Dr. Thomas Pinner has finished his earthly work. He rejoices now with the One he has loved, studied, taught and modeled - a good and faithful servant for 86 years. He leaves the love of his life, Elnora his helpmate, support and dedicated wife of 65 years. He was deeply proud of his family and is survived by his son, Doug (Pamela) Pinner, daughter, Vivian (Jeff) Watson, and grandchildren; Felicia, Alex, Nicole and Christian, and his sister Violet Forgette, and many nieces and nephews. His genuine, honorable and principled life never waivered. He truly loved others with the love of Christ. People felt it, knew it, and were changed by it. He had gifts of preaching, ministering, counseling and true friendship. Dr. Pinner's huge library reflected his pursuit of knowledge and his lifelong quest for information and understanding. He loved animals – especially cats, giving them unique names that fit their personality. He appreciated God's creation and was able to travel, seeing much of the world with Elnora by his side. He was born in Jacksonville, FL on Oct. 30, 1931; graduated from Landon HS, JJC (now JU), Stetson Univ. (B.A, M.A) where he served as a Trustee. M. Div. from Southern Seminary , D. Min. from Union Seminary, Richmond. He served as Pastor for several congregations; First Baptist Bunnell, FL, North Hialeah Bapt, FL, First Baptist Staunton, VA, and 17 years at Seminole Heights Bapt Tampa. After "retirement" he served two years at the IBTS, Prague, nine years as Minister of Pastoral Care, Bayshore Baptist, Tampa, and Interim Pastor at Hendricks Avenue - Jacksonville, College Park - Orlando and North Gate Baptist - Tampa. HISTORY OF THE LADY LAKE BAPTIST CHURCH

The exact date and details of the organization of the Lady Lake Baptist Church is not known. It is believed to have been organized in 1882, under the name of Equity Baptist Church, and was located about one mile East of the present location. Mrs. R. D. Mathews of Fruitland Park remembers a church of this name, at this location.

The present church auditorium was started June 10th, 1884. The late Mr. E. H. Reynolds made this notation in his diary dated June 10th, 1884, "today the first lumber was piled for building the church", but no further mention of how long the building was in progress. Mr. Reynolds owned a sawmill near Lady Lake and cut and prepared the lumber to build the church.

Through the years the records have been destroyed, and nothing is known of the early activities of the church, nor of it's first pastor. It is presumed that services were continued in the Equity Church until this church building was completed. When the name was changed, or when the building was first occupied is not known. However, from information obtained from the Organizational Minute of the Lake County Baptist Association it is known that the Lady Lake Baptist Church was included as a charter member of the Association coming from the Alachua Association with an enrollment of 30 members with J. H. Martin as Pastor.

For many years the church had only morning services on the first and third Sunday of each month. On October 19, 1947, the church voted to have two services on the first and third Sunday of each month. Rev. V. A. Higgs was Pastor at that time and his salary was \$40.00 per month. On December 26th, 1948, the church started having full time services. Rev. H. W. High was pastor and his salary was \$10.00 each Sunday.

The present pastorum was built about the same time as the church, 75 or 80 years ago. For many years it was the home of Mrs. L. N. Withers. Mrs. Withers deeded the house to the church for use as a pastorum after her death. In April, 1930, the church came into possession of the house and has been using it as a home for their pastors. Even though the house is old, it is quite comfortable.

An educational building, under the leadership of Rev. Bob Carnes, was started in May, 1957. This building is located just behind the auditorium and consists of eight class rooms, a pastor's study, kitchen (not complete) and two rest rooms. .
