1. Bob Utz led the congregation in singing "Send the Light."
2. Welcome was extended by Bob Utz.
3. The Moderator, Claud McAdams, called the meeting to order, and requested special prayer for the activities in our area at this particular time.
4. Rev. S.T. Ward and Rev. James Brooks led in prayer.
5. Rev. Roy Silvers led the Devotional, reading from Acts 2:46-47; Acts 5:42; Acts 20:20.
6. The Clerk made a motion that all who were now registered and those who would subsequently register from the churches cooperating with the Alachua As-



1. The meeting was called to order by the Moderator, Claud McAdams.
2. Robin Thomas led the congregation in singing the hymn, "To God Be The Glory."
3. T.S. Ward, Pastor of Floral City First Baptist Church, led the devotional, reading Matthew 16:18.
4. The Clerk, Polly Gideons, moved that all who were now registered, and who shall subsequently register, as messengers from churches cooperating with the Alachua Baptist Association constitute the working body of this Association. Motion seconded and carried.
5. Roy Silvers, Vice Moderator, moved the adoption of the program as printed, with such changes as may be necessary for the conducting of the Associational business. Motion seconded and carried.

7. A Welcome was extended by James Howell, host pastor.
8. The Response was given by Jim McClung, pastor of Oxford.
9. With Robin Thomas directing and Johnny Booth at the piano, the congregation was led in singing the hymns "Sunshine in My Soul" and "Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing".
10. The report of the Executive Board was read.
11. The Treasurer's report was read and accepted.
12. Election of officers:

16. The Digest of Letters was read by the Moderator, Claud McAdams.
17. James Howell, host Pastor, gave instructions about the noon and evening meals.
18. Chester Coker gave a report on the Sumter County Crusade for Christ.
19. Led by Robin Thomas the congregation sang "Love Divine" and "Breathe on Me".
20. Sue Grubbs brought a special in song "How Long Has It Been?".
21. The Doctrinal Message "The Holy Spirit" was brought by Johnny Booth, Pastor of Webster. Scripture references were Romans 8:9,11,14-17,26,27.
22. Prayer and blessing for the noon meal was offered by Johnny Booth.

## REPORTS

### ALACHUA ASSOCIATION EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE 1970

Executive Committee meetings are scheduled for the Monday following the first Sunday in each month, at 10:30 AM at the Floral City First Baptist Church. The Fellowship room is open, and coffee and cake are available at 10:00 AM, to promote fellowship prior to the meeting.

While the application for Pastoral Aid to Spring Hill Mission was being processed, the Committee assisted with the Pastor's salary in the amount of \$225.00. To aid the Westside Mission we assisted by paying a Supply Pastor \$70.00.

In an effort to promote more fellowship among the Pastors and wives, the Moderator and Field Secretary planned a covered dish supper. This was very successful, and plans are being made for such an event once each quarter.

At the request of the Hebron Baptist Church the body negotiated a complete and peaceful severance with the Westside Mission. Funds given by the Association were returned (\$700.00). The former Westside Mission is no longer affiliated with the Alachua Baptist Association and/or the Florida Baptist Convention.

A personal letter was written to each of our elected representatives to the Senate and House of Representatives requesting their voting against a bill to give aid to parochial schools; from each we received an answer.

The Committee adopted the five-point program concerning the District Missionary:

1. The three Associations, Marion, Alachua, Lake County, to remain together as one District.
2. The District agrees to begin to assume financial responsibility for the District Missionary in paying one thousand dollars towards the basic salary-fringe benefits of the District Missionary. Lake County and Marion Associations to pay three hundred fifty dollars each and Alachua Association to pay three hundred dollars.
3. The one thousand dollars is to be forwarded to the Florida Baptist Convention, Jacksonville, Florida, to be disbursed by Frank Richardson, Comptroller.
4. A new and vital District Missions Committee will draw up a job description and qualifications as soon as is practical.
5. The District will retain Rev. H. Clyde Harless as District Missionary. His activities are to be directed, in part, by the District Missions Committee.

