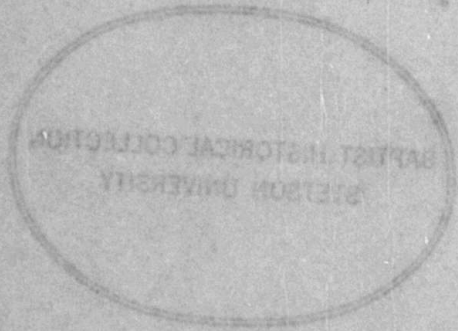

CONSTITUTION
OF THE
NEW RIVER BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

ARTICLE I — NAME

This Association shall be known as the New River Missionary Baptist Association and shall be composed of accredited messengers who are members of constituted churches. An accredited messenger shall be one who has been duly elected by his church as a messenger or alternate. All pastors of the churches in the Association shall be enrolled as messengers but only those holding membership in constituted churches of the Association shall be eligible for office.

ARTICLE II — MESSENGERS

Each church in this Association shall be entitled to three messengers and one additional messenger for every twenty-five members in excess of fifty members. All Churches are expected to send with their messengers letters to the Association containing an account of their state on regular form used by the State Convention and the Association with all questions answered and remarks where necessary. These letters should be forwarded to the Clerk two weeks in advance of the annual meeting when possible. The churches proportionate amount to the Association Budget should accompany the Annual Letter whenever possible. The Associational Year shall be from October 1st to September 30th.

ARTICLE III — CHURCHES

Section 1. Baptist churches desiring admission into this body shall notify the Executive Committee at least one month prior to the Annual Meeting of the Association and shall petition by letter and messengers to the Association. On giving satisfactory evidence of their being sound in faith and the Gospel, and correct in practice, and in harmony with the work of the Association, may be received by a vote of the Association at the annual meeting and the Moderator be authorized to extend the right hand of fellowship in behalf of the Association.

Section 2. The Association acknowledges the independence of the individual churches and that no authority or jurisdiction is to be exercised over them by this Association and therefore disclaims all power of making laws for them under any pretext whatsoever, but deems it its duty to exclude any church that may be considered unworthy of fellowship. No church shall be excluded however without a thorough investigation by the executive Committee and vote of the Association at the Annual Meeting.

Section 3. When a church shall neglect to make a communication to the Association for at least two years, it shall be considered as having withdrawn and shall be dropped by vote from the minutes unless the Executive Committee recommends its continuance for one year. Any church wishing to sever its connection with this body may be allowed

to do so upon an application duly made to the Association while in session, and a letter granted thereon.

ARTICLE IV — REGULATIONS

The Association shall hold its sessions annually at such time and place as the Association may elect and while in session will be governed by Roberts Rules of Order. The Executive Committee, however, shall be authorized to make such changes in either time or place of meeting as may be found to be expedient.

ARTICLE V — DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The Officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, Vice Moderator and Clerk-Treasurer, each of whom shall be chosen by separate ballot. These officers shall be elected at the opening session of the Annual Meeting and take office at the close of the meeting. The Moderator and Vice-Moderator cannot serve more than two years in succession.

Section 2. Duties of the Officers: [a] The Moderator shall preside over all meetings of the Association throughout the year. He shall also act as Chairman of the Executive Committee. During the year he shall seek to promote the harmony of the individual churches and moderate with unbiased leadership whenever invited. In general, his duties will be those of any President of an Assembly. Prior to the Association meeting he shall appoint the Committee on Committees, the Budget Committee and any other committee on authority of the Executive Committee, that shall expedite the work of the Association.

[b] The Vice Moderator's duties will be those ascribed to him by the Moderator and to serve in the capacity of the Moderator during his absence from any meeting or at any time requested. If during the term of service the Moderator should move from the Association or his service to the Association be lost, the Vice-Moderator shall assume the place of Moderator.

[c] The Clerk-Treasurer shall keep an accurate record of the proceedings of all Association meetings including a separate record of the Executive Committee. It shall be his duty to prepare and distribute the minutes of the Annual Meeting, to keep a file of the minutes yearly and to co-operate both with the State Convention and the Moderator and churches. He shall also receive all funds from the churches and from any meetings, or any other source, and disburse same according to the budget, and or, by direction of the Executive Committee. He shall also keep a record on all funds received and disbursed and report to the Executive Committee at each meeting and to the Annual Meeting of the Association. A complete record of his term of office and all previous records received by him shall be turned over to his successor in office at the close of the Annual Meeting.

