

Black Creek inventory of the church archives of Florida

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16. OAKLAND BAPTIST CHURCH, 1915-18. 1 mile south of the ferry at Rideout, Clay County.

Constituted 1915. First services in Pine Grove school house, a brown, rectangular, meeting-hall type, frame building. It was used for services until this quarter-time church became defunct. First settled pastor, Rev. P.A. Robinson, 1915-16; common school education. Last pastor, Rev. J.F. McBride, 1917-18.

17. RUSSELL BAPTIST CHURCH, 1916--. On Highway, 1 mile west of Atlantic Coast Line Railroad, Russell, Clay County.

Constituted in 1916. First services were held in present building which was then a school house. This rectangular, brown, frame building was later purchased by the church. Present membership, 62. A quarter-time church, meeting 1st Sunday. Active organization, Sunday School. First settled pastor, Rev. J.F. McBride, 1916-29; common school education. Present supply pastor, Rev. Joseph L. Harris, 1939--, Route #3, Jacksonville.

(CHURCH RECORDS), 1916--, 6 vols. Showing minutes of meetings, baptisms, receipts and disbursements. Custody of clerk, P.L. Robinson, Russell.

(SUNDAY SCHOOL RECORDS), 1938--, 1 vol. Showing pupils, attendance, programs, collections. Custody of secretary, Miss Lois Moody, Middleburg Road, Russell.

18. OAK BRANCH BAPTIST CHURCH, 1919-33. Defunct. 1 mile north of Manning, Baker County.

Constituted in 1919. First services were held in Manning school house, 1½ miles west of Manning. A rectangular, white, frame building erected and dedicated in 1920 was used until the church became defunct in 1933. First settled pastor, Rev. J.D. McCormick, 1919-20; common school education. Last pastor, Rev. Lucius Godwin, 1930-33.

19. MILL BRANCH BAPTIST CHURCH, 1920-25. Defunct. 6½ miles north of Middleburg, Clay County.