A letter was mailed to the Hernando County School Board commending them for having Baccalaureate Services on Sunday afternoon. We pray the other Counties will see the benefit of this, and change their Baccalaureate time so it will not interfere with regular church worship hours.

A mimeograph machine (A B Dick 525) has been purchased; the cost was \$565.00. The approved budget shows an increase of \$965.00 over last year. If we are to meet our obligations, we must increase our giving.

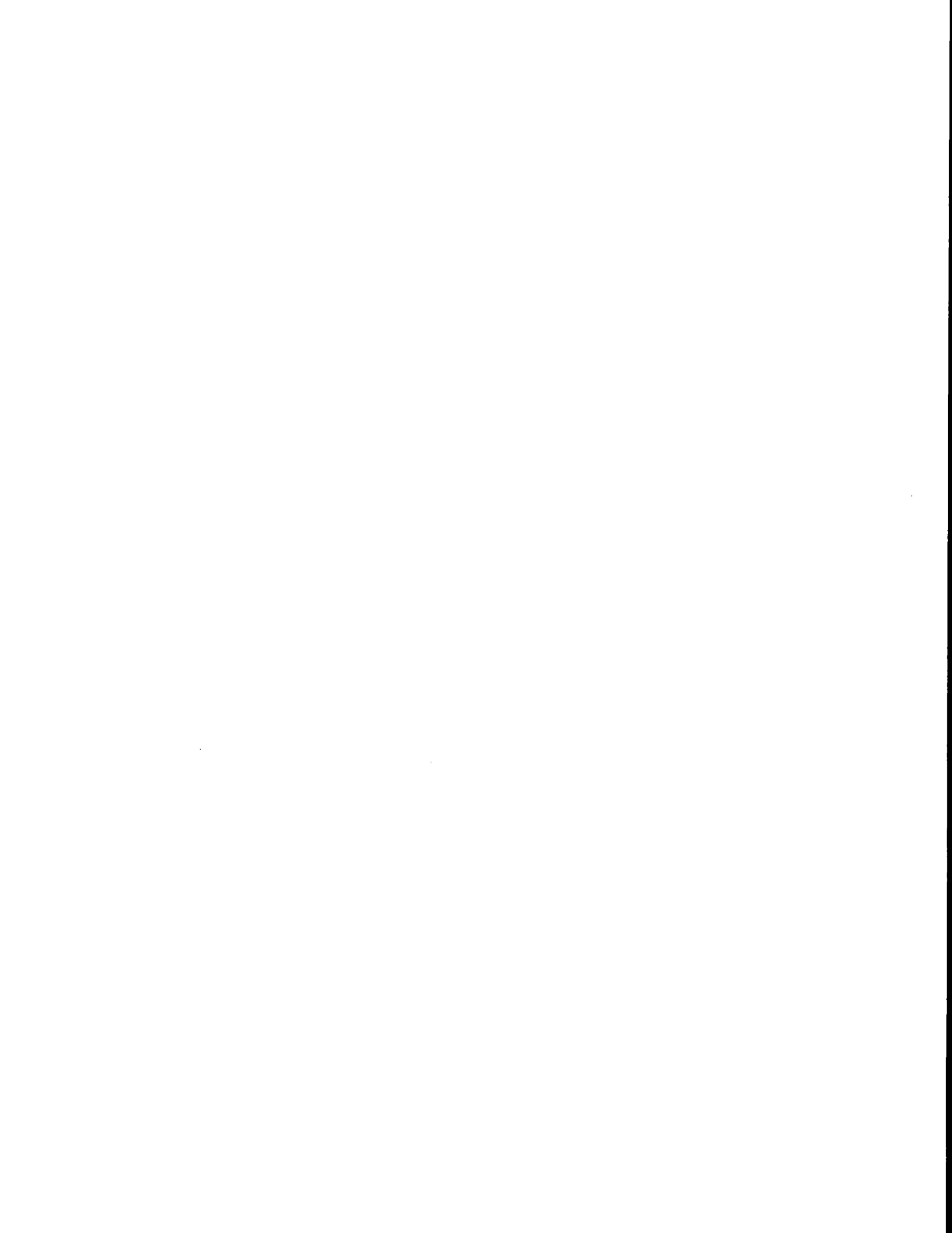

## SUPERINTENDENT OF MISSIONS DISTRICT 7

For the past few years we have heard much about "Shaping the 70's" and are well on our way to a glorious decade for our Lord.

