CONSTITUTION

Section 1. This Association shall be known as the Beulah Baptist Association.

Section 2. This Association shall be composed of Messengers selected by the several churches connected with the Association. Each church shall be entitled to one Messenger at large and one for very twenty-five members of majority faction thereof.

Section 3. Any regular organized Baptist church of the same faith may become a member of this Association upon application by a petitionary letter and Messengers as above provided.

Section 4. On the second or last day of the Annual Session, the Association shall from its membership elect by a ballot a Moderator, Vice Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer whose terms of office shall begin with the adjournment of the body and extend through the next year and through the sessions of next year.

Section 5. The object of this Association shall be: First to promote unity and brotherly love among the churches; second to promote Gospel discipline, to encourage the universal spread of the Gospel and practical religion throughout our bounds and elsewhere.

Section 6. The Moderator shall appoint at each Annual Session of the Association an Executive Committee composed of one member from each church connected with the Association. Each church is expected and is urged to recommend its members on this committee. Resident pastors, heads of the Associational Training Union, Sunday Schools, Woman's Missionary Union, and Brotherhood departments together with the elected officers of the Association shall be ex-officio members of the committee. Their duties shall be: First to inquire into destitution within our bounds; second, to make contact with the ministers of the Gospel of this Association, or other Association, by correspondence and to supply destitution with the Gospel; third, to draw from the treasury such funds as are available for missionary purposes to meet their contract and to exercise general supervision in the promotion of unity and brotherly love among the churches and the universal spread of the Gospel throughout our bounds. They shall report the results of their labors at each annual session of the association.

Section 7. The Moderator shall invite correspondents and visiting ministers and brethren to seats with the body when in session. They shall be entitled to the privilege of aiding the Association with their counsel.

Section 8. This Association shall have the right to withdraw from any church that may be in disorder when the same cannot be restored by Gospel discipline to the unity of faith in the bonds of peace.

Section 9. The Annual Meeting of this Association shall be held at such time and place as may be designated by the body; and by appointment there shall be an introductory sermon preached the first day of the session at 11 o'clock, and a collection taken up for missionary purposes.

Section 10. This Association shall not lord it over God's heritage nor infringe upon any of the internal rights of churches, but shall act only as an advisory body.

Section 11. This Constitution may be amended at any regular session of the Association by two-thirds vote of messengers. Any amendment offered shall be in writing.

RULES OF DECORUM

Article 1. At the first meeting of each session of the Association the Moderator shall call the Messengers to order; the letters from the churches shall be presented and the names of the Messengers enrolled. In case of the absence of the Moderator, the Vice Moderator or Clerk shall call to order.

Article 2. Each day's session of the Association shall be opened with prayer.

Article 3. The Moderator shall preserve order and decide all questions in debate, subject to an appeal of the body; and when he shall speak on any subject in discussion he shall call some member to the chair and in case of a tie shall give the deciding vote.

Article 4. The Moderator shall appoint all committees, subject to approval by the body.

Article 5. The Clerk shall keep a careful record of the proceeding of each meeting, prepare and edit the Minutes for printing. In the absence of the Moderator and the Vice Moderator, he shall call the body together and preside until a Moderator pro tem shall be elected.

Article 6. All members wishing to speak on any subject shall rise and address the Moderator as "Brother," and shall confine themselves strictly to the subject and shall not be allowed to make an unkind allusion to any brother while speaking.

Article 7. No motion shall be debated until seconded and stated by the moderator or read by the clerk.

Article 8. When a motion is under consideration no other motion shall be entertained except to adjourn, lay on the table, to amend, indefinitely postpone, refer to committee, or call for the previous question.

Article 9. Any member voting with the majority on any question in debate may move a reconsideration at any time during the session.

Article 10. Visiting brethren of other Associations may speak on any subject, but shall not vote.

Article 11. No brother shall speak more than twice on a subject without the consent of the Association.

Article 12. These Rules of Decorum may be altered or amended at any regular session of the Association by a majority vote of the members of the body.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. We believe in one only true and living God, the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and that they are one. (See Matt. 28-29).

2. We believe that the Old and New Testament Scriptures are the inspired Word of God and the only rules of faith and practice. (2 Timothy 3-17.)

3. We believe in the election according to the foreknowledge of God through sanctification of the Spirit and belief of the truth. (2 Thes. 3-13.)

4. We believe that the Grace of God that bringeth salvation hath appeared unto all men, and that nothing prevents the salvation of the vilest sinner but his own voluntary rejection of that Grace. (Isa. 55:1; Rev. 22:17; Acts 17:30.)

5. We believe in the depravity of the human heart, and that the natural state of man is such that he cannot prepare himself for Divine favors without the sustaining grace of God, enabling him to act according to the good pleasure of His Divine Will. (Eph. 2:6; Matt. 18-11; John 4:10; 1 Cor. 3:5-7.)

6. We believe in justification of faith, which gives peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. (Rom. 5:1-2.)

7. We believe that the Gospel of Christ is a means of grace to bring sinners to repentance and faith in Jesus Christ, and therefore should be preached to all the world. (John 3:16.)

8. We believe that all those who are regenerated by the Spirit of God are made heirs of God and joint heirs with our Lord Jesus Christ and that they are kept by the power of God through faith until eternal Salvation. (Peter 1:5; Rom. 8:22; Phi. 1-6.)

