Constitution

Section 1. This Association shall be known as the Beulah Baptist Association. *

Section 2. This Association shall be composed of Messengers selected by the several churches connected with the Association. Each church shall be entitled to one Messenger at large and one for every twenty-five members or majority fraction thereof.

Section 3. Any regularly organized Baptist Church of the same faith may become a member of this Association upon application by a petitionary letter and Messenger as above provided.

Section 4. This Association shall at a regular meeting elect from their members by ballot, a Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer, who shall serve for one year.

Section 5. The object of this Association shall be: First, to promote unity and brotherly love among the Churches; second, to promote Gospel discipline; to encourage the universal spread of the Gospel and practical religion throughout our bounds and elsewhere.

Section 6. The Moderator shall appoint at each annual session of the Association an Executive Committee composed of six members whose appointment shall be approved by the body. Their duties shall be: First, to inquire into destitution within our bounds; second, to make contracts with the Ministers of the Gospel of this Association, or other Associations in correspondence with us; to supply such destitution with the Gospel; third, to draw from the treasury such funds as are available for missionary purposes to meet their contracts, and to exercise general supervision in the promotion of unity and brotherly love among the Churches and the universal spread of the Horoughout our bounds. They shall report the results of their labors at each annual session of the Association.

Section 7. The Moderator shall invite correspondents and visiting ministers and brethren to seats with the body when in session. They shall be entitled to the privilege of aiding the Association with their counsel.

Section 8. This Association shall have the right to withdraw from any church that may be in disorder when the same cannot be restored by Gospel discipline to the unity of faith in the bonds of peace.

Section 9. The annual meetings of this Association shall be held at such time and place as may be designated by the body; and by appointment there shall be an introductory sermon preached the first day of the session at 11 o'clock, and on the Sabbath, or last day of the session, a collection taken up for missionary purposes.

Section 10. This Association shall not lord it over God's heritage nor infringe upon any of the internal rights of churches, but shall act only as an advisory body.

Section 11. This Constitution may be amended at any regular session of the Association by a two-thirds vote of all messengers. Any amendment offered shall be in writing.

Amendment 1. This Association shall take an offering during its session to defray the expenses of the Executive Committee, for printing, postage, etc. (Approved October, 1920.)

Amendment 2. The Executive Committee of this Association shall hereafter be composed of eight members. (Approved November, 1921.)

Amendment 3. A Vice Moderator shall be elected from the body to serve one year. (Approved October, 1924.)

ARTICLES OF FAITH

- We believe in one only true and living God, the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and that these are one. (See Matt. 28:19.)
- 2. We believe that the Old and New Testament Scriptures are the inspired Word of God and the only rules of faith and practice. (2 Timothy 3:17.)
- 3. We believe in election according to the foreknowledge of God, through sanctification of the Spirit and belief of the truth. (2nd Thes. 2:13.)
- 4. We believe that the Grace of God that bringeth salvation hath appeared unto all men, and that nothing prevents the salvation of the vilest sinner but his own voluntary rejection of that grace. (Isa. 55:1; Rev. 22:17; Acts 17:30.)
- 5. We believe in the depravity of the human heart, and that the natural state of man is such that he cannot prepare himself for divine favor without the assisting grace of God, enabling him to act according to the good pleasure of His Divine Will. (Eph. 2:5; Matt. 18:11; John 4:10; First Cor. 3:5-7.)
- 6. We believe in justification by faith, which gives peace with God, through our Lord Jesus Christ. (Romans 5:1-2.)
- 7. We believe that the Gospel of Christ is a means of grace to bring sinners to repentance and faith in Jesus Christ, and therefore should be preached to all the world. (John 3:16.)
- 8. We believe that all those who are regenerated by the Spirit of God are made heirs of God and joint heirs with our Lord Jesus Christ, and that they are kept by the power of God through faith unto eternal salvation. (1 Peter 1:5; Rom. 8:28; Phi. 1:6.)
- 9. We believe that baptism is the immersion of the whole body in water; that the only proper subjects are described in the preceding section, and the only proper administrators are those who have been regularly ordained by a church of Christ, by the imposition of hands of a presbytery. (Acts 8:36; Rom. 6:4; Read Timothy and Titus.)

- 10. We believe that the Lord's Supper was instituted by Jesus Christ to be commemorated by His followers and that none but baptized believers have 2 Scriptural right to partake thereof. (Luke 22:18, 19, 20; I Cor. 14:26-28.)
- 11. We believe in the resurrection of the righteous and the wicked, and that the wicked shall go away into everlasting punishment, but the righteous into eternal life (Acts 24:15.)