## STATE MISSIONS REPORT

Therefore the story of State Missions is being shared and told by many reports and individuals representing institutions, agencies and services. Yet in a particular and specific understanding our people in the churches think of State Missions as that which centers in the programs and services undergirded by the Cooperative Program and led by the Convention staff under the guidance of our Executive Secretary-Treasurer.

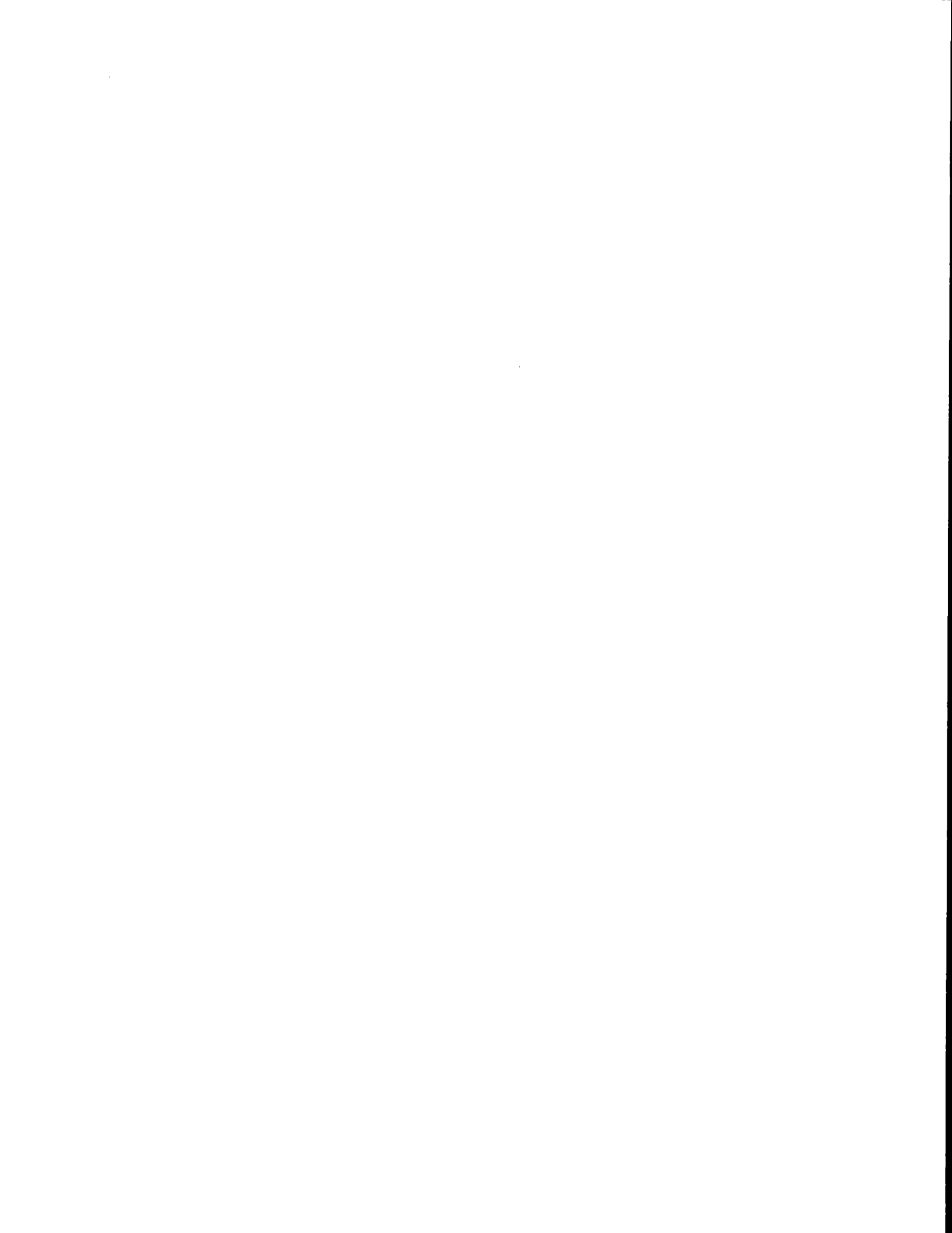
These are some of the highlights:

