Constitution

Section 1. This Association shall be known as the Beulah Baptist Association.

Section 2. This Association shall be composed of Messengers selected by the several churches connected with the Association. Each church shall be entitled to one Messenger at large and one for every twenty-five members or majority fraction thereof.

Section 3. Any regularly organized Baptist Church of the same faith may become a member of this Association upon application by a petitionary letter and Messenger as above provided.

Gospel, and practical religion throughout our bounds, and elsewhere, from their members by a ballot, a Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer, who shall serve for one year.

Section 5. The object of this Association shall be: First, to promote unity and brotherly love among the churches; second, to promote gospel discipline; to encourage the universal spread of the Gospel and practical religion throughout our bounds and elsewhere.

Section 6. The Moderator shall appoint at each annual session of the Association an Executive Committee composed of six members whose appointment shall be approved by the body. Their duties shall be: First, to inquire into destitution within our bounds; second, to make contracts with the Ministers of the Gospel of this Association, or other Associations in correspondence with us to supply such destitution with the Gospel; third, to draw from the treasury such funds as are available for missionary purposes to meet their contracts, and to exercise general supervision in the promotion of unity and brotherly love among the Churches and the universal spread of the Gospel throughout our bounds. They shall report the results of their labors at each annual session of the Association.

Section 7. The Moderator shall invite correspondents and visiting ministers and brethren to seats with the body when in session. They shall be entitled to the privilege of aiding the Association with their counsel.

Section 8. This Association shall have the right to withdraw from any church that may be in disorder when the same cannot be restored by Gospel discipline to the unity of faith in the bonds of peace.

Section 9. The annual meetings of this Association shall be held at such time and place as may be designated by the body; and by appointment there shall be an introductory sermon preached the first day of the session at 11 o'clock, and on the Sabbath, or last day of the session, a collection taken up for missionary purposes.

Section 10. This Association shall not lord it over God's heritage nor infringe upon any of the internal rights of churches, but shall act only as an advisory body.

Section 11. This Constitution may be amended at any regular session of the Association by a two-thirds vote of all messengers. Any amendment offered shall be in writing.

Amendment 1. This Association shall take an offering during its session to defray the expenses of the Executive Committee, for printing, postage, etc. (Approved October, 1920.)

Amendment 2. The Executive Committee of this Association shall hereafter be composed of eight members. (Approved November, 1921.)

Amendment 3. A Vice-Moderator shall be elected from the body to serve one year. (Approved October, 1924.)

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. We believe in one only true and living God, the Father, son and Holy Spirit, and that these are one. (See Matt. 28:19.)

2. We believe that the Old and New Testament Scriptures are the inspired Word of God and the only rules of faith and practice. (2 Timothy 3:17.)

3. We believe in election according to the foreknowledge of God, through sanctification of the Spirit and belief of the truth. (2nd. Thes. 2:13.)

4. We believe that the Grace of God that bringeth salvation hath appeared unto all men, and that nothing prevents the salvation of the vilest sinner but his own voluntary rejection of that grace. (Isa. 55:1; Rev. 22:17; Acts 17:30.)

5. We believe in the depravity of the human heart, and that the natural state of man is such that he cannot prepare himself for divine favor without the assisting grace of God, enabling him to act according to the good pleasure of His Divine Will. (Eph. 2:5; Matt. 18:11; John 4:10; First Cor. 3:5-7.)

6. We believe in justification by faith, which gives peace with God, through our Lord Jesus Christ. (Romans 5:1-2.)

7. We believe that the Gospel of Christ is a means of Grace to bring sinners to repentance and faith in Jesus Christ, and therefore should be preached to all the world. (John 3:16.)

8. We believe that all those who are regenerated by the Spirit of God are made heirs of God and joint heirs with our Lord Jesus Christ, and that they are kept by the power of God through faith unto eternal salvation. (1 Peter 1:5; Rom. 8:28 Phi. 1:6.)

9. We believe that baptism is the immersion of the whole body in water; that the only proper subjects are described in the preceding section, and the only proper administrators are those who have been regularly ordained by a church of Christ, by the imposition of hands of a presbytery. (Acts 8:36; Rom. 6:4; Read Timothy and Titus.)

10. We believe that the Lord's Supper was instituted by Jesus

Christ to be commemorated by His followers and that none but baptized believers have a Scriptural right to partake thereof. (Luke 22:18, 19, 20; I Cor. 14:26-28.)

11. We believe in the resurrection of the righteous and the wicked, and that the wicked shall go away into everlasting punishment, but the righteous into eternal life. (Acts 24:15.)

