He was born in Pensacola and had lived in this area for the past 29 years. Rev. Quigley was the Pastor of the Ocean City Baptist Church in Fort Walton Beach since the church was established, and had been Pastor of the Holt Baptist Church in Holt before coming to Fort Walton Beach.



Ocean City Church was founded by Pastor James M. Quigley as a mission church from the First Baptist Church in Holt, Florida. It was constituted as the First Baptist Church of Ocean City in June, 1954. In those early days, the Ocean City/Wright area was only just beginning to be developed. The church began to grow immediately, touching the hearts and lives of multitudes through the anointed preaching of the Gospel and teaching of God's Word. Pastor Quigley continued to lead this flock of committed followers of Jesus until the Lord saw fit to call him home in June of 1982.