1. Real progress has been made in many areas moving into the new pattern of associational work. The reference to Superintendent of Missions and the distinctive associational planning and guiding of a work closer to the churches will be the emphasis with the passing of another year.

2. The cooperative agreement with the Home Mission Board places all the combined mission programs in Florida under the State Board leadership and administration.

3. New persons have been added in program leadership to fill vacancies and places of responsibility. Some of these are: Mr. James Frost, director of Sunday School; Mr. Paul Bobbitt, director of Church Music, James D. Morrell, Church Music Associate; Mr. J. Ray Dobbins, director of Field Missions, Robert Cook, Church Training Department, and Keener Pharr, director of Education Division.

4. During the summer of 1970 the strongest summer mission effort was conducted in Florida by the State and Home Mission Boards. Twenty-eight of the finest young



people in the college communities of our nation spent ten weeks in significant resort and special ministries in Florida.

5. A staff committee under the leadership of Mr. Keener Pharr has recommended a special emphasis for Florida Baptists in 1971-72 and 1972-73. It will be presented to Annual Associations and State Convention under the theme: "Reaching People."

This year just completed sets a new record of mission giving for the Cooperative Program. The total Cooperative receipts for 1969-70 were \$4,362,571.69, this amounts to \$282,571.69 over the Convention budget. This means that we were able to reach further in mission actions than we thought we would be able to do.

There were four Board meetings last year and all were well attended by the Board members.

In the twenty-five years as pastor in Florida Baptist Convention, I really believe we have the best staff we have ever had in our Convention.

## EVANGELISM

As Southern Baptists we believe that everything we do is based upon the scriptures, or "thus saith the Lord." This is also true in regards to Evangelism. In the great commission our Master gave to the church, He said to "Go then to all people, everywhere, and make them disciples, baptizing them in the name of the Father, of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you, and remember I will be with you always, to the end of the age." This scripture gives us the authority for Evangelism. Evangelism has been and always will be the task of the New Testament Church. In this Alachua Association for the year 1969-70 there were 224 baptisms. This is 71 less than in the prior year. There were 338 additions by letter and otherwise. This is 30 less than last year.

Our Associational Evangelistic Clinic was well attended this year, and was held at Northside Brooksville. There were 89 present, including 13 pastors and 3 visitors. Our speaker for the Clinic was Rev. Van Capps of Tampa.

One of the most gratifying parts of the Evangelistic program for this coming year will be a Layman's Witnessing Program. This is as it should be. When we get our laymen to become involved in witnessing, we will see a great increase in the baptisms in our churches.

## THE HISTORY OF EDEN BAPTIST CHURCH

Nestled tranquilly just off the edge of Lake Lindsey, Eden Baptist Church abides by the slogan on the front lawn "Preaching the Word Since 1845."

Eden was constituted in September of 1845. This was five years before Hernando County was begun, and ten years before Brooksville was founded. To further emphasize the early beginning of the church, the year of 1845 was 16 years before the Confederate Army troops fired on Fort Sumter to launch the Civil War. Eden Baptist Church had been meeting twenty years when President Lincoln was killed by John Wilkes Booth.