RULES OF DECORUM

Article 1. At the first meeting of each session of the Association, the Moderator of the previous session shall call the Messengers to order, when the Messengers may elect a Moderator pro tem, who shall preside until the letters from the churches are read, and the names of the Messengers are enrolled. In case of absence of the Moderator the Clerk shall call to order.

Article 2. When the letters from the churches shall have been read and the names of the Messengers enrolled, they shall elect from the body, by ballot, a Moderator, a Clerk and a Treasurer, who shall serve for one year and until their successors shall be duly elected.

Article 3. Each day's session of the Association shall be opened with prayer.

Article 4. The Moderator shall preserve order, and decide all questions in debate, subject to an appeal to the body; and when he shall speak on any subject in discussion, he shall call some member to the chair, and in case of a tie, shall give the deciding vote.

Article 5. The Moderator shall appoint all committees, subject to approval by the body.

Article 6. The Clerk shall keep a careful record of the proceedings of each meeting, and in the absence of the Moderator shall call the body together and preside until a Moderator pro tem shall be elected.

Article 7. All members wishing to speak on any subject shall arise and address the Moderator as "Brother," and shall confine themselves strictly to the subject and shall not be allowed to make an unkind allusion to a brother while speaking.

Article 8. No motion shall be debated until seconded, and stated by the Moderator or read by the Clerk.

Article 9. When a motion is under consideration no other motion shall be entertained, except to adjourn, lay on the table, to amend, indefinitely postpone, refer to a committee, or call for the previous question.

Article 10. Any member voting with the majority on any question in debate may move a reconsideration at any time during the session.

Article 11. Visiting brethren and correspondents of any other associations of the same faith shall have a right to speak on any and all subjects under consideration; but shall not be entitled to vote.

Article 12. No brother shall speak more than twice on a subject without the consent of the Association.

Article 13. These rules of Decorum may be altered or amended at any regular session of the Association by a majority vote of the members of the body.

**RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS
of the****Beulah Baptist Association****FIFTY-THIRD ANNUAL SESSION**

Held With the

Philippi Baptist Church

Columbia County, Florida

SEPT. 30 - OCT. 1, 1932

FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 30, 10:00 A. M.

Devotional service was conducted by Rev. Basil Ridgeway.

1. Rev. W. T. Hall, who had served efficiently as Moderator for the last two years, called the Association to order, and C. M. Ray, the Clerk, enrolled Messengers, as on the preceding page.
2. The Moderator announced that he did not expect to be with us the entire coming year, and did not wish his name considered for re-election. He stated that nominations for Moderator were in order.
3. Rev. John Dicks was placed in nomination for Moderator, and the Clerk was instructed to cast the ballot, and he was declared elected.
4. Rev. C. R. Roberts for Vice-Moderator, C. M. Ray for Clerk, and E. A. McColskey for Treasurer, were nominated without opposition, and the Moderator by instruction cast the ballot for each.
5. The chair appointed a committee to rearrange the program: Rev. W. T. Hall, T. E. Getzen and Rev. C. R. Roberts.
6. Visitors were recognized as follows: Rev. C. M. Brittain, Mrs. C. M. Brittain, Prof. T. M. Johns, Mrs. T. M. Johns.
7. At this time out of the regular order, on motion Prof. Johns, who is Superintendent of the Children's Home at Arcadia, was invited to speak about the Home and its needs. His talk was pleasing, and hearts were responsive.
8. The Finance Committee was named, as follows: Rev. S. F. Yung, R. H. Carver and J. J. Bielling.

9. The Annual Sermon was preached by Rev. C. R. Roberts, text: Nehemiah 5:20.

10. The Program Committee submitted their report on Revised Program. Adopted.

Adjourned for lunch.

The Association reconvened at 1:45 p. m. Devotional was led by Rev. H. H. Thompson.

11. Announced that the Centennial Anniversary will be observed by the Old Providence church, October 6, and invitations were extended to the public.

12. The Moderator explained a plan to collect produce for the Children's Home by the truck load in this Association, which is being seriously considered.

13. The Committee on Nominations was announced as follows: Rev. S. F. Young, D. W. DuBdse, J. J. Bielling.

14. The Committee on Resolutions also was named, as follows: E. A. McColskey, Rev. Basil Ridgeway, R. H. Carver.

15. The report on the Co-Operative Program was read by Rev. J. S. Satchwill, who yielded the floor to Dr. C. M. Brittain. His address on Missions was inspiring. After discussion the report was adopted. A summary follows:

16. The unified, or Co-Operative Program embraces our entire organized denominational work, in State, Home and Foreign Missions, and includes Education, Aged Ministers, Orphanages, Hospitals, and other activities that relate to missions and Evangelization. Lack of funds will not permit us to print reports, or even extended summaries.

