Joseph S. Satchwell (1862-1938) was born in Corbin, Kentucky. He served as pastor of churches in Kentucky and Florida including West Hill (now Whitfield Memorial) Baptist Church, Pensacola, 1920 and Gonzalez Baptist Church, 1921. Satchwell was married to Minnie Angeline Moore Satchwell about 1890.

Rev. Joseph S. Satchwell

Rev. Joseph S. Satchwell, Baptist minister, was born July 19, 1862 in Corbin, Kentucky. His wife, Minnie Angeline Moore Satchwell, whom he married about 1890, was born August 27, 1860 in Campbellsburg, Kentucky. She was the daughter of J.S. Moore and Angie McCaskill Moore.

Rev. and Mrs. Satchwell lived in Kentucky several years. Census records list him as a Baptist minister in Henry County through 1910. In 1913, he was recognized in the Pensacola Bay Baptist Association annual meeting as a visitor from Campbellsburg, Kentucky. In 1920, Rev. and Mrs. Satchwell were enumerated in the Millville, Bay County, Florida census. Rev. Satchwell was pastor of a church.

He was called in 1920 to be pastor of the West Hill Baptist Church (present-day Whitfield Memorial Baptist Church) in Pensacola. He was well received by the Pensacola Bay Baptist Association and given leadership positions, including service on several committees. Among those were foreign missions, associational missions, and ministerial support.

Mrs. Satchwell was a recognized leader as well and presented the women's work report in 1921. Following their service at West Hill, they were called to pastor Gonzalez Baptist Church in 1921. In 1923 and 1924, as members of East Hill Baptist Church, they represented the church as messengers to the Pensacola Bay Baptist Association annual meeting. In 1923, as chairman of the committee on social service, he gave a strong report on the social vices of that generation. He preached the annual sermon in 1924 and was elected a delegate to the Florida Baptist State Convention. In addition, he was appointed chairman of the Christian education committee for the next year.

In 1930, he and Mrs. Satchwell were enumerated in Lake City, Columbia County, Florida, where Rev. Satchwell was serving a church. In the early 1930s, Rev. and Mrs. Satchwell returned to Escambia County, Florida and made their home in Brent with Mrs. Satchwell's niece, Elizabeth Penn Baggett (August 31, 1898-March 28, 1972) and her husband, Floyd Olmstead Baggett (September 21, 1893-September 2, 1943). Minnie Angeline Moore Satchwell died at home April 17, 1934. She was survived by her brother, Charles T. Moore, and her sister, Mrs. Charles Gholson, both of Cincinnati. Rev. Joseph S. Satchwell died at home November 26, 1938. Both are buried in in St. John's Cemetery, Pensacola. No children were born to Rev. and Mrs. Satchwell.

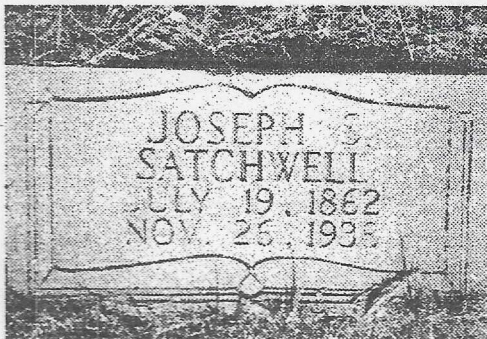

The Heritage of Escambia County, Florida - II

Rev. Joseph S. Satchwell

Rev. Joseph S. Satchwell, Baptist minister, was born July 19,

1862 in Corbin, Kentucky. His wife, Minnie Angeline Moore Satchwell, whom he married about 1890, was born August 27, 1860 in Campbellsburg, Kentucky. She was the daughter of J.S. Moore and Angie McCaskill Moore.

Rev. and Mrs. Satchwell lived in Kentucky several

years. Census records list him as a Baptist minister in Henry County through 1910. By 1920, they had relocated to Millville in Bay County, Florida, where Rev. Satchwell was pastor of a church.

He was called that year to be pastor of the West Hill Baptist Church (present-day Whitfield Memorial Baptist Church) in Pensacola. He was well received by the Pensacola Bay Baptist Association and given leadership positions, including service on several committees. Among them were foreign missions, associational missions, ministerial support, social service, and Christian education. He preached the annual sermon and was elected a messenger to the Florida Baptist Convention.

Mrs. Satchwell was a recognized leader as well and presented the women's work report in 1921. Following their service at West Hill, they were called to pastor Gonzalez Baptist Church in 1921. By 1924, they were members of East Hill Baptist Church and represented the church as messengers to the annual PBBA meeting.

In 1930, he and Mrs. Satchwell were enumerated in Lake City, Columbia County, Florida, where Rev. Satchwell was serving a church. In the early 1930s, Rev. and Mrs. Satchwell returned to Escambia County, Florida and made their home in Brent with Mrs. Satchwell's niece, Elizabeth Penn Baggett (August 31, 1898-March 28, 1972) and her husband, Floyd Olmstead Baggett (September 21, 1893-September 2, 1943). Minnie Angeline Moore Satchwell

died at home April 17, 1934. She was survived by her brother, Charles T. Moore, and her sister, Mrs. Charles Gholson, both of Cincinnati. Rev. Joseph S. Satchwell died at home November 26, 1938. Both are buried in in St. John's Cemetery, Pensacola. No children were born to Rev. and Mrs. Satchwell.