The first record of any religious activity in the community was a report that on July 7, 1844, Rev. John Tucker, a prominent Baptist minister, baptized J.W. Hayman in Lake Lindsey. Mr. Hayman later became an outstanding minister. Rev. Tucker was listed in an Associational report as pastor of Eden Baptist Church in 1848. It is therefore to be assumed that he was instrumental in the organization of the church in 1845 and that the church's early growth was sparked by his leadership. A few choice notes from "A Memorial Sketch of Rev. J.M. Hayman" by O.J. Frier:

(Haymans Journal) "Under a funeral sermon preached by Rev. John Tucker .... at the close of which an invitation was extended .... I felt an ardent desire to follow my Saviour ...."

So that evening at the water side, he and one of his sisters presented themselves

and were baptized by Rev. John Tucker in Lake Lindsey, July 7, 1844. About September 1845, the Baptist Church was constituted and he was chosen the first clerk, and afterwards ordained a deacon.

Hayman's Journal had an account of his work in Tampa, of historical interest and value: "In the year 1859, the yellow fever being gone in Tampa, I commenced work in earnest to build a church house; though I was not encouraged by some of my brethren. The lot was given by the county commissioners for a Baptist Church .... In July 1860, Dr. Joseph S. Baker came to Tampa and we organized the First Baptist Church ...." Rev. Samuel Croft succeeded him in the work in Tampa.

The Pre-Civil War days were very strenuous for the members of the young church. The numerical strength of the group was not large. In 1848 the church had 25 members (20 white and 5 colored) and in 1856 it reported 34 members (15 white and 19 colored).

The 1856 minutes of the Alachua Association stated that the hostility of the Indians caused much hardship to the early settlers. Some of the Churches were forced to cease public worship services.

The church was led during these early years of struggle by pastors John Tucker, Daniel Simmons and R.L. Wooley. Despite the many problems, the church survived and continued to serve the community. REVIVALS were, and are, a great aid to spiritual growth and winning souls. One of these early meetings in 1875, led by Rev. W.J. Hughes, is reported by the late Mrs. Anna McKeown:

"Meetings continued, congregations increased, the house was packed.

Each night after delivering a soul stirring sermon, he would step down from the pulpit and plead with sinners to come to Jesus. He would then sing out that old hymn, "Come Humble Sinner"..... While they sang I have seen numbers leave their seats, march down the aisles in droves ..... The immediate results were great numbers baptized into the church."

Another revival of note was held in 1907 at the one-room school house located approximately twelve miles north of Brooksville on Highway 581. Thee Faribec was the preacher. There were 16 added to Eden Baptist by baptism. They were baptized in Lake Prairie. Six of those baptized at this time are still living; the first four listed still attend Eden regularly. They are Mr. and Mrs. Jim Priest and Mr. and Mrs. Turner Landrum, "Aunt" Mattie Landrum (93 now), and Mrs. Frances Smoak.

Eden's first church building was located on Mayo Hill. This property was shared by the Methodist Church and the county school. In 1847 a building was erected on the present church site, and it too was shared by both churches and the school. This was a log building. In 1884 Eden, with 58 members, built the present old auditorium, which is located behind the new educational building. Thus for 72 years Eden Church used this "old auditorium" for worship.

The present auditorium and educational plant idea began with Rev. J.D. Bowen in 1953. During this period of growth to the completion of the plant in 1966, the Pastors have been Rev. J.P. McLendon, Rev. C.E. Simpkins and Rev. Carter McGinnis. The three buildings now in use are centrally heated and cooled. We are grateful to God for these buildings, and to all those who have worked to make them possible.

The church leaders clearly intend to reach more lost souls; to help each member to grow spiritually, and to provide adequate space for learning the Word of God, and worshipping Him, for without Him we could do nothing. It is our intention to cooperate with other Baptist churches of like faith and order, that we may do together what one church alone could not do. This cooperative spirit dates back to November 1, 1847 when the First Annual Session of the Alachua Baptist Association convened in the Eden Baptist Church.