RULES OF DECORUM

- Article 1. At the first meeting of each session of the Association, the Moderator of the previous session shall call the Messengers to order, when the Messengers may elect a Moderator pro tem, who shall preside until the letters from the churches are read, and the names of the Messengers are enrolled. In case of absence of the Moderator the Clerk shall call to order.
- Article 2. When the letters from the Churches shall have been read and the names of the Messengers enrolled, they shall elect from the body, by ballot, a Moderator, a Clerk and a Treasurer, who shall serve for one year and until their successors shall be duly elected.
- Article 3. Each day's session of the Association shall be opened with prayer.
- Article 4. The Moderator shall preserve order and decide all questions in debate, subject to an appeal to the body; and when he shall speak on any subject in discussion, he shall call some member to the chair, and in case of a tie, shall give the deciding vote.
- Article 5. The Moderator shall appoint all committees, subject to approval by the body.
- Article 6. The Clerk shall keep a careful record of the proceedings of each meeting, and in the absence of the Moderator shall call the body together and preside until a Moderator pro tem shall be elected.
- Article 7. All members wishing to speak on any subject shall arise and address the Moderator as "Brother," and shall confine themselves strictly to the subject and shall not be allowed to make an unkind allusion to a brother while speaking.
- Article 8. No motion shall be debated until seconded and stated by the Moderator or read by the Clerk.
- Artcle 9. When a motion is under consideration to other motion shall be entertained except to adjourn, lay on the table, to amend, indefinitely postpone, refer to a committee, or call for the previous question.
- Article 10. Any member voting with the majority on any question in debate may move a reconsideration at any time during the session.

- Article 11. Visiting brethren and correspondents of any other associations of the same faith shall have a right to speak on any and all subjects under consideration, but shall not be entitled to vote.
- Article 12. No brother shall speak more than twice on a subject without the consent of the Association.
- Article 13. These rules of Decorum may be altered or amended at any regular session of the Association by a majority vote of the members of the body.

FIFTY-FOURTH ANNUAL SESSION

Held With The

Mt. Zion Baptist Church

Columbia County, Florida SEPTEMBER 28-29, 1933

THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 28-FIRST DAY

10:00 A. M. Devotional was conducted by Rev. J. L. Russell,

- 1. The Moderator, Rev. John Dicks, called the Association to order, and presided while the Clerk, C. M. Ray, enrolled Messengers from the churches.
- 2. Rev. John Dicks and C. M. Ray were both re-elected, the first as Moderator and the last as Clerk, without opposition.
- *3. Rev. W. T. Halstead was then elected Vice-Moderator without opposition.
- 4. The election of Associational Treasurer was deferred at this time.
- 5. Visitors were recognized as follows: Dr. C. M. Brittain, Secretary of the State Mission Board of Jacksonville, Fla.; Prof. T. M. Johns, Superintendent of the Baptist Children's Home, of Arcadia, Fla.; Rev. H. L. Chapin, of Santa Fe Association, and Rev. B. L. Russell of West Florida Association. These were all cordially welcomed.
- A committee was appointed to rearrange the program as follows: Rev. C. R. Roberts, Rev. C. L. Clements and J. J. Swails.
 - 7. On motion the Unified Program was taken up at this time.
- 8. The report on the Unified Program was read by Rev. John Dicks, with Rev. W. T. Halstead presiding. Rev. Dicks discussed his report briefly and yielded the floor to Dr. Brittain. After the song by the assembly, "How Firm a Foundation," Dr. Brittain discussed the report, in which he in fact preached an inspiring missionary sermon. Dr. Brittain's effort was to inspire our Baptist people to come to the rescue of all of our mission work, which is greatly embarrassed by debts, and the limited funds given to all of our mission work. The report was adopted.

- 9. Prayer by Prof. Johns.
- The Finance Committee was appointed as follows: Rev. C.
 R. Roberts, J. E. Ogden, Ottis Howell.
- 11. E. A. McColskey was nominated for Treasurer and elected by acclamation.
- The Committee on Entertainment was announced, and asked to stand that each one might be recognized.

Adjourned for lunch.

Reconvened at 1:30 P. M.

Devotional was conducted by Rev. H. L. Chapin.

Committees appointed.

 On Nominations: Rev. W. T. Halstead, D. L. Jernigan and T. A. Fellows.

On Resolutions: Rev. C. R. Roberts, Rev. W. N. Cone and J. J. Swails.

14. Announcement was made that the report on the Children's Home was not ready, but Prof. Johns, the Superintendent, being present, was invited to discuss the Home and its needs. Prof. Johns has a pleasing personality and he further confirmed the opinion which is general that the Children's Home at Arcadia is an ideal home for dependent children; that he is competent to manage the institution economically, and that in our Children's Home there is a spiritual atmosphere that results in nearly all of the children becoming Christians, and useful citizens. He expressed his appreciation for the truck load of farm products and other supplies amounting to about 4,000 pounds, donated by the friends of the Home in this Association last year.

The Children's Home deserves our prayers and full support

- The report on Ministerial Relief was read by Rev. C. L. Clements and adopted.
- 15. The report on Sabbath Observance prepared by Rev. S. F. Young was read by Rev. W. T. Halstead. This report was longer than usual, but was highly commended. Lack of time permitted only a few words of approval.
- The Committee on Program presented the program for Friday, which was adopted.
- 17. On motion a special committee was appointed to report on the activities of the Rev. Basil Ridgeway and Evangelist Taylor and their connection with the so-called Landmark Baptists in this Association. Committee: C. M. Ray, Rev. C. R. Roberts and Rev. J. R. Eubanks. To report tomorrow.

