Report Approved

Rev. John Dicks presented an amendment to the Associational Constitution—constitution printed in minutes of former years—amending section 9 to read: "We earnestly request that all churches in this association give their pastors full time

to attend all of our associational meetings from beginning to adjournment, and that they assist and encourage them in doing so."

Dr. A. M. Bennett called attention to the indebtedness of the State Mission Board—now about \$30,000—and urged all to make liberal offerings for relief by the fifteenth of December, or at latest before the last of December, when the books of the treasurer of the board will close for the convention year. He distributed individual pledge cards, which members of the Layman's Committee were urged to distribute to members of their own churches.

THE LAYMAN'S COMMITTEE

This is a personal appeal to every member.

It is the earnest wish that the Layman's Committee shall be organized at our next union meeting at Lulu in December.

A special and very important work that has already been defined for each member is to work the budget of appeal so that it may be effective in every church and plan for this will be presented at the meeting for organization.

REPORT OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Your Executive Committee met shortly after the meeting of the association at Lake City, and organized for the year's

work.

Dean W. B. Jones was made chairman, and C. M. Ray, secretary.

Rev. J. R. Eubanks was elected missionary evangelist of the association for one half time at a salary of fifty dollars per month.

Good work was done and, with the aid of other brethren two new churches were constituted—Guilford, between Lulu and Lake Butler, and Pleasant Hill, about 10 miles south of Lake City.

Our missionary did a great work at Oak Grove church, about 18 miles north of Lake City. This old church had been abandoned and given over to the bats and owls. The church has been revived and is now one of the most promising churches in the association. Your committee requested the state board of missions to supplement the salary of the Oak Grove pastor to the amount of \$75 for the year; also the pastor of Fellowship church, John Dicks, for a like amount. The board did this and both of the churches are grateful to the committee and State Board and do not need any further assistance.

The later part of the year has been hard upon our work, because of the terrible epidemic of influenza and we trust that the new committee will be able to accomplish more the coming year than we have in the past.
