CONSTITUTION OF THE NEW RIVER BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

Article 1. This association shall be known as the New River Missionary Baptist Association and shall be composed of accredited messengers who are members of constituted churches and of such others as may be invited to a seat by the consent of the body. An accredited messenger shall be one who has been duly elected by his church as a messenger or alternate. Others eligible to be invited to a seat shall be members of the constituted churches, who may be enrolled to make a number equal to the quota allowed that church. All pastors of the churches in the Association shall be enrolled as messengers but only those holding membership in constituted churches of the Association shall be eligible for office.

Article 2. Each church in this Association shall be entitled to three Messengers and one additional messenger for every twenty-five members in excess of fifty members. Any church wishing to sever its connection with this body may be allowed to do so upon an application duly made to the Association while in session, and a letter granted thereon. All members of standing committees shall be honorary members of this Association.

Article 3. Churches are expected to send with their messengers letters to the Association, containing an account of their state, particularly of the additions and dimunitions of the past year, and other statistics of interest, together with full statistics of the Sunday School under their charges. The letter should show what churches are doing for the cause of Christ at home and abroad, and generally whatever relates to their own peace and prosperity; and with them each church should forward money for the printing of the minutes and also their contributions for missions.

Article 4. Baptist churches desiring admission into this body shall petition by letter and messengers, and on giving satisfactory evidence of their being sound in their faith of the Gospel, and correct in practice, may be received by a vote of the Association at the annual meeting and the Moderator be authorized to extend the right hand of fellowship in behalf of the Association.

Article 5. Section 1. The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, an Associate Moderator, a Clerk-Treasurer, each of whom shall be chosen by seperate ballot. These officers shall be elected at the opening session of the annual meeting.

Article 5. Section 2. There shall be an Executive Committee composed of: (a) The officers of the Association, (b) All pastors of churches cooperating with the Association, provided they hold membership in some church in the Association. (c) Associational Sunday School Superintendent, (d) Associational Training Union Director (e) Associational W. M. U. President, (f) Associational Brotherhood President and Music Director,

(g) Any church without a pastor who represents them on the board may elect one member to represent them, who shall conduct all business of this Association between annual meetings. A quorum shall be 10 members.

Article 6. We acknowledge the independence of particular churches and that no authority or jurisdiction is to be exercised over them by this Association, and therefore we would disclaim all power of making laws for them under any pretext whatsoever, but deem it our duty to disown any church that we may consider unworthy of our fellowship.

Article 7. This Association will be governed while in session by regular and proper rules and every motion made and seconded shall command attention of the body unless withdrawn by the mover.

Article 8. Every question asked in the letters from the churches must be based on the Scriptures and may relate to faith, practice and church discipline, but the same shall not be taken under consideration except by a majority vote of the body.

Article 9. Churches composing this Association shall be entitled to as many copies of the minutes of its proceedings as the money sent up with the letters call for, but each constituent church shall have at least one copy.

Article 10. When a church shall neglect to make a communication to the Association for at least three years it shall be considered as having withdrawn and shall be dropped by a vote from the minutes, unless two or three members of the Association request its continuance and will engage to inquire into its standing and report at the next meeting of the Association.

Article 11. It shall be the duty of the Association, from time to time, to suggest to the churches what they think most expedient to be done to promote the spread of the Gospel in the world, and to give the best advice possible in case of difficulty, and to inquire into the cause of failure on the part of any church to report itself by letter and messenger at the annual meeting.

Article 12. The Association shall hold its sessions annually at such time and place as the Association may elect. The Executive Committee, however, shall be authorized to make such changes in either time or place of meeting as may be found to be expedient. This Constitution may be amended at any annual meeting by a two-thirds vote, provided that notice of such change shall have been given to the Executive Committee not later than the last Executive Committee meeting previous to the Association meeting and that notice of such change be given to the Association on the first day of such meeting.

BY - LAWS

In order to carry out the provisions of the Constitution, the following By-Laws are hereby adopted for the government of the New River Baptist Association:

Article I. The fiscal year shall run from October 1 to September 30th.

Article II. The Moderator of the Association shall appoint at the beginning of each annual meeting a Committee on Committees, whose duty shall be to nominate the following Committees to report at the present meeting:

- 1. Committee on Time, Place and Preacher for next meeting.
- 2. Committee on application for membership and dismissal, when needed.
 - 3. Committee on Resolutions.
- 4. Committee on Nominations, whose duty shall be to nominate: (a) Associational Sunday School Superintendent, (b) Associational Training Union Director, (c) Associational President of the W. M. U., (d) Associational President of Brotherhood and Music, (e) a person to present a written report at the next meeting on each of the various objects fostered by the Association.

Article III. The Clerk shall keep records of the proceedings; print and distribute Minutes: keep file of Minutes, which shall be turned over to the successor.