17. The Report of the W. M. U. prepared by the President, Mrs. A. R. Wise, was read by Mrs. C. M. Ray. Mrs. T. M. Johns, Matron of our Children's Home, at this time discussed the needs in the Home, after which motion to adopt carried.

Adjourned.

SATURDAY, 10:00 A. M.

Devotional was led by Rev. J. F. Russell.

18. The report on Ministerial Aid was read by J. J. Swails. The report was discussed by the author and Dr. E. D. Solomon. Report adopted.

19. This report shows the distressed situation among many of our aged ministers, and inspires us to provide for them more adequately.

20. The report of the B. Y. P. U., prepared by Rev. T. W. Allen, who was absent, was read by the Moderator. Adopted without discussion.

21. This report shows gratifying growth of B. Y. P. U.'s membership, and inspires us to give help and encouragement to this the training school of the church.

22. The Sunday School report, by T. A. Fellows, was read by Rev. John Dicks, and adopted after discussion by T. E. Getze.

23. The Sunday School is our Bible and Teaching School, and should be maintained in every church.

24. The presence of Dr. E. D. Solomon, editor of the Florida Baptist Witness, became known, and he was recognized at this time.

25. The report on Publications was written by Mrs. H. W. Markham, was read by the Moderator, and after discussion was adopted.

26. Dr. Solomon was given the floor. He stressed the importance of Christian literature, and especially the importance of the "Florida Baptist Witness." He and his wife are editors—he said, "we are sacrificing and working to enlarge its circulation."

Adjourned for lunch.

2:00 p. m., Devotional was led by Rev. W. T. Hall.

27. The report on State, Home and Foreign Missions was read by Rev. W. T. Hall, and was adopted.

This report was discussed yesterday by Dr. Brittain in connection with the Unified Program. (See paragraph 15.)

The two reports are similar in important respects, and the one brief summary will serve for both.

28. In the absence of the appointee to write the report on Temperance, no report was at hand, but Dr. Solomon was requested to discuss the subject. His address was a logical and convincing argument for the retention of the 18th Amendment, and our prohibition laws. His address was well received. Time would not permit discussion by others.

29. The report of the Committee on Nominations was read by the Clerk, and on motion was adopted without discussion.

As the assignments in the above report make our revised Associational Directory, the report is not given here. (See Associational Directory.)

30. The report on Christian Education, written by Mrs. Selwyn Chalker, was read by the Moderator, and adopted without discussion.

31. The report of the Finance Committee was read and adopted without discussion.

(Note by the Clerk: Of the above, \$37.32 paid for Clerk's service and expenses, part was on previous indebtedness.

33. The report on the Children's Home at Arcadia, Fla., was read by E. A. McColskey and adopted without discussion.

The report shows that 10 percent of the Unified Program receipts go to the Home, and that amount has proved quite insufficient to care for the 134 children who are our dependents. Churches of Beulah Association have contributed \$572.23 from Oct. 1, 1931, to Sept. 30, 1932. The report commends Prof. Johns, the new Superintendent, as being the right man for the place.

34. On motion the Clerk was instructed to prepare a Memorial Page in our Minutes to be dedicated to the memory of those of our number who have died during the year.

35. On motion it was agreed that our next Association shall meet with the Mt. Zion Church, Thursday and Friday of the last week in September, 1933.

36. Motion carried that the Executive Committee shall determine the number of copies of minutes to be printed, and shall fix the Clerk's compensation.

37. The report of the Committee on Resolutions was read, and adopted without discussion. It follows:

We, the Committee on Resolutions, recommend the following:

First, Resolved that we recommend to our Churches that they be more cautious in the ordination of ministers of the Gospel.

We hear that Baptist ministers in this Association have baptized into the fellowship of Churches other than Baptist, and we suggest that the Moderator appoint a Committee to investigate this matter.

Second: Resolved, that we endorse our prohibition laws, and call upon all of our people to observe them, strictly.

Third: Resolved, that we extend our thanks to the Members and friends of Philippi Church for their generous hospitality.

E. A. MCCOLSKY, Chairman.

38. On motion the Chair appointed a Committee of three, to which the Moderator was added, to investigate the matter referred to in the first preceding resolution. These were E. A. McColskey, R. H. Carver and Rev. S. F. Young. To report at our next Association.

39. Another discussion—informal—of the plan to load a truck in this Association with produce and other supplies for our Children's Home in the near future, was an inspiration to act.

40. After prayer, and the song, "Blest Be the Tie that Binds," the Association adjourned.
