Schol, Henry (1918-2008) was born in Iowa the son of Cornelius and Anna Schol. He graduated from Northwestern Bible College. He pastored churches in Minnesota, Illinois and Florida. In Florida he served as pastor of Temple Baptist Church, St. Petersburg, Maximo Heights Baptist Church, St. Petersburg, First Baptist Church, Safety Harbor, First Baptist Church, Floral City and Five Points Baptist Church, Fernandina Beach, 1967-1971. He was married to Phyllis Temple Schol (b. 1919- d.1952) and Dorothy M. Schol (b. 1920- d. 2008) (m. 1953). He had eight children.

SCHOL, REV. HENRY

Rev. Henry Schol, 90, of Gainesville passed away on September 17, 2008. Henry was born to Anna and Cornelius Schol, just outside of George, Iowa on April 27, 1918. He graduated from Northwestern Bible College, Minneapolis, MN in 1947. His preaching career started in 1949 in Hollandale, MN. He pastored several churches in Minnesota and Illinois, before moving to the Clearwater/St. Pete, Florida area in 1954. In Florida he pastored numerous churches throughout the state from St. Pete to Jacksonville. Upon retiring, they moved to Gainesville in the fall of 1985. Here he served as an interim and as a supply pastor for area churches for many years. He enjoyed playing golf with his fellow pastors, and visiting with people.

He was preceded in death by his first wife, Phyllis Temple Schol, his second wife of almost 55 years, Dorothy M. Schol, and grandsons, Greg Schol, Michael Schol, and Stephen Lunsford.

He is survived by children, Marlyn (Hazel) Schol of McApin, Fl.; Duane (Sherry) Schol of Fernandina Beach, Fl.; Kay Lynne Schol of Ocala, FL., Patricia A. Harris of Ventura, CA; Corwin L. (Vivian) Schol of London, England; Ronald (Janet) Schol of Gainesville; Philip (Anne) Schol of Laurel, MD; Mark (LaNita) Schol of Ocala, Fl; 19 grandchildren and 24 great-grandchildren, 1 brother; 2 sisters, and many nieces and nephews.

REV. HENRY SCHOL

New Minister

FLORAL CITY--The **Rev. Henry L. Schol** began serving as pastor this past Sunday at the Floral City First Baptist Church. He came here from the Maximo Heights Baptist Church in St. Petersburg. Prior to this he has pastored churches in Safety Harbor and in Illinois and Minnesota.

Mr. **Schol** received his training in the public schools of Lyon County, Iowa and then in northwestern schools in Minneapolis, Minn. While in St. Petersburg and Safety Harbor he served on the missions committee, was superintendant of vacation Bible schools for the Pinellas Association and served for one year as president of the Pinellas Baptist Pastor's Conference.

The **Rev.** and Mrs. **Schol** are the parents of eight children, of which three are married.

Two of the boys are seniors in St. Petersburg High and are remaining there to finish school. Mrs. **Schol** served for four years as the clerk-treasurer and office secretary of the Pinellas Baptist Association before coming with her husband to the Floral City church.

Rev. Flourney Installed As Baptist Moderator

The Rev. Marshall Flourney was installed as moderator of the Pinellas Baptist Association last night at First Baptist Church in St. Petersburg.

Those installed with Mr. Flourney, pastor of Azalea Baptist Church, St. Petersburg, were the Rev. John Streater of Pinellas Park First Baptist Church, vice moderator, and Mrs. Dorothy Schol, treasurer. She is the wife of the Rev. Henry Schol, new pastor of Temple Baptist Church in St. Petersburg. Mr. Schol was formerly pastor of Safety Harbor Baptist Church.

The Friday evening installation service ended the two-day 29th annual session of the Pinellas Baptist Association. New officers were elected at the Thursday afternoon meeting at First Baptist Church in Safety Harbor.

Yesterday's all-day session was held at St. Petersburg First Baptist Church.

At the Thursday afternoon session delegates from the 33 churches and six missions in the association voted to withdraw the name of Community Baptist Church, St. Petersburg, from the fellowship of the association. They also voted to accept Temple Baptist Church, St. Petersburg, into full membership. This church was officially organized Oct. 8.

Speakers Thursday afternoon were Dr. Warren Nubern of Clearwater's Sunset Point Baptist Church, retiring moderator, and Dr. George W. Harrison, professor of Old Testament at New Orleans Theological Seminary.

Pastor To Leave Safety Harbor Baptist Church

SAFETY HARBOR, Feb. 25 (Special)—After over five years service here, The **Rev. Henry Schol** pastor of First Baptist Church, Harbor Hill, 590, will deliver his last sermon tomorrow night.

In addition to baptizing over 15 converts per year, the highlight of Mr. **Schol's** service consists of his leadership in the building of the present church, which has been in use for over a year.

Church membership has steadily increased since Mr. **Schol** took over the pastorate. There is a marked climb between the average 50 at Sunday School and the now 195.