Article IV. The officers of the Association shall be the officers of the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee shall meet monthly, except when it feels there is no need for the meeting, at which time written reports from the different officers and committees shall be presented. The Executive Committee shall appoint the following standing committees on: Sunday School, Training Union, Evangelism, Woman's Missionary Union, Brotherhoods, Music and such other committees as it needs to carry out its work. The Executive Committee shall appoint a Committee to prepare a budget, including all expenditures of all departments of the work and submit same to the Association at its annual meeting for approval.

Article V. The Program Committee shall be the Moderator, Clerk, and Pastor of the host Church.

Article VI. These By-Laws may be altered or amended in the same manner as the Constitution.

The place of the seminary takes on added importance in the life of the Southern Baptist Convention as the times continue to change.

It should be a matter of concern to Southern Baptists that the more than twenty thousand ministers in the denomination fall into three groups: About one-third have seminary training, about one-third have had high school and college training, and one out of three has not finished high school.

SOUTHERN BAPTIST SEMINARY Louisville, Ky., Duke K. McCall, President

This Seminary was founded in 1858, at first an independent school, but the men who established it were Southern Baptists and the school has always belonged spiritually, and for long has belonged physically, to the Southern Baptist Convention. The enrollment last year was over 1100, with Negroes being admitted for the first time.

SOUTHWESTERN BAPTIST SEMINARY Forth Worth, Texas, E. D. Head, President

Although the seminary at Forth Worth, founded in 1908, has a larger enrollment than Southern, its assets are considerable less, totalling less than seven million dollars, with buildings and equipment at not quite four million. Thus it is easy to see that Southwestern stands in need of assistance in caring for the ever increasing number of students. The enrollment was almost 2100 in 1951-52. Of these over 700 were in the School of Religious Education, a very important section of our Southern Baptist leadership of tomorrow.

NEW ORLEANS BAPTIST SEMINARY New Orleans, La., Roland Q. Leavell, President

With over seven hundred enrolled and a plant worth nearly four million dollars, New Orleans is taking its place with the two older schools of the convention. Its educational standards are, of course, just as high, and in some instances, such as the Practical Activities Department which encourages students to evangelistic work which brings some 1500 souls under the banner of Christ each year, it exceeds the others.

The school moves this year into a new campus which will more adequately care for the needs of the student body, but the great need for this school is endowment, since it has only \$120,000 endowment, the returns of only three thousand of which can be used for current expenses.

Over a hundred and fifty were graduated from New Orleans this year, a great contribution to our Southern Paptist life.

GOLDEN GATE BAPTIST SEMINARY Berkeley, Calif., B. O. Herring, President

This is one of our new seminaries, filling a great need in the West. With over two hundred enrolled, as compared with 31 five years ago, this school has a great need for additional building space, greater operating endowment, and enlarged faculty. Dr. Herring says, "We appeal to our denominational leaders, planmakers, and people, all to hold their hands in prayerful and material support of our task."

SOUTHEASTERN BAPTIST SEMINARY Wake Forest, N. C., S. L. Stealy, President

Our newest seminary opened in the fall of 1951 on the campus of Wake Forest college, which has been bought by the Convention for the seminary. It has 85 students enrolled, and must operate in a very limited way until the college moves in the near future. This new school drew upon all the older seminaries for faculty members, and from the start it is equipped to offer the best in theological education.

AMERICAN BAPTIST SEMINARY Nashville, Tennessee, Ralph W. Riley, President

This is a seminary for Negro ministerial education, operated by the National Baptist Convention, and subsidized by the Southern Baptist Convention. This year we will supply over a hundred thousand dollars to this school for operating funds. It has an enrollment of 150; buildings and equipment valued at about half a million dollars. The need for theological education among our colored brethern is acute, and provisions are tragically limited. Our contributions to this school is a genuine service to the Kingdom of God.

1953 PROGRAM OF EVANGELISM

Florida's 1953 Program of Evangelism is absolutely identical with the program we followed last year. Because of the diversity of the weather and agricultural conditions, we are not recommending a STATEWIDE EVANGELISTIC CRUSADE, but we are suggesting that there be thirty-eight ASSOCIATION-WIDE CRUSADES. Instead of all our churches and all our associations using one date, this matter of a date will be left up to the association. The date for your Association-wide Simultaneous Campaign should be set not later than the meeting of your association in October. Please see that the date is sent in to the Cooperative Missions Department in Jacksonville.

The organization set-up for the association remains the same. That is, each association elects a Chairman of Evangelism.

Plans are under way for the fifth, annual, Statewide Evangelistic Conference to be held again this year in the First Baptist Church, Jacksonville, January 13-15, 1953.

We encourage each church to have a council on evangelism, composed of the pastor and heads of each church agency, to plan a program of evangelism a year in advance.

Each church is urged to have two revivals a year, one in connection with your association-wide evangelistic effort.

OUR ASSOCIATIONAL RECORD

Our records show that 17 churches held revivals during the 1951-52 Convention year.

Our churches reported 145 baptisms during the year. There were 6 churches reporting no baptisms.
