

Building in Crystal River

Many Dwellings and Business Houses Are Being Erected.

CRYSTAL RIVER, Feb. 22.—This rapidly growing town is undergoing a period of building such as it has seldom known before.

The Spanish stucco building for the Crystal River Mirror was completed this week and turned over to John Kilgore owner and publisher of the Mirror by the contractors, Miller-Wilson Construction Company.

E. C. Bunch, has almost completed the frame bungalow to be used as a residence for Rev. W. J. Ray of the Baptist church.

Several small bungalows and bungalettes are under construction.

Material is being placed on the ground for the erection of the new 100 room Crystal River hotel and the builder, I. S. Satten of Chicago, announces that work will begin next week.

W. C. Miller will start work Monday on a new theater to be known as the "Plaza." The management of the present Crystalite theater will be merged in the new venture.

E. R. Perdue will start next week on three brick stores. One of them is to be occupied by the Crystal River Furniture Company and one of the others probably by a chain grocery firm.