ARTICLE VI — DUTIES OF COMMITTEES

Section 1. [a] The Committee on Committees shall appoint a Nominations Committee, a Time, Place and Preacher Committee and a

Resolutions Committee and these to report at the Annual Association Meeting. [b] The Nominations Committee shall nominate the Sunday School Superintendent; the Training Union Director; President of Woman's Missionary Union; President of Brotherhood; Director of Music; Superintendent of Evangelism. [c] The Time, Place and Preacher Committee shall nominate the time and place for next Annual Meeting and the Preachers to bring the Annual Sermons and their alternates. [d] The Resolutions Committee shall receive all resolutions to be brought to the Annual Meeting and shall bring as a recommendation any resolutions to be acted on at the meeting and all other resolutions shall be brought for consideration. [e] The Program Committee shall be composed of the Moderator, Clerk-Treasurer, Pastor of the host churches and any others advisable to assist in preparing the program. [f] The Budget Committee shall prepare the budget of the Association including all expenditures of all departments of the work and recommended apportionment to each church and submit same to the Association at its Annual Meeting for approval.

Section 2. The Executive Committee: The Executive Committee of the Association shall be composed of: [a] The officers of the Association, [b] All Pastors of churches members of the Association, and [c] Heads of all departments elected by the Association, and [d] one layman elected by each church in the Association. The Duties of the Executive Committee shall be those ascribed by the Association and it shall conduct all business of the Association between Annual Meetings. The Committee shall organize itself into special committees at any time it is necessary to expedite the work of the Association and is authorized to fill all vacancies which may occur during the Associational year. The Committee shall meet monthly and a quorum for business shall be 14 members.

ARTICLE VII — AMENDMENTS

This Constitution may be amended at any annual meeting by a two-thirds vote provided that notice of such change shall have been given to the Executive Committee not later than the last Executive Committee meeting previous to the Association meeting and that notice of such change be given to the Association on the first day of such meeting.

BY-LAWS

I. An Association Missions Committee to be composed of 5 members with one member elected each year to serve a 5 year period or until removal from the Association membership or residency or dismissal for nonattendance at 3 meetings during a year. When a vacancy occurs it shall be filled at the annual meeting for the length of the unexpired term. The members of this committee shall be nominated by the Nominating Committee and elected by the Association.

The duties of the committee shall be to work in cooperation with other Missions Committees of the District and to report to the Annual Associational meeting and Executive Committee during the year.

Dear Brethren:

During the past year your Superintendent of Missions has traveled a total of 21,101 miles, visited 115 churches and missions, 9 pastors conferences, 23 associational meetings, attended the Florida Baptist Convention at Pensacola, Evangelistic Conference at Jacksonville, Home Missions Week at Ridgecrest, School of the Prophets at Panama City, as required. Attended Southern Baptist Convention at Houston, conducted three eight day revivals outside the District, as allowed, and one revival within the District. There were 455 re-dedications, 129 new tithers, 17 for baptism, 8 by letter to total 25.

Attended 26 committee meetings, 15 prayer meetings, taught 15 classes, gave out 1221 tracts and Scriptures, mailed 1179 bulletins and letters, sermons and addresses 94, special study courses 4 weeks, besides at least 225 conferences with pastors and members concerning our work, 1 Church community survey, 2 church surveys.

The report was adopted.

Rev. Stedham made the following recommendations to the associations which were accepted:

1. At this meeting, please name your Associational Missions Committee for the coming year, and allow them to become a part of our District Missions Committee.

2. At this meeting, please request each church to make a budget for the coming year and to include at least a tithe of the church's income for "World Missions". Cutting our Mission Gifts to save money is like fasting in order to gain strength.

3. At this meeting, please plan an Associational Missions Budget that will take care of travel and postage for the respective heads of all departments.

4. If you haven't already, will you please set the dates for the 1959 Crusade? This should have been done months back. Dr. Paul Meigs, is anxious for these dates.

5. In all of our work, don't you think that our churches should strive earnestly to work together in every way possible in order to strengthen our Work? Especially in the matter of simultaneous effort because greater effort becomes stronger effort and therefore, much more effective.

6. Now, we seek to be Scriptural about most everything else in our church-life, let us be Scriptural and "Bring ye all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be meat in mine house, and prove me now herewith, saith the Lord of hosts, if I will not open you the windows of heaven, and pour you out a blessing, that there shall not be room enough to receive it." —Malachi 3:10.

Convention go on record as protesting this action of the said Supreme Court, also as protesting the use of the armed forces or any other forces to effect this said declaration of the Supreme Court of the United States.

Be it further resolved that a copy of this Resolution be sent to each Association in the Florida Baptist Convention, also that a copy be sent to each newspaper covering this area, and a copy sent to Governor of the State of Florida.

7. Whereas, the Roman Catholic leaders of our country have and are continually seeking Federal aid for their schools, Hospitals, etc.

Whereas, the Southern Baptist have always stood for separation of church and state

Be it resolved — That the New River Association go on record as opposed to a Roman Catholic as president of our great country

Be it further resolved—that the leaders of the Democratic Party of Florida be informed of this stand in the light of statements made recently by the Governor of Florida and at least one U. S. Senator from Florida, that there would be no objection to a Roman Catholic for the Presidency, so far as his religious belief is concerned.