9. We believe that baptism is the immersion of the whole body in water; that the only proper subjects are described in preceding section, and the only proper administrators are those who have been regularly ordained by the Church of Christ, by the imposition of hands of a presbytery. (Acts 8:36; Rom. 6:4; Read Tim. and Titus.)

10. We believe that the Lord's Supper was instituted by Jesus Christ to be commemorated by His followers and that none but baptized believers have a Spiritual right to partake thereof. (Luke 22:18, 19, 20; Cor. 14:25-28.)

11. We believe in the resurrection of the righteous and the wicked and that the wicked shall go away into everlasting punishment, but the righteous into eternal life: (Acts 25:15.)

All of the active Churches in the Beulah Association have conducted revival meetings this year — resulting in a goodly number of conversions and baptisms. How many, we cannot report. We are forced to report, though we wrote to each pastor, except those attending the meetings on evangelism urging them to send in their reports of their revivals, none have sent them to us, making it impossible to give a full report. But we can report that our Churches are revival conscious, and, we understand that nearly every revival has resulted in salvation for the lost ones, and the edification of the Christians.

Some interest is being manifested among the pastors, in the prospective simultaneous revival which is to be conducted next March by all Baptist Churches east of the Mississippi River.

It is our hope that every Church in our Association will participate in that united effort in winning the lost to Christ.

The report of committees on co-operative program by Dr. Allen J. Freeman, who made a motion that the reading of the report be dispensed with and that the full time be given to Rev. Clifford Walker. Rev. Walker very ably presented the workings of this program and asked the churches to take a more active part in this program.

REPORT ON COOPERATIVE PROGRAM

ALLEN J. FREEMAN

The body of people called Baptists find that the Cooperative Program we achieve our best and greatest unity, and it is also here that we exercise our most forceful strength. It is indeed thrilling to think of six and a half million Southern Baptists who, without any pressure of complicated organization, join hands and hearts to accomplish their extensive enterprises.

The Cooperative Program enables us to fulfill the command of Jesus to preach the Gospel to the ends of the earth. Through this program we are witnessing and ministering in the name of Christ through 753 Foreign Missionaries, 696 Home Missionaries, and 38 State Missionaries.

On this, the 25th Anniversary of the Cooperative Program, we must agree that our Baptist Fathers were right who reasoned that this plan would (1) save the mission causes, (2) give the churches a satisfactory world outlet, (3) give Baptists more mission work for their money, (4) provide outward expression for New Testament unity and (5) give the message of Christ a vigorous world-wide program.

Southern Baptists have adopted a plan for stewardship education and enlistment which has already worked wonders in churches which have tried it. It is called TITHERS ENLISTMENT VISITATION. It is a program in which tithers visit others to tell them about Christian stewardship, give their own testimony, and say, "Will you not join me in tithing?"

Pastors say, "TITHERS ENLISTMENT VISITATION doubled our budget." This has proved true in a mission of fifty members as well as in a church of two thousand members. It has deepened the spiritual life of our church." "It has been a great aid to soul-winning in our church." Our own State Convention is actively promoting TITHERS ENLISTMENT VISITATION in our state, urging that every church try it, and get the blessings from it. One may secure full information about TITHERS ENLISTMENT VISITATION by writing to our State Secretary. We heartily commend TITHERS ENLISTMENT VISITATION and urge its use. We recommend that:

1. Every pastor lead his church to observe TITHERS ENLISTMENT VISITATION this fall, and that all churches cooperate in its use.
2. Our people be urged to give more support to all our missionary and benevolent work through the Cooperative Program.

3. We seek to raise the level of giving and deepen the spiritual life of all our people through emphasis upon Christian stewardship and tithing.

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REPORT OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The first meeting was mostly discussing and approving bills to be paid by the Treasurer — such as, printing of the minutes, payment of the clerk, and other bills that had been presented.

The Treasurer was instructed that in the future he should pay bills presented with the approval of the Moderator.

Other meetings were held during the year and general discussion of the associational work, especially the matter of holding simultaneous Revival meetings, but no definite action taken because there were so many of the Churches not represented. At a meeting in August Bro. John Pearce, our district Missionary was present and suggested that meeting be held to study a Manual furnished by the convention, and that he and Dr. Freeman, Pastor of Lake City First Church, would explain how to carry on this revival work. The meeting was held Sept. 8th. The meeting, however, was not a meeting of the Committee, but more of a Pastor's meeting.

At the Sept. 28th meeting a program for the Associational meeting was arranged and approved. The report of the budget committee was read and, with one correction, approved.

A suggestion that the committee for the next year meet quarterly on a fixed date and that the churches be represented, was approved.

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REPORT OF RELIEF AND ANNUITY BOARD OF THE SOUTHERN BAPTIST CONVENTION

First. The Relief and Annuity Board of the Southern Baptist Convention is in business, and it is a large business with assets reported at \$17,613,434.86. This is an increase of more than two and a half million dollars over the previous year. This increase is an indication that it is God's business and that God is guiding those who are carrying on this business for him to use wise and sound business methods.

Second. In view of the successful growth of this Board both in assets and in benefits over a period of more than thirty years we feel that all of our churches should be enlisted in this work and should take the initiative in securing this protection for those who serve them.

Third. We would also remind you of the fact that in the Broadened Security Bill passed by the United States Senate on June 20, 1950; excluded all employees of churches from the Social

Security Program. Therefore it is imperative that the employees of our churches and church related groups avail themselves of these security benefits as offered through the plan of the Relief and Annuity Board of the Southern Baptist Convention.