18. The committee appointed at the last Association to investigate reports of irregular baptisms by one of our young pastors reported and were confirmed by others in that the young brother had said he did not know at the time that he was acting contrary to Baptist usage, and that he would observe Baptist usage hereafter. These statements were accepted and the committee was discharged.

Adjourned.

FRIDAY MORNING, 10 O'CLOCK

Devotional was conducted by Rev. W. N. Cone.

- 19. Other Messengers were enrolled.
- 20. The report on Publications prepared by Mrs. H. W. Markham was read by Mrs. A. R. Wise. Mrs. Wise discussed the report briefly, and Dr. Solomon, the editor of the Florida Baptist Witness, having been recognized as a visitor, was invited to join in the discussion.

Dr. Solomon discussed the importance of good literature in all of our homes and urged the more general support of our State paper, the Florida Baptist Witness, as a means of gaining information about our denominational work.

He said that when our church paper is put in the church budget, and paid for by the church treasurer, without regard to number of copies it will be sent to new and old subscribers alike for \$1.00 per annum.

The report was adopted.

- 21. The report on Sunday Schools was read by Rev. J. L. Russell, who was given limited time for discussion. He urged the importance of Sunday Schools in all of our churches and that a church that neglects Sunday Schools cannot be progressive. The report was adopted.
- 22. The report on the Woman's Missionary Union was read by Mrs. J. W. Bowden, who in a brief discussion gave a summary of the work during the past year.

Sermon by Rev. W. T. Halstead.

- 23. An offering was taken for the Unified Program amounting to \$7.60
- 24. The Moderator appointed the Associational Executive Committee for the ensuing year as follows: Rev. W. T. Halstead, Lake City; Rev. J. R. Eubanks, Lake City; Rev. C. R. Roberts, Lake City; Rev. W. N. Cone, Lake City; Rev. S. F. Young, Lake City; Rev. E. A. McColskey, Lake City; C. M. Ray, Lake City; Rev. T. W. Allen, Wellborn, Fla.; Rev. John Dicks, Ex-Officio, Lake City; Fla.

Adjourned for lunch.

1:45 P. M. Devotional was conducted by Rev. T. W. Allen.

25. The report of the special committee, being a sub-committee of the Executive Committee, was read by C. M. Ray.

This relates to Rev. E. E. Taylor, an evangelist of the so-called "Landmark Baptists," and to the Rev. Basil Ridgeway, who seems to have been led astray by the Rev. Taylor. It was shown that the young man, Ridgeway, had been called before the Executive Committee, pastors and laymen of our Association, and he was there quite inconsistent and defiant as attempts were made, all in an advisory way, to show him his error.

We learn that this young brother later united with the Landmark Baptists and tried to take the Mt. Carmel Church with him.

The report closes by a warning to all of our Baptist Churches to beware of these who will if encouraged give trouble in our churches everywhere.

"Above all, do not allow them to preach in your churches," the report urges.

In the short discussions following the report, Dr. Solomon, Rev. T. W. Allen, Rev. J. L. Russell, E. A. McColskey and Rev. J. R. Eubanks also sounded warnings. Dr. Solomon said the fact is that the Landmark Baptists have their boards and Conventions much like ours, although they strongly condemn others for maintaining boards and Conventions. The report was adopted.

26. The report on Temperance was read by Rev. W. T. Halstead and was discussed by Dr. E. D. Solomon.

Both in the report and the discussion the grave situation relative to our liquor laws and lowering of moral standards among our people were deplored.

They call upon all Christians to vote, work and pray as the Christian conscience may direct. The report was adopted.

27. The report on State, Home and Foreign Missions was read by Rev. John Dicks, who yielded the floor to Dr. Solomon.

The subject of missions never gets old if hearts are filled with the missionary spirit. Dr. Solomon gave an inspiring message and if owed how out of our poverty it is the Christian's duty to support all of our mission causes.

The report was adopted.

28. The report on Christian Education was read by Rev. C. R. Roberts.

This report stresses the importance of Christian education in our homes and in our schools. The church, the Sunday School and the B. Y. P. U. are all of vital importance in giving instruction to our young people. The report was adopted without discussion.

 The report of the Committee on Nominations was read by Rev. W. T. Halstead and adopted.

- 30. The report on Resolutions was read by Rev. C. W. Roberts and adopted as follows:
- Resolved That we be more cautious in recommending the ordination of ministers in our denomination.
- 2. Be it resolved That the Beulah Association, assembled at Mt. Zion Church, by this resolution ask Mt. Carmel Missionary Baptist Church to recall or revoke the ordination of Basil Ridgeway, as he has departed from the faith of the Missionary Baptist Church.
- 3. Resolved That we endorse the command of Christ in the observance of the Sabbath—the Lord's day.
- 4. We recommend that our parents give better heed in the selection of literature to be read by our young people.
- Resolved That we extend our thanks to Mt. Zion Church for their generous hospitality.

- 34. After singing "Blest Be the Tie That Binds" and prayer by Dr. Solomon, the Association adjourned to meet Thursday and Friday of the last week in September, 1934.
