedient. This Constitution may be amended at any annual meeting by a two-thirds vote, provided that notice of such change shall have been given to the Executive Committee not later than the last Executive Committee meeting previous to the Association meeting and that notice of such change be given to the Association on the first day of such meeting.

BY - LAWS

In order to carry out the provisions of the Constitution, the following By-Laws are hereby adopted for the government of the New River Baptist Association: Article I. The fiscal year shall run from October 1 to September 30th.

Article II. The Moderator of the Association shall appoint at the beginning of each annual meeting a Committee on Committees, whose duty shall be to nominate the following Committees to report at the present meeting:

- 1. Committee on Time, Place and Preacher for next meeting.
- -2. Committee on application for membership and dismissal, when needed.
 - 3. Committee on Resolutions.
- 4. Committee on Nominations, whose duty shall be to nominate: (a) Associational Sunday School Superintendent, (b) Associational Training Union Director, (c) Associational President of the W. M. U., (d) Associational President of Brotherhood and Music, (e) a person to present a written report at next meeting on each of the various objects fostered by the Association.

Article III. The Clerk shall keep records of the proceedings; print and distribute Minutes: keep file of Minutes, which shall be turned over to the successor.

Article IV. The officers of the Association shall be the officers of the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee shall meet monthly, except when it feels there is no need for the meeting, at which time written reports from the different officers and committees shall be presented. The Executive Committee shall appoint the following standing committees on: Sunday School, Training Union, Evangelism, Woman's Missionary Union, Brotherhoods, Music and such other committees as it needs to carry out its work. The Executive Committee shall appoint a Committee to prepare a budget, including all expenditures of all departments of the work and submit same to the Association at its annual meeting for approval.

Article V. The Program Committee shall be the Moderator, Clerk, and Pastor of the host Church.

Article VI. These By-Laws may be altered or amended in the same manner as the Constitution.

- Missionary advance must continue! The American Bible Society, working with Southern Baptist mission agencies in their Advance Program for worldwide missions, joins in reporting that advance has begun,

During 1950 the American Bible Society distributed through its own work, at home and abroad, more than 11 million volumes of Scriptures. Another 3 million volumes were produced through gifts of materials and money to Bible Societies of other countries, especially Germany and Japan, bringing the grand total to more than 14 million volumes for the year;

supplied Testaments in 9 different languages for United Nations forces in Korea;

-started printing 2 million service Testaments for our own expanding armed forces; in Japan, distributed 3 million volumes, which was the goal for 1950, making the total distribution in Japan since World War II, more than 6 million volumes.

Brother Willis gave an oral report stressing the fact that our B. T. U. leaders need the faith, prayer, and backing of the pastors and churches to carry on the work in our Association.

Our Association has a Sunday School in every church, also with an increase in enrollment.

We have had 11 Vacation Bible Schools with an enrollment of 736. This is an increase of 5 schools and 280 in enrollment.

Next year's plans call for 4 group Training meetings to be held November 5-9 with all churches cooperating.

THE SOUTHERN BAPTIST THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY

For the first time in its history, Southern Seminary last year saw its enrollment go beyond 1,000, reaching a total of 1,008 men. Students from the School of Church Music and the WMU Training School increased to more than 1200 the number attending the Seminary's classes,

Careful study is being made of the possibility of a School of Religious Education to provide specialized training in this field. There is need also for enlargement of the buildings and facilities of the School of Church Music

to accommodate a growing enrollment.

Southern Seminary is grateful to Southern Baptists, who, through the Cooperative Program and under the leadership of God, are the dependence for the ongoning of the institution.

SOUTHWESTERN BAPTIST THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY

The gross enrollment of Southwestern Seminary for the 1950-51 session is 2,315, highest in the history of the institution. 259 graduated at the commencement May 4. 366 were sent out this year into the various fields of service calling for trained and consecrated leadership. The faculty of the three schools of the Seminary is now composed of 42.

The spirit of missions continues to move with great power through the life of the Seminary. Fifty-eight have been appointed for mission service this year: 41 foreign missionaries and 17 home missionaries. During the years of the full history of the Seminary 422 missionaries have gone out to foreign fields, while 298 have gone to home fields. The number of volunteers for mission service in the current student body has reached 416, which is one-fourth

God is speaking with clarion call to Southern Baptists through the lips of the young men and women who are thronging the halls of our seminaries. Woe betide us if we are deaf to God and to them!

NEW ORLEANS BAPTIST THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY

The student body has almost doubled in five years. There were 667 students enrolled during the 1950-51 session, coming from 27 states and seven foreign territories.

The standards of the New Orleans Seminary for faculty scholarship, curriculum requirements and attainments of degrees are practically identical with those of the other older seminaries of the Southern Baptist Convention.

Degrees are given only to those with college degrees. A warm welcome is given those who have not college credits and a large place is made for them.

There is no debt. There is little endowment. The Seminary charges no tuition to students. Therefore, an endowment of two million dollars or more should be built up as rapidly as possible. The building program is being financed through the "capital needs program" of the Cooperative Program. We urgently advise all to support the Cooperative Program through their churches. Current operations are maintained by the Southern Paptist Convention allocation of \$200,000.00, to pay salaries, insurance, maintenance of mission buses, upkeep of buildings, and other costs.

There is an excellent chance for ordained ministers to find studentpastoral work in the vicinity of New Orleans. In 1950-51 there were 269 student-pastors, and a host of others working in various missions. The students preach to more than 30,000 people on the average every week.

That the churches continue to cooperate in promoting the work of the Sunday School, B. T. U. and W. M. U. Music and Brotherhood.

That we give a rising vote of thanks to Bayless Highway Church for their kind hospitality, which helped so much to make the meeting a success.

Whereas, we recommend the Baptist Bible Institute at Lakeland, and whereas this Institute strongly advocates World Missions and the support of Co-operative Program, whereas we recommend this institution to any

one entering the ministry with limited education.

We recommend the support of the Baptist hour broadcast, and that all of the churches support it by their prayer and contributions. This resolution referred to the executive committee by vote.

That we support the American Bible Society by prayer and contributions

among our churches.

Resolution regarding teaching practice of certain professors in Stetson University was referred to the executive committee.

- Because We as Christians and members of the New River Baptist Association representing 20 churches and well over 3,000 members do not believe in, nor wish to condone such practices; and
- Whereas, we are now assembled in regular annual meeting at the Bayless Highway Baptist Church of New River Assoc, and Bradford County with all of the 20 churches represented at this meeting.
- 1. That we go on record as supporting all laws and law enforcing officers both local and national in an endeavor to break up such vice rackets;
- 2. That we go on record as specifically endorsing the current program in Bradford County and urge those Pastors and members living in Bradford County to support this program to its fullest with prayer and participation.
- Be it Further resloved:-that a copy of this resolution be sent to all churches of the Assoc. in Bradford County.