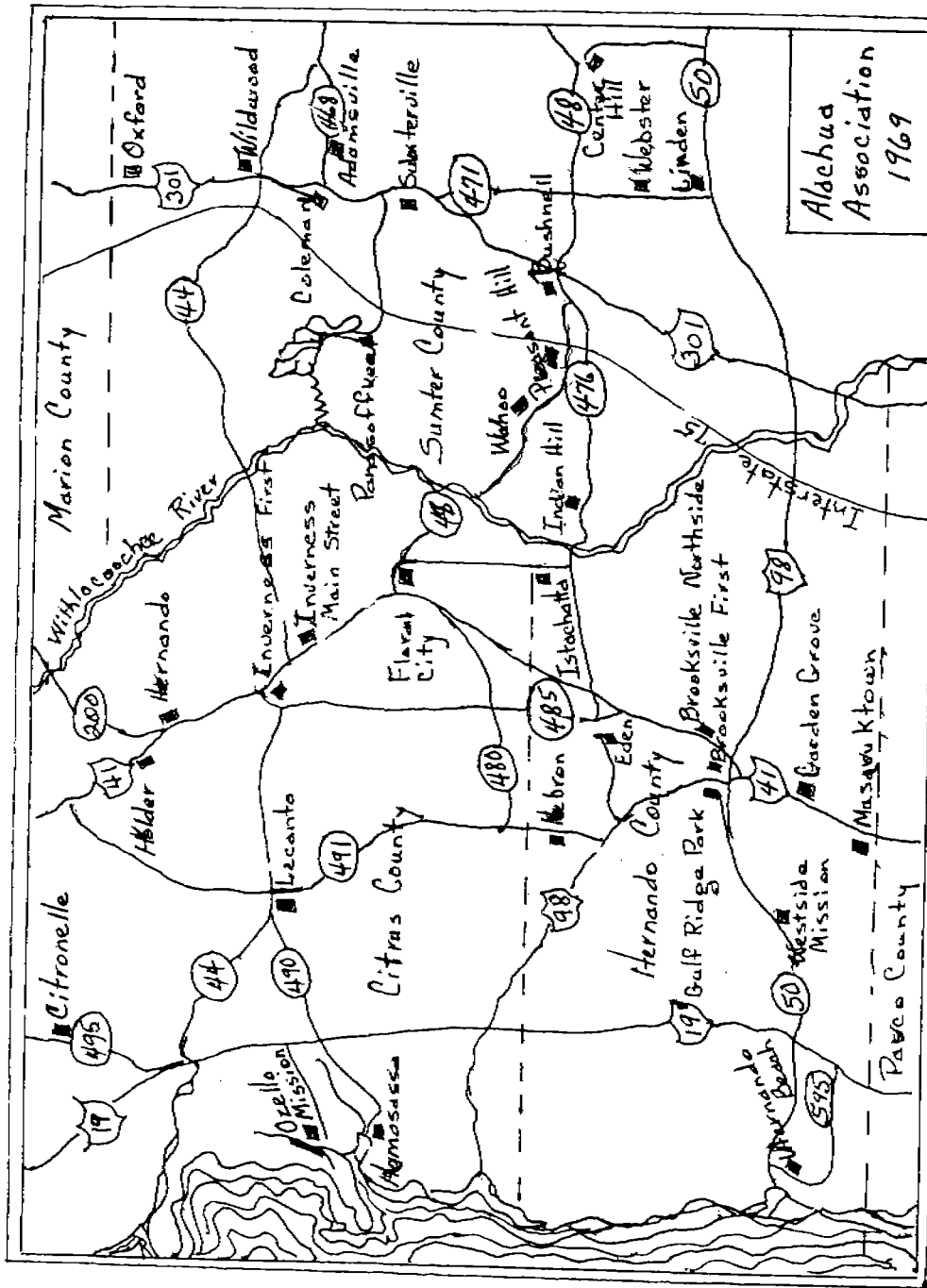
